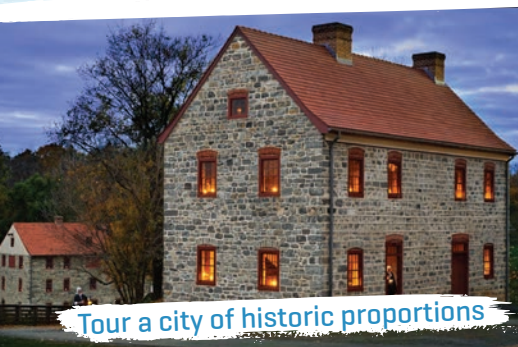

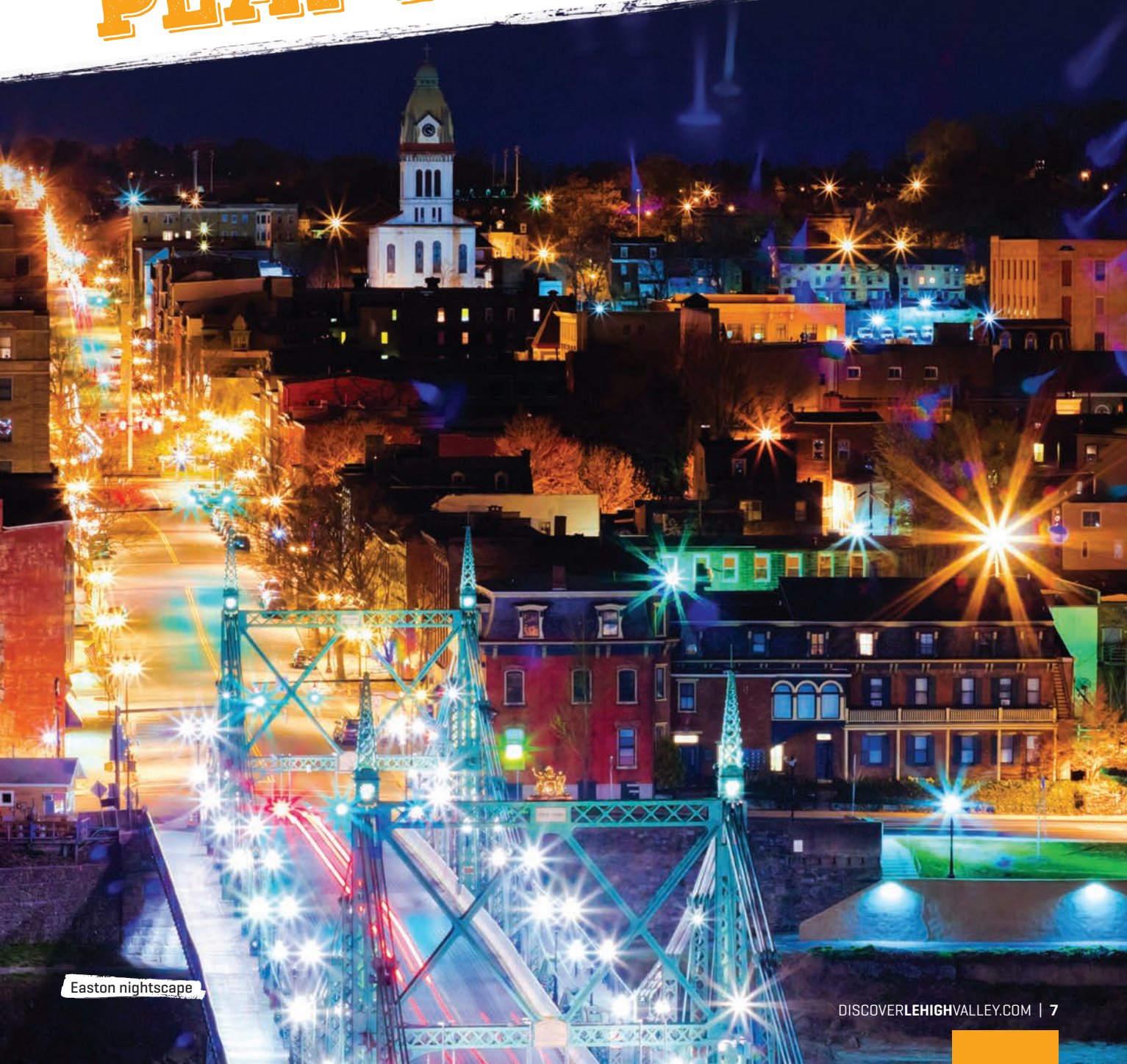

GET CULTURED.

NEVER BE TOO OLD TO LEARN SOMETHING NEW.

To get your tickets now or later is the question for the **Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival**, a professional theatre hosted at DeSales University offering productions by the famed playwright, as well as musicals, classics, contemporary comedies, dramas, and children's shows.



Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival

History comes alive in Easton's Hugh Moore Park at the **National Canal Museum**. The mules, Hank and George, are two of the hardest workers in Lehigh Valley as they pull the 48-ton Josiah White II, Pennsylvania's only mule-drawn canal passenger boat. Costumed guides tell authentic stories about historic canal life. After your ride, stay and play in the 520-acre Lehigh Riverside Park, with a new bicycle obstacle course, a stage for summer concerts, multi-use path, and playground with a zip line.

Music fans looking for a spiritual experience should make the pilgrimage to Nazareth's **C.F. Martin & Co.®** guitar factory, where a guided tour will show you how their guitars come to life through the hands of the craftsman. Explore the art of guitar-making, from Old-World tools to their state-of-the-art facility. Follow a guitar from rough lumber to a finished product which requires more than 300 steps to complete. Check out rare, vintage instruments on display and don't miss the Pickin' Parlor, where you can play high-end and limited-edition guitars.

