Mastering the Unpredictable Dance of Glass




Courage and confidence are essential for an artist who steps before a live audience, day after day, and puts her skills on display, starting each new piece completely from scratch. But to do so while working with a material as unpredictable and volatile as glass also requires prodigious skill and a great deal of flexibility. "What I love about the creative process with glass is that it is challenging," says artist **Catherine Ayers**. "There will

always be new skills to learn," she adds, "and different ways to work with the material." Working with glass is like an intimate dance between the artist and a temperamental material as hot as molten lava. The artist must be a partner who leads, but is also willing to follow at times, who does not merely try to force the material to her will, but works with it and senses in which direction the two must move in order to achieve the desired results, something Catherine excels at while creating colorful, playful pieces that reflect her own whimsical, creative, and colorful personality.

Watch Catherine and other glass artists perform live, hot glass demonstrations daily at **The Corning Museum of Glass**.

Fire Arts

hat exactly are the fire arts? In and around America's Crystal City, fire artists work with gathers of glass that are over 2,000 degrees, transforming the molten substance into amazing works. They throw clay or sculpt it, then fire their creation in a furnace, or they remove it red hot from the kiln and submerge it in combustible materials like sawdust or horsehair to create the fabulous textures of Raku.

Follow the self-guided Tiffany & Treasures Trail and you'll quickly discover just how diverse and exciting the fire arts can be. Observe stained glass windows designed by Louis Comfort Tiffany in their original historic settings, browse boutiques where you can find stunning iconic objects by Frederick Carder or Steuben Glass to add to your collection, or get your hands dirty throwing pottery, learning stained glass techniques, or making your own glass masterpiece.

Bully Hill is one of the most eclectic wineries in the Finger Lakes-one that will leave you smiling.

Château Renaissance Wine Cellars is the place to be if you're looking for a traditional approach to winemaking. Born into a family of winemakers in France's Loire Valley and with an expertise steeped in methods that have produced quality wines for centuries in Europe, Château Renaissance owner/ winemaker Patrice DeMay is known for his fruit wines, ports, fruit sparkles, and the 400-year-old family recipe for making champagne that he brought with him to Keuka Lake.

Deep Root Vinevard strives to offer relaxed. comfortable tastings in a rustic setting. Winemaker Ben Hartman focuses on making small batches of limited edition wines that range from sweet dessert wines to dry reds, with Deep Root's most popular wine being Moonflower, a semi-dry Traminette. Originally from New Jersey, Ben and his wife searched the country for just the right spot to start their winery and were drawn to the natural beauty of Keuka Lake.

Lisa, offers exquisite wine-friendly food pairings and wonderful events featuring the work and products of artisans from throughout the region.

Savor Vineyards and Wines is a micro-farm winery whose name reflects its philosophy of slowing down-of taking it all in. Home winemakers for over 30 years, Bill and Suzanne Piatt craft small batches of unique cold-climate wines, including their awardwinning Maréchal Foch, as well as a Dry White Catawba, La Crescent, Esprit, and a seasonal Pear Wine. Stop by the handcrafted tasting barn to enjoy live music, beautiful valley views, and delicious wine.

Weis Vineyards released their first vintages in May 2017. Three months later, they won "Double Gold" and "Best of Class" at the 2017 New York Wine & Food Classic Competition. Born into a multi-generational winemaking family in Germany, Hans Peter Weis came to the United States to pursue his passion. After working as a winemaker in California, and for over a decade in the Finger Lakes, Peter and his fiancée, Ashlee, opened their own winery dedicated to traditionally handcrafted and exceptional, dry German-style wines.

Wild Brute Winery is doing things a bit differently. After interning at Château Frank and graduating from Cornell's viticulture program, Justin Recktenwald has taken his self-professed gypsy soul and fiery zeal for producing memorable wines back to the family farm in Arkport. Justin enjoys experimenting and doing wild ferments. Although he makes Riesling and Chardonnay, his primary focus is on creating a serious Finger Lakes red in the form of a wellreceived unfiltered Cabernet Franc.




