- 5. For public art; permanent and touring: Norma Rae, Exhale, Pythagoras, Sculpture in the Garden, Art in the Garden Invitational, and Open Studio Tours plus dozens of painted murals throughout downtown Chapel Hill and Carrboro.
- 6. Where is the Pink Pig? Davie Poplar? Blue fire trucks? The Goodnight Carolina Family Fun Map and app can show you the way.
- 7. Winding roads, country scenery and... century farms, berry farms, and dairy farms. Additionally, Orange County boasts five farmers' markets; all open year round with seasonal events.

9. For some of the finest antique shops like Whitehall at the Villa, Shops at



Daniel Boone Village, Scavenger Antiques and Leland Little Auction house.

- 10. Memorial Hall plays host to internationally renowned recitalists and orchestras, dance and chamber ensembles, jazz, folk, and world music performers, opera and theatre.
- 11. PlayMakers Repertory Company is one of America's leading theatre companies according to American Theatre. Its artists are always at the top of their game.

13. Dirty South Improv Comedy Theater in Chapel Hill is an internationally famous improv comedy club and home to the South's largest comedic gathering.

20. A historic landmark since 1929, Merritt's Store and Grill is touted as the "Home of the World Famous BLTs" and chicken fried humor.



**NC Botanical ■** Garden—the largest in the Southeast—is known for its nature trails, carnivorous plant

collections, aquatics, herb gardens, and revolving exhibits of artwork.

22. UNC-Chapel Hill is the oldest public university in the U.S. (chartered in 1789) and the only public university in the U.S. that awarded degrees in the 18th century. And the iconic Old Well was the primary source of campus water for more than a century.

**Paperhand Puppet Intervention is** a spectacle of giant papier-mâché characters, stilt walkers, dancers, shadow

puppets, and original music in the Forest Theatre.



24. Shoot for the stars at the

Morehead Planetarium & Science Center. The first planetarium in the South and one of the largest in the U.S., Morehead was a NASA training facility for 15 years.

- 25. Dubbed the "University's living room," The Carolina Inn was voted one of America's Top 10 Haunted Hotels thanks to Dr. William Jacocks, a 17-year "resident" in room 256.
- 26. Two words: Dean Smith. The legendary former Tar Heel coach was an ambassador for Chapel Hill and the state of North Carolina.
- 27. Relive the early days of Michael Jordan at the Carolina Basketball Museum, along with Tar Heel national titles, game-winning shots, and NBA First Round Picks.

**UNC's Finley Golf Course was** redesigned by Tom Fazio and continues to be recognized as one of the



nation's top collegiate layouts.

**29.** A walk through the Ackland Art Museum on

South Columbia Street in Chapel Hill can be an introduction to Peter Paul Rubens, Eugene Delacroix, and Andy Warhol.

- **30.** The Stone Center for Black Culture and History is a must see—one of the preeminent centers in the nation for the critical examination of African and African-American diaspora cultures.
- 31. The Horace Williams House is the only historic house in Chapel Hill open to the public—and is where Preservation Chapel Hill offers tours of historic importance.

**34.** Carrboro's Weaver Street Market is the largest community-owned co-op grocery store in the Southeast, offering local, organic, natural, and humanely raised foods.

**35.** Carr Mill Mall was rehabilitated under the Tax Reform Act of 1976. Much of the original architecture remains in its restaurants and upscale boutique shops.

**36.** Open Eye Café, a coffee shop affectionately known as "Carrboro's living room" serving beans from Colombia, Nicaragua, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Honduras, Guatemala, and Peru.

**37.** The ArtsCenter in Carrboro offers classes in visual, literary and performing arts, music concerts, theater productions, children's programs, and an art gallery.



**58.** Hillsborough was once the colonial capital of North Carolina and is now the county seat of Orange County.

- **39.** Moorefield's was built in 1785 as a summer home by Alfred Moore, a military and educational leader, jurist, and the last North Carolinian on the U.S. Supreme Court.
- 40. The Old Orange County Courthouse in Hillsborough, with its town clock in the cupola, has been cited by the Library of Congress as one of the finest examples of Greek-Revival architecture in the U.S.
- 41. Among the late 18th and early 19th century structures still standing today, you will also find a chocolate shop, wine store, art galleries, a yarn shop, crafted jewelry store and much more on Churton Street in downtown Hillsborough.

Hillsborough's Ayr Mount Historic ■ Site, built around 1815, is one of



**North Carolina's finest** Federal-era plantation homes. Meander through woodlands and pastures on the Poet's Walk, a onemile walking trail

surrounding the historic site along the banks of the Eno River.

- 45. The Alexander Dickson House was the last headquarters of the commander of the largest armies to surrender to Union forces, larger than Lee's army at Appomattox.
- 44. The Burwell School was one of North Carolina's leading Presbyterian schools for "young ladies" from 1837-1857. Just two blocks down, find over 2000 artifacts at the Orange County Historical Museum, including what's believed to be the only complete set of colonial weights and measures within the U.S.

Feel the need for speed at the fastest 3/8-mile racing oval in America, better

known as the Orange County Speedway. offering grassroots racing at its best.



46. Orange County Sportsplex has a

fitness center with a bird's-eye view of the ice-skating rink (NHL-size, open year round) and an aquatic center with three pools.

- 47. Historic Occoneechee Speedway Trail has a 4-mile trail for hiking and a 1-mile oval track where the original NASCAR racers tested their driving skills from 1948-1968.
- 48. Stroll Hillsborough's Riverwalk, a 1.8-mile greenway with loop trails, bridges, and boardwalk, accessible to trails, parks, and the Eno River.
- 49. Shop 'til you drop with irresistibly Italian selections at the twice-annual VIETRI Warehouse Sale and ongoing outlet store.

Maple View Farm produces over 2 million pounds of milk every



year and to-die-for ice cream. Seasonal flavors include candied bacon, banana pudding, and eggnog.