You can even participate in The Martin Guitar Buy From Factory program, and walk out with a guitar after your factory visit.

Lehigh Valley has successfully repurposed the past to create another cultural attraction: the **National Museum of Industrial History**. Housed in a former Bethlehem Steel facility on the largest, revitalized private brownfield in America, the museum features steelmaking prominently, but ranges in the secrets of the silkworm to the making of iron. Hold a 20-pound tray of bobbins that children once carried for nine hours a day at a silk factory. Turn a flywheel to test how much horsepower you can generate. Take a virtual ride in a hot air balloon. Artifacts on display include the first piece of steel rolled in Bethlehem, a 37 mm anti-tank field cannon from World War I, and a silk loom that made White House curtains.

Interactive exhibits, self-guided and docent-led tours, and special programs and events highlight the historical collections at the **Sigal Museum**, including pre-European settlement artifacts, decorative arts, textiles, and period objects. Don your flapper dresses for *The Cat's Meow: Lehigh Valley in the Age of Art Deco & the Roaring Twenties*. The exhibition, up through August 2018, celebrates the fashion, arts, music, and lifestyle of Lehigh Valley in the Modern Age.

This April, celebrate Leonard Bernstein's 100th birthday and a symphonic tribute to the music of David Bowie with the Allentown Symphony Orchestra and vocal ensemble The King's Singers at Allentown's **Miller Symphony Hall**. The venue offers jazz and pop music acts, children's shows, and even creative programming like the Bertoia Sound Sculptures for Orchestra, where musical meditative art by Lehigh Valley sculptor, Henry Bertoia, is brought to life by composer and percussionist, Doug Ovens.

For live music fans, the intimate venue **Godfrey Daniels** offers a 90-seat listening room, and features contemporary singer-songwriters, blues masters, folk legends, and bluegrass bands. Every month there is a full schedule of community jams, including swing, blues, old-time, Celtic, bluegrass, comedy, and storytelling.

"Transformers" fans will love seeing the Megatron Mack truck on display at Allentown's **Mack Trucks Historical Museum**, where you can sit in the cab of a semi, see the original Mack bus that ran for more than a million miles and can still operate via a hand crank, and watch volunteers refurbish the Macks in the room where they used to test truck aerodynamics. The Mack truck, not only gained notoriety during World War I for its durability and performance, but it gained the nickname Bulldog Mack. The English bulldog hood ornament came second as a symbol of the strong and tenacious vehicle manufacturer.

The entire Moravian community – around 80 people – once lived, prayed, learned, and worked in the Gemeinhaus or community house, now home to the **Moravian Museum of Bethlehem**. It is one of **Historic Bethlehem Museums & Sites'** 20 buildings that represent three centuries of regional history and culture. Play in the past at **Burnside Plantation**, where you can learn about colonial farm life; spark a passion for blacksmithing at Historic Bethlehem's

Colonial Industrial Quarter; see one of the country's largest dollhouse collections at **Kemerer Museum of Decorative Arts**; tour the **Nain-Schober House**, the only existing 18th-century building built by and lived in by American Indians in Pennsylvania; the **Single Sisters' House**, where the women of Bethlehem were among the first in the country

to be educated; and the **1752 Apothecary**, which before closing in the 1950s, was the oldest apothecary in continuous operation in the United States. Historic Bethlehem Museums & Sites cares for several sites in Historic Moravian Bethlehem, a National Historic Landmark District designated to the U.S. Tentative List for nomination to the UNESCO World Heritage List, which boasts such sites as the Great Wall of China and the Pyramids of Giza. Pass into history with a multi-site museum membership and get unlimited access for a year.

Need a refresher course in U.S. history? You can get a good overview at **Lehigh County Historical Society's** Lehigh Valley Heritage Museum, which features galleries about Native Americans, U.S. presidents, and the development of the region. The society's historic sites, open seasonally on weekends, also feature stories of the American Revolution, Pennsylvania Dutch settlers, and industry. ■

Twist and turn on the seven inversions of **Dorney Park & Wildwater Kingdom's** Hydra, Pennsylvania's only floorless coaster; feel the rush when the floor drops you into a splash pool on Python Plummet; take a spin with the entire family on the Whip, the park's oldest ride or on the Dodgem bumper cars; buckle up for Kaleidoscope, a counter-clockwise trip of weightlessness and acceleration; and visit Dinosaurs Alive, an animatronic dinosaur park, complete with tail thrashing, roaring, and interactive consoles.

Explore four floors of colorful, hands-on fun at downtown Easton's **Crayola Experience™**, where you can star in your very own coloring page, name and wrap your own Crayola crayon, and create melted wax spin art.

Get up and atom at Allentown's **Da Vinci Science Center**, where families can make T-Rexroth, the center's robotic dinosaur move with a joystick, experience a Category 1 hurricane with wind forces up to 78

mph, sort and experiment with balls in motion at the preschool exhibit Engineers on a Roll, and harvest your own energy by dancing on tiles in the PPL Electric Utilities Energy Zone.

A feeding deck will get you closer to **Lehigh Valley Zoo's** giraffe barn so you can hang out with Murphy the Masai giraffe, the tallest land mammal. And explore and adore the Western pond turtles, out sunning on a log or paddling through the water. The Winter Light Spectacular, which runs mid-November through New Year's Eve, has photo-worthy opportunities, animated tunnels, and surround-sound holiday music.

