• State Capitol Building – A National Historic Landmark – In 1906 President Theodore Roosevelt dedicated the building, inspired by the St. Peters Basilica in Rome, declaring it the most beautiful buildings of its kind. Free tours begin every half hour.

• The National Civil War Museum - Opened in 2001 atop one of the highest points in Harrisburg, this \$16 million museum showcases 24,000 artifacts and provides equal, bias-free attention to both Union and Confederate history of the Civil War.

• Hershey Harrisburg Wine Country – Uncorked in spring 2012, the trail of 15 award-winning, familyowned wineries situated in the heart of the region's vistas features annual Signature Events in May, June, September and October.

• The U.S. Army Heritage & Education Center houses more than 15 million military artifacts, including the largest collection of Civil War photography in the world and 350,000 unique military history volumes. The onemile Army Heritage Trail features interactive military exhibits including Civil War winter cabins and a WWI trench system.

• Discover the world-renowned auto destination at the Carlisle Fairgrounds. Attend one of the large swap meets or a specialty show like Corvettes at Carlisle, Bike Fest or Truck Nationals. Coming 2013: First Annual Carlisle Sports & Outdoors Nationals

• Explore the Appalachian Trail. Cumberland Valley's portion of the 2,186-mile trail has been called a "hiker's dream" due to having the longest, flattest section. Hikers will appreciate the multiple access points, parking lots and signage. Discover hiker stories at the Appalachian Trail Museum.

• Cumberland Valley is home to two legendary limestone streams, LeTort Spring Run and Yellow Breeches Creek. Both are designated PA scenic rivers and internationally recognized fly-fishing destinations.

• Find out why Mike Rowe's Discovery Channel TV Show "Dirty Jobs" featured gourd-crafting company Meadowbrooke Gourds. Take a tour to see how they grow them, clean them and create works of art.



Franklin County is Civil War Country.

Confederate troops marched through the area on their way to Gettysburg, and several stops along The Underground Railroad are still standing. Family-owned farmers' markets offer fresh fruits and vegetables while creameries sell delicious dairy products such as milk, cheese and ice cream. Wash it all down with a beer from Roy Pitz Brewing Company or a bottle of wine made at Tuscarora Mountain Winery.

A series of special events attract large crowds each year, including IceFest in January, "The Burning of Chambersburg" in July and AppleFest in October.