Proximity might have played



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Like so many others, we made the pilgrimage to Dr. Frank's. Treated ourselves to the exquisite sit-down 1886 Reserve experience. 

rom fishermen and outdoor enthusiasts to leisure travelers looking for an idyllic escape, people from near and far have been finding their way to Keuka Lake since the mid-1800s. You can learn about steamboats and other wooden boats that dotted the lakes throughout the region back then at the Finger Lakes **Boating Museum.**

The first bonded winery in the country, Pleasant Valley Wine **Company**, opened in Hammondsport in 1860, though it wasn't until 1962 that **Dr. Konstantin Frank** proved to the rest of the world that vinifera grapes could be grown here, forever changing the wine industry in the Northeastern United States.

Long before he became an aviation pioneer, Glenn Curtiss was just a small-town boy with a thirst for speed. An accomplished cyclist

and inventor, Curtiss was among the earliest American motorcycle manufacturers and he held numerous motorcycle speed records, earning him the title "fastest man on earth." You can see some of his incredible creations at the Glenn H. Curtiss Museum.

In 1868, Brooklyn Flint Glass Works took the Hudson River. Erie Canal. and other waterways all the way to Corning where it set up shop and started its own quiet revolution—one centered around glass. In time, a number of other glass companies came to this small town turning it into America's Crystal City.

Our Winemaking Roots Run Deep



At the top of a steep hill offering some of the best views of Keuka Lake, you'll find the **Greyton H. Taylor Wine Museum**. There is no better place for a museum dedicated to the long history of winemaking in the region than at Bully Hill, the Finger Lakes' most eclectic winery. The Taylor family's own story is inextricably entwined with the narrative about the grape and wine business that has been the lifeblood running through the veins of many small towns throughout the region since the 1800s. Though the Taylor Wine Company would later move into town, in 1883 Walter Taylor started

his winery on that very land overlooking the lake. Over time, with the help of his son, Greyton, Taylor Wine Company would become the largest producer of still wines on the East Coast and the largest producer of Champagne in the entire country. With everything from old and obsolete wine equipment, wine casks, cooperage, tools used in the early days of winemaking, photographs, glassware, and documentaries, the museum offers a unique glimpse at just how much the industry has changed over the years.

Just down the road in Hammondsport, we visited the Boating Museum.

Never dreamed there were steamboats in the Finger Lakes. But 148 of them? Wow! Forty-four on Keuka Lake alone. The handcrafted wooden trout boats are beautiful. You can even learn to build your own boat there.

Not far away is the **Curtiss Museum**. Talk about incredible discoveries. We pictured the valley back in the day when dirigibles and airplanes and all sorts of aviation pioneering was going on here.

Exploring history in the Finger Lakes isn't just about nostalgia, though. You can experience the past in real time. Like the seaplane ride we took on the same lake where they were first developed by Curtiss. Or the glassblowing we did in the same small town

where glassmaking has been a big deal for over 150 years.



Before we went to Corning, we started Day Two with a tour of the Bath Presbyterian Church to explore the work of Louis Comfort Tiffany. We called ahead to set that up. So worth it. Then we took what had once been the highway for a scenic drive through Painted Post. Many of the towns and lakes have Iroquois names. Stopped by Heritage Village, which blends the past with the present.

Historic buildings, like the one-room schoolhouse and the inn, plus live demonstrations and workshops in blacksmithing, hearth cooking, and more.

Reenactments. Demonstrations. Historic museums. Restoration shops. Tours. Hands-on classes. So many ways to step back in time.

One day we rented Jet Skis. There's nothing like getting out on open water to make you feel so free, yet so




connected to nature at the same time. Keuka Lake lived up to the hype. Warm, crystal clear water. And big enough that it felt like we had the whole lake to ourselves.

Creek Bison Ranch. Covered wagon ride through the herd. Got to feed them apples. Kids even tried the zip line (not over the bison, though).

We stayed at **Pleasant Valley Inn** just outside Hammondsport. Signed up for the farm-to-table package. After our breakfast feast—the owner's wife makes these bagels that are to die for—we took a short drive to **Oak & Osage Farm**. The chard,

Got to pick our own veggies, including some gorgeous peppers, which were taken back to the inn while we visited a couple farm breweries for tastings.

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Later we had a spectacular dinner at the inn using the goodies we picked at the farm. This is how food is supposed to taste! Next morning we took a class on how to make our own teas at Healing Spirits Herb Farm. Learned a lot in the process. Had no idea, some of the "weeds" in the yard back home are actually healthy herbs. Not far away