We want to take you out to the ballgame the way baseball was meant to be played – it's all fun at Allentown's Coca-Cola Park, where **Lehigh Valley IronPigs**, Philadelphia Phillies' Triple A baseball team scores high for affordability, fireworks, and crazy marketing ideas [think bacon-themed merchandise, rebranding the IronPigs as 'Festers to commemorate the famed Musikfest, even urinal gaming].

Come out to watch professional bike races all summer long on the 28-degree banked turns at **Valley Preferred Cycling Center** in Trexlertown – once Lehigh Valley Velodrome – offer high-caliber action on a concrete cycling track.

Lehigh Valley Phantoms

Root in winter for the **Lehigh Valley Phantoms**, the American Hockey League affiliate of the Philadelphia Flyers, which had 16 standing-room only sellouts last season.

Cyclists compete on fixed-gear bikes in Olympic trials and numerous international competitions; community programs from Weeble Wobble youth cycling to a one-day "Try the Track" clinic teach anything from the basics of bike safety to adult racing techniques.

Take a train ride through the Kutztown countryside in historic and rare railroad equipment on the **Allentown and Auburn Railroad** for special events like Steam Beneath the Stars, Trick-or-Treat Train Rides, Fall Wine Tasting Weekend, Autumn Splendor Fall Foliage Train Ride, and Hot Chocolate with Santa.

Nicola Bulgari, of jewelry empire fame and owner of Allentown

Classic Motor Car, has boosted the notoriety of the

the history of over-the-road transportation. Fans of the fast and the furious will want to have their photo taken in the driver's seat of a mini-Indy racecar; see the "You're Only Original Once" special exhibit through March 2018, featuring a

Test your skills in the 18-hole blacklight indoor mini-golf or challenge your pals in a match of laser tag. Finish the day off with a scoop [or two] from the Log Cabin Creamery. ■

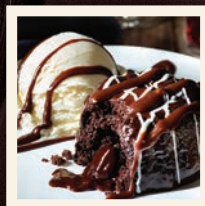

LET'S DISH

Savor the Flavor



AVOCADO TOAST WITH PICKLED TURMERIC EGG. A SALMON CLUB. DRY-AGED TOMAHAWK RIBEYE STEAK. WE ASKED SOME OF OUR TOP CHEFS, BARTENDERS, AND JUICERS FOR THEIR FAVORITE DISHES, CRAFT COCKTAILS, AND SMOOTHIES. THEY UNDONE THEIR APRON STRINGS, SAT DOWN [A RARE THING FOR A CHEF TO DO!], AND WHISKED UP A LIST SO MOUTHWATERING, YOU'LL HAVE TO TAKE YOUR TASTE BUDS ON A TOUR.

Roasted Carrot Ravioli

It's hard for Ryan Lukow, executive chef at **Hamilton Kitchen** in Allentown, to pinpoint one dish from his rotating seasonal menus, but he loves the ravioli, made in-house, and filled with roasted carrots, butter, salt, and pepper. "I love the simplicity of it," Lukow says. Finished with trumpet mushrooms, shallots, toasted pistachios, and manchego cheese, he adds, "The humble ingredients shine through and speak for themselves."



Chocolate Prana Smoothie

Eleven ingredients make up this concoction: coconut water, raw cacao, almond butter, coconut oil, cinnamon, vanilla, cayenne, hemp hearts, maca, dates, and banana. "There's a lot to it, but that's a good thing!" says Amy Franquet, general manager of **Greenmouth Juice Café** in Allentown. "It's rich and chocolatey, and is packed full of protein, making it an awesome meal replacement or snack on the run. The raw cacao is an amazing source of magnesium and is a natural mood-booster and stimulant, which

pairs perfectly with adaptogenic maca root to give you calm energy for the day."

As for food, Greenmouth also dishes up a mean avocado toast on seeded sourdough bread from Apple Ridge Farm in Saylorsburg, toasted and topped with ripe avocado and dressed with lemon, olive oil, pink salt, pepper, and cayenne. Order it plain or topped with a sweet and tangy hardboiled pickled egg from pasture-raised chickens at Stardust Farm in Pen Argyl.

Pennsylvania Steak Tartare

Chef Lee Chizmar of **Bolete** loves highlighting the flavors of regional Pennsylvania and Lehigh Valley. The steak tartare is a simple preparation that allows the flavors to pop; the meat comes from a local butcher and the accompanying chips are housemade.

Salmon Club

"It's a great example of a dish that exemplifies our start-to-finish in-house processes and our local partners," says Chef Luke Prosseda of **187 Rue Principale**. "We smoke our salmon and make our gribiche sauce. We get our brioche from The Flour Shop and the amazing heirloom tomatoes from Wild Fox Farm in nearby Barto."

USDA Prime Dry-Aged Tomahawk Ribeye Steak

USDA Prime grade is the highest quality beef that money can buy, says Christopher Heath, corporate chef of Paxos Restaurants,

including **blue grillhouse** in Bethlehem and **Top Cut Steakhouse** in Center Valley. The grillhouse's tomahawks are hand-selected by a specialty butcher in Chicago for superior marbling and flavor. "The dry-aging process makes this cut incredibly tender and also gives it an added earthy flavor — unlike any other steak you've ever tasted!" says Heath.

