WHERE TO STAY

Finding accommodations is a breeze in Daytona Beach. From oceanfront hotels and condos to vacation rentals, visitors are able to find a great value on whatever they think best suits their family. - The historic **Streamline Hotel**, an art deco-style property that once hosted the meeting that launched NASCAR opened in 2017 as an upscale beachside boutique property.
- Others recently added include the **Residence Inn by Marriott Daytona Beach Oceanfront**, **Hilton Garden Inn** and the **Chateau Mar Beach Resort** boutique property.

HOW TO GET HERE

One of the best aspects of a Daytona Beach family spring break is its accessibility. Direct flights are available from Atlanta (via Delta), New York City (via JetBlue) and Charlotte (via American Airlines) to Daytona Beach International Airport, which is less than five miles from the beachfront. Driving is direct and easy as well with two major interstates — I-95 and I-4 — intersecting at Daytona Beach. Other major roads leading to the area include U.S. Highway 1, U.S. Highway 92, and the scenic A1A, which runs along the Atlantic coastline.

WHAT TO DO

Get some face time with ocean friends: Head to Ponce Inlet for an environmental adventure at the Marine Science Center. Everyone in the family will enjoy the touch tanks, educational demonstrations and sea turtle rehabilitation unit, but it's especially fun to watch a child's eyes light up with excitement at the touch of a stingray! Get a close-up look at marine life including dolphins, birds and even manatees
