CONTESTANTS MUST DROP OFF THEIR PHOTOGRAPHS at the Depot Visitor Center, 121 W 15th St. Cheyenne between June 6 — June 20th. Pick up your photos between July 10—13. <u>We will not be shipping photos.</u>

The guidelines for this contest have been kept quite simple. This contest is to celebrate 150 years of the railroad in Cheyenne. Cheyenne exists because of the railroads westward expansion to this area in 1867.

The photo's should be railroad themed, celebrating the heritage, romance and vitality of the railroad, past and present. The picture does not have to have been taken within Laramie County. <u>NO ENTRY FEE</u>

- Must be at least 5"x 7" and no larger than 20"x24"
- Photos may be framed with or w/out glass with hangers made of metal or wire 0R matted on foam board 1/8" to 1/4" thick.
- The photos may be black & white or color. There are not separate judging categories for Black/White and Color photos. Digital or film pictures accepted.

There are two categories 1) professional 2) amateur, with no age requirements or restrictions.

PRIZES— the first place winners will receive 2 roundhouse-steamshop tour tickets, 2nd place winners will receive a \$30 Depot Gift Shop certificate or 4 trolley tickets.