Champagne Copacetic

"The Champagne Copacetic is an example of our bartender's philosophy," says owner Linda Barsik of the **Bookstore Speakeasy**, "which is to artfully craft cocktails capturing all the taste and mystery of a 1920s speakeasy." The "beautiful, bashful, boozy drink" is a sophisticated twist on a champagne cocktail, made of gin, St. Germain Elderflower Liqueur, Crème de Violette, lime juice, lavender simple syrup, Crème Yvette, and prosecco, and garnished with a lime wheel. "This drink disguises the sharp alcohol notes, while allowing the flavor of the spirit to enhance the slight citrus tangs and sweet floral characteristics," adds bartender Ryan Snyder. "With each sip, the drink unveils itself more to the person lucky enough to have pressed their lips to the glass." ■

Hopheads

It's the second coming for beer brewing in Lehigh Valley, where microbreweries have become attractions, offering tours, tastings, food menus – even a game of Jenga so you can hang out and try a few pints. Make your way to **Two Rivers Brewing** in Easton for Colonel Left Eye IPA, **Hijinx Brewing** in Allentown for Party Guy Ale, **Yergy Brewing** in Emmaus for Three Kings & a Wench Imperial Stout, **Weyerbacher Brewery** in Easton for Blithering Idiot, and **Fegley's Brew Works** in Bethlehem for Pawnshop Porter.

The successful growing climate for grapes earned Lehigh Valley the label "American Viticultural Area" a few years ago, catapulting the region's wines and vineyards into the [wine] light. Eight wineries make up the **Lehigh Valley Wine Trail** and plenty more are spread throughout the region, where you can taste and purchase such varietals as Chambourcin, Chardonnay, Grüner Veltliner, and Vidal Blanc, and rule-breakers like cotton candy-infused white wine and sweet and bubbly peach mist.

Liquor Lovers

The essence of Lehigh Valley is distilled at several local alcohol businesses. Standouts include the spiced rum made with vanilla, cinnamon, orange peel, anise, and cardamom at **Social Still Micro-Distillery & Kitchen** in Bethlehem; Xplorer potato vodka at **Kilimanjaro Distillery** in Allentown, naturally sweetened with Pennsylvania potatoes; Authentic Applejack at **Eight Oaks Craft Distillers** in New Tripoli made with apple cider from Scholl Orchards in Kempton; and triple-distilled gin at **Triple Sun Spirits** in Emmaus, that is vapor-infused with 12 different botanicals.

The William F. Curtis Arboretum is an outdoor laboratory for **Cedar Crest College** students, but with trees representing most of the continents, the 140-plus species also give visitors their own educational – and free – experience.

Each November, Bethlehem’s **Lehigh University** and Easton’s **Lafayette College** celebrate Spirit Week, which culminates with college football’s most-played rivalry since 1884. Listen for Lehigh’s Marching 97 tearing through South Mountain performing raucous fight songs in classrooms and libraries or catch a glimpse of Lafayette students stuffing their own mini mascots.

Buy your tickets early: the game draws sell-out crowds to either Lehigh’s Goodman Stadium or Lafayette’s Fisher Field.

The red doors all around Allentown’s **Muhlenberg College** campus are a Lutheran symbol of welcome. Enjoy the hospitality and talent of the theater program, ranked in 2017 by *Princeton Review* as the seventh best college theater in the nation and 17th for best campus food.

Tune up with the **Moravian College** Music Institute, which offers non-credit lessons, classes, workshops, and ensembles, including studio time to record with an accompanist or vocal coach.



The patron saint, St. Francis DeSales, keeps a watchful eye over all who congregate on The Mall, the central hub of the **DeSales University** campus. While you are there, don't miss artist Jay Dugan's Travertine marble sculpture of "Family." ■

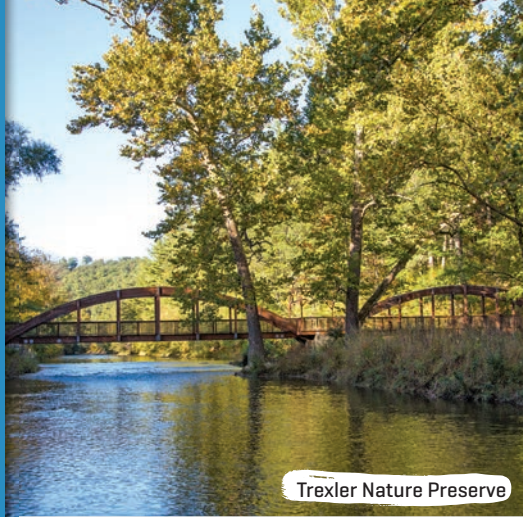
Bear Creek
Mountain Resort Trails



One of the last large undammed rivers in the lower 48 states, the **Scenic Wild Delaware River** flows freely. The forests and open spaces are natural sponges, collecting and filtering rainfall and snowmelt, and releasing water slowly into streams. Seek respite on the water, and fish for smallmouth bass, Walleye, pickerel, and muskie.

Trace the birthplace of America's Industrial Revolution the length of the **Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor**. Reminders of the Lehigh Canal and mid-19th-century German villages co-mingle with main streets. Unearthed anthracite, slate, and limestone once fueled local economies along rolling rivers and the D&L Trail.

Pennsylvania powder is plentiful at **Blue Mountain Resort** where skiers and snowboarders alike can hit challenging chutes, mogul fields, and steep grades. Advanced skiers will enjoy the state's highest vertical drop of 1,082 feet, beginners will appreciate some of Pennsylvania's longest runs, and family-sized snow tubes means the kiddos can pile on the parents for a ride down the mountain. Mother Nature's winter schedule doesn't always coincide with the calendar, so while Lehigh Valley's ski areas provide epic snowy fun, you can challenge your fears here all four seasons of the year. When the snow melts, crush Pennsylvania's highest vertical on two wheels, get to new heights at the Summit Aerial Park, and zipline or stay on target at Action Archery.

Dutch Springs

At **Bear Creek Mountain Resort**, ski-in and ski-out access to a mix of tree-lined trails and wide-open runs makes it ideal for families or groups with beginners in need of easy terrain and Magic Carpet surface lifts; the daredevil bunch can push their limits on runs like Sasquatch with a 50-percent slope. A mountain activity pass at the four-season resort will also give you access to more than seven miles of wooded mountain biking and hiking trails.

Fed from an underground aquifer that provides up to 30 feet of visibility, **Dutch Springs** is the perfect spot to learn to scuba dive; the man-made lake contains underwater attractions including a submerged Sikorsky helicopter, school bus, Cessna airplane, and wooden cabin cruisers. The recreational facility also offers inflatable fun, obstacle courses, water slides, and a Sky Challenge featuring high ropes and a rock climbing wall.

Climb the Henry's Woods loop at **Jacobsburg State Park** to the top of a ravine for views of Bushkill Creek and old growth forests. Near the foothills of the Pocono Plateau, all-terrain cyclists, cross-country skiers, and horseback riders enjoy acres of great trails with flowing streams and wildlife. Happy trails to you with **Lehigh Valley Horseback Trail Rides'** one-hour excursion through scenic woods and fields.

Trek **Trexler Nature Preserve's** 1.2-mile Covered Bridge Trail or fish for trout in the Jordan Creek. And from deep ravines and hemlock forests come – surprise – bison, roaming the landscape for visitors to observe in their natural habitat.

Connect with the natural world at one of **Wildlands Conservancy's** hands-on, fun nature programs. Let a Wildlands naturalist be your guide to discover special parks and preserves, learn about our ecosystem, and interact with education wildlife ambassadors. Wildlands offers hiking, bird watching, biking, paddling, and family-based programs throughout the year.

Order a free **Covered Bridges of Lehigh Valley** brochure for driving directions to all seven examples of architectural beauty. Our tips: Take a long run through Bogert's Bridge in Allentown, a spot in Lehigh Parkway overlooking the Little Lehigh Creek. Then check out Geiger's Bridge — its unusual stepped portal design is reminiscent of a general store in the wild, wild West.

Buckle up your life jacket and get ready for dam release days when the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers liberates extra water from the Francis E. Walter Dam in White Haven, guaranteeing Class III rapids for whitewater rafting trips down the Lehigh River. Choose mild to

wild with **Pocono Whitewater** in Jim Thorpe or **Whitewater Changers** in Weatherly, which both offer family-style trips for younger adventure-seekers and combo trips with hiking, biking, or paintball.

Paddlers in Pennsylvania can rent and launch kayaks, row boats, sailboats, and stand-up paddleboards onto the 117-acre, 50-foot-deep **Leaser Lake**, named for Frederick Leaser, who transported the Liberty Bell from Philadelphia to Allentown during the Revolutionary War. Landlubbers can also enjoy the four-mile Liberty Bell Trail, with beautiful views, easy hiking, and in winter, cross-country skiing. ■

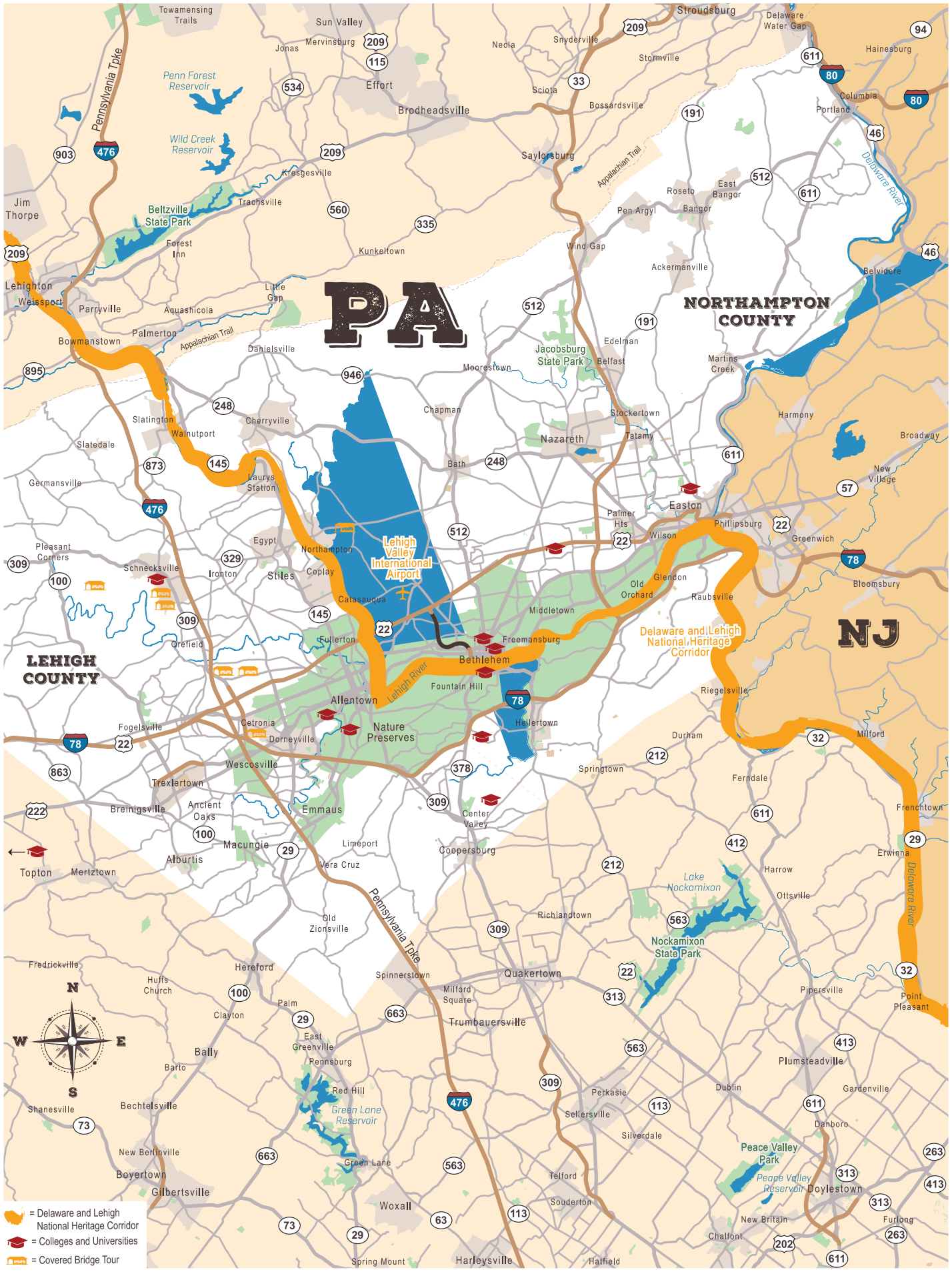

ALLENTOWN

Old factories, former garment mills, and an old book bindery are among Allentown's industrial artifacts – all being reclaimed and reborn as apartments, offices, and restaurants, each helping to redefine the city's skyline. Home to three historic districts, one of the best park systems in the country, and hubs for health care and e-commerce, Allentown no longer relies on the power of the Lehigh River to drive industry and trade, but instead, it depends on devout hockey fans who flock to the PPL Center to see the Phantoms and fabulous concerts, diners willing to taste the culinary personalities of downtown restaurants, and visitors looking to spend the night in the aptly-named Renaissance® Allentown Hotel.

Open DAILY

HOW TO SPEND A WEEKEND

in Allentown

PLAY

Nearly 2,000 years of cultural heritage and 17,000-plus works of art merge seamlessly at **Allentown Art Museum**, where contemporary artists riff on Renaissance and Baroque paintings and youngsters train as peer docents. Art at the Allentown Museum is seen as a dialogue between past and present, where visitors in early 2018 can see exhibitions highlighting sports photographers and their place in the history of photography, as well as Spanish Colonial Art that showcases the daily life and religious practices of Latin America.

You can actually touch – and ring – a replica of the Liberty Bell that rests at the **Liberty Bell Museum** in Zion's Reformed United Church of Christ. The site was not only where America's most famous symbol of freedom was hidden during the Revolutionary War, but it also served as a refuge during Indian raids, a hospital, and a meeting place for the reading of the Declaration of Independence.

Typically, in peak bloom in June and July, the **Malcolm Gross Rose Garden** off Ott Street in Allentown, is the perfect backdrop for summer nuptials – or a stroll along the 1.3-mile walking loop with 10 wellness stations.

Lehigh Parkway's six-plus miles of maintained trails, tucked away from downtown Allentown along the Little Lehigh Creek, are often the site of many 5K runs, but you'll also find fishing opportunities, covered bridge photo opps, the **Museum of Indian Culture**, and the Hunter's Cabin which dates back to 1739.

You may need to rent an extra car to get home the great finds you'll discover at **Weil Antique Center**. The center's 150 dealers display furniture, lamps, jewelry, clocks, and rare kitchenware.

EAT

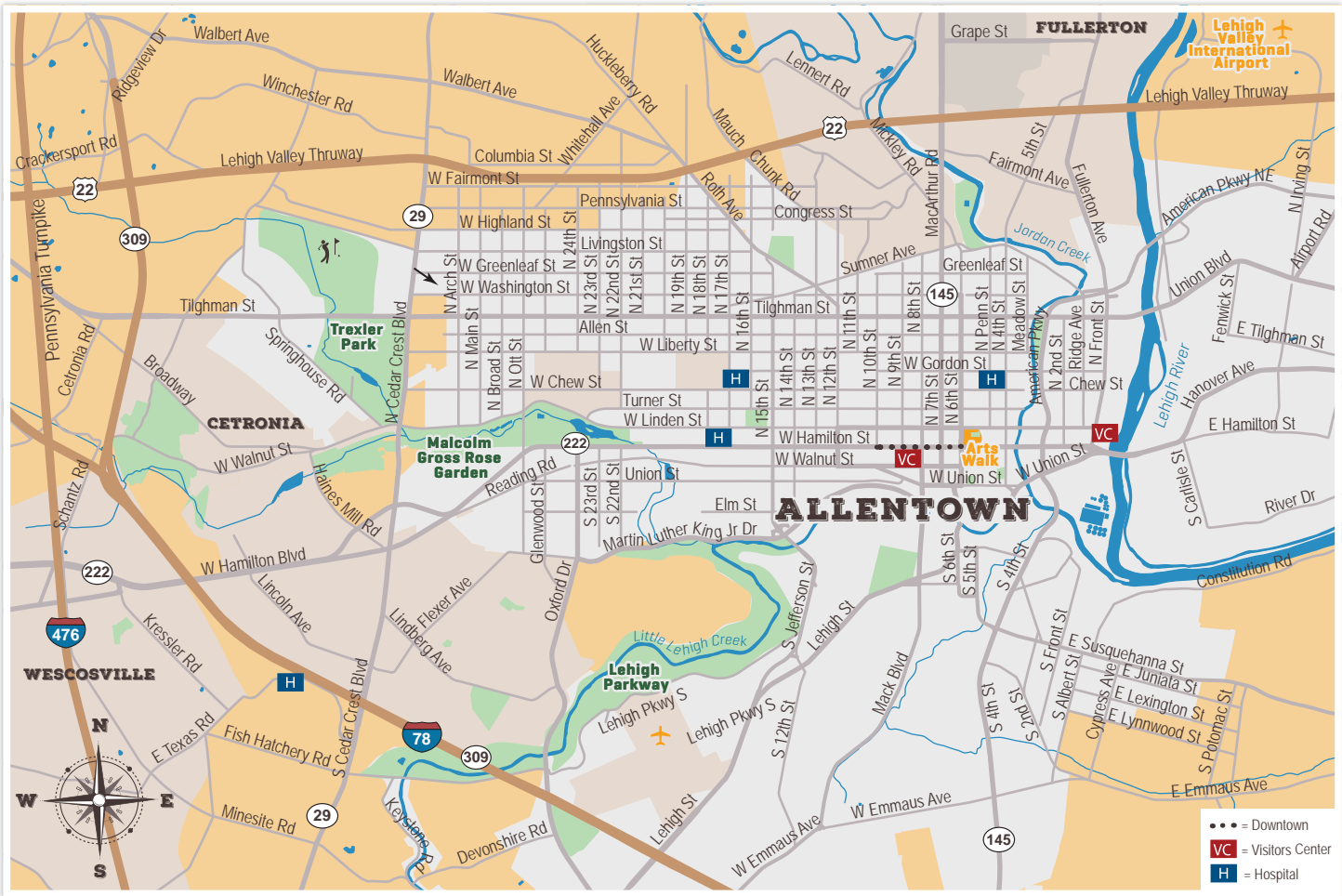
"The Bayou Boys" Morris Taylor and Cristian Duarte serve up mounds of

house-smoked brisket and chicken at **Queen City BBQ** with fixins' like burnt ends baked beans and buttermilk biscuits. Start with the Brisket Pierogies topped with demi, onions, and Wisconsin cheddar cheese curds, the Mac & Cheese topped with sweet, smoky bacon, and an order of the Crabby Puppy, crab and cornmeal hushpuppies.

In tribute to Lehigh Valley, Josh Palmer of Sette Luna and Maxim's 22 serves up IronPig and Hamilton Street paninis at **Centro**, as well as rustic Italian cuisine like pasta, pizza, and risotto balls.

The Thai-inspired **Bay Leaf** has been a mainstay through Allentown's revitalization, serving up both Asian specialties like a mango napoleon with crabmeat, shrimp, basil oil, and American dishes like veal Milanese with an aged parmesan crust and roasted red pepper sauce.

The fusion of Asian, French, and Mediterranean cuisine is evident in **Grille 3501** dishes like crispy king salmon with grilled cucumber leek ragout, Yukon gold dill coulis, roasted oyster mushrooms, and cilantro yuzu oil. Enjoy your meal al fresco with open-air or patio dining.

STAY

The **Renaissance® Allentown Hotel** is part of an innovative approach to urban development – the reuse of the historic Dime Bank building for an industrial yet modern 170-room hotel, and Dime Restaurant



put guests within the PPL Center complex, and in walking distance to several companies.

Breinigsville

From corn, wheat, barley, and oats to pick-your-own orchards, hayride tours, and mazes, **Grim’s Orchard & Family Farms** has changed with the times. Enjoy the bounce pillows and caterpillar slide during Fall Festival weekends or be chilled to the core at Grimville Haunted Orchard.

Emmaus

What started out as a mobile wood oven at farmers’ markets transformed into Emmaus’s **Switchback Pizza Company**. Menu highlights include the Blue Moon, with roasted local portobello mushrooms, caramelized onions, and Gorgonzola cheese or the Happy Pig, local and naturally raised sausage and bacon, mozzarella, and tomato sauce. “Made with love and cooked with fire,” Switchback uses local ingredients to help minimize their ecological footprint.

Fogelsville

Unwind at the **Glasbern Inn**, a 19th-century farm restored among beautiful organic farmland. Rest up in a garden cottage with private pasture views or standard rooms built within the barn, and then dine on farm-fresh produce sourced straight from the property’s greenhouses and vegetable gardens.

Macungie

It’s always happy days at Macungie Memorial Park, where Henry Winkler, aka The Fonz from “Happy Days” once made an appearance at the **Wheels of Time Rod & Custom Jamboree**. The 42-acre park with a public swimming pool and playground also hosts a farmers’ market, antique truck show, dog shows, bingo nights, and special events like the Jamboree and **Das Awkscht Fescht**, where cars are the main attraction, but so is the new “Pit at The Park” barbecue cook-off.

“My perfect Allentown day would start with a run or bike ride (and sometimes both) along the beautiful **Little Lehigh Parkway** or the **D&L Trail**. Later, my wife and I would head to **HiJinx Brewing Company** for a pint of Hop Havoc or Barista’s Choice amid the stainless-steel fermentation tanks. We would follow that with dinner at one of Allentown’s many family-owned ethnic restaurants, perhaps Ethiopian at **Mariam’s Restaurant**, Mexican at **La Placita Mexican Deli**, Turkish at **Aci Halal**, or Syrian at **Damascus**. We’d end the evening with an independent film at the **Nineteenth Street Theatre** or a soccer game at **Muhlenberg College** and a quiet stroll home.”

WINTER

Take the family for a holiday outing through **Lights in The Parkway**, a one-mile-plus drive-through event with animated light displays. Roll down the window and wave to the reindeer, snowmen, toy soldiers, ice skaters, and Santa – he may just wave back.

The long-running holiday puppet show featuring **Pip the Mouse** made a comeback at the Liberty Bell Museum in the early 2000s and no holiday season in Lehigh Valley is complete without a viewing of the “Mouse Before Christmas” with its restored original audio soundtrack.

Funnel cakes and giant turkey legs are a must at **The Great Allentown Fair**, but the ag-venture has something for the farmer, the foodie, the fan, and the fun-seeker. Try your hand at the hay bale-throwing contest, watch farm-to-table chef demonstrations, get your tickets for big-name musical acts, or giggle and spin on the carnival midway’s teacups.

Bring it on, big brother tin man: **Drum Corps International**, marching music’s major league, takes the field at J. Birney Crum Stadium in Allentown at the “Granddaddy of them all,” the last major competition before participants head to the World Championships.

SUMMER

There’s no better way to ring in the summer than at **Blues, Brews, & Barbecue**, downtown Allentown’s celebration of community. The extensive musical lineup will keep you entertained while you get your grub on from local BBQ vendors and sip responsibly from a variety of craft and domestic beers.

FALL

What you can’t see will haunt you at **Dorney Park & Wildwater Kingdom’s Halloween Haunt**, where zombies, ghouls, and ghosts lurk in the amusement park’s twisted mazes and scare zones. For scare-free Halloween activities, the **Great Pumpkin Fest** offers families pumpkin painting, mask-making, and a petting zoo with the PEANUTS™ characters. ■

"The Bridge," an arching band of steel reflects the city's rich industrial history and the natural gas-fed blue flame is the light of revitalization, the promise of preservation, and the commitment to put Bethlehem on the map where culture meets commerce. And both Main Street and the SouthSide mirror that sentiment. Lehigh University and Moravian College are bookends to a diverse community of both pre-colonial heritage and a booming music scene. Turn toward South Mountain at the holidays where the star of Bethlehem honors the Moravians, the original titans of industry.

PLAY

When you bring the kids for SteelStacks™ Peas & Qs free educational programming – music, magic, crafts, film – you can work in a history lesson: Amble the **Hoover Mason Trestle** and learn about Bethlehem Steel's contribution to the Manhattan skyline and WWII.

SHOP

There's a little luck of the Irish in every purchase you make at **Donegal Square** in Bethlehem, where you can pick up a bar of Mitchell's Original Wool Fat Soap, whisky nosing glasses, or Irish brown bread mix.

EAT

To honor the empire that once was, **Social Still** distills spirits

with Pennsylvania-grown grains and corn honoring the state's rich agricultural past, but the kitchen is also churning out recipes that pay tribute to the modern-day Keystone State including the Jurgielewicz & Son Farm duck breast with cheddar bacon grits.

It's an especially challenging moment when the fantastic wait staff at **Tapas on Main** approaches the table and you are

conflicted with having to choose one of nine flavors of sangria, including pineapple mint, blood orange berry, or ginger peach. Follow a pitcher or two with the papas a la Francesca, hand-cut fries with manchego cheese, and drizzled with truffle oil; and the white bean and chorizo stew topped with frisée and a fried egg.

Dining at **1741 on the Terrace** is a must, as is making a reservation for the hotel's musical brunch on Sundays. Book a stay during the holiday season, and enjoy the hotel decked out in all its holiday finery.

The current **Historic Hotel Bethlehem** opened during the heyday of Bethlehem Steel and still maintains its original interior design. While it was once equipped with "everything a respectable gentleman traveler would need while away from home," today it





boasts 128 elegant rooms with views of one of the Top 10 *USA Today* Main Streets, Moravian College, Lehigh University, and iconic Bethlehem star. The Hotel sits in the midst of Historic Moravian Bethlehem, a National Historic Landmark District recently named to the U.S. tentative list for UNESCO World Heritage Designation.

Read the reviews of **Hyatt Place Bethlehem** and you'll see the spacious rooms, friendly staff, and impressive continental breakfast are favorites among hotel guests. Keep your eye out for seasonal packages for Musikfest, including a mug; and a Christkindlmarkt package with hot chocolate during the holiday season.

A journey underground at **Lost River Caverns** reveals nature's ancient subterranean world of wonder. Always at 52 degrees Fahrenheit, the cave's 30-minute tour showcases crystal-flecked stalagmites and stalactites, graceful cascades, and flowstones.

There's no Colonel Mustard with a candlestick, but if you have the chance, stay in **Sayre Mansion's Conservatory** – so you can wake up in the Conservatory – the glass-topped roof with its expansive tree-lined views of Bethlehem lets in a morning light so magical, you'll want to head out and explore.



Year Round in BETHLEHEM

My perfect Bethlehem day: As a resident of South Bethlehem, I've come to love the walkability of the area. In the morning, it's easy to stop by **Lit Coffee Roastery and Bakeshop** to grab a pastry and pour-over coffee before work. **Bonn Place Brewing Company** is a favorite for after work and weekend drinks, serving up the fruity and hoppy Butt-Rock, American Pale Ale from some of the nicest people you'll meet. If I'm looking for something fancier before a concert, I know **Molinari's** on Third Street is always serving up consistently delicious, authentic Italian food. It's also a short, mile walk to North Bethlehem, where I frequently visit **Fegley's Brew Works** to grab dinner and hang out with friends. In the summertime, I love heading down to **The Wooden Match** to watch bands outdoors and enjoy their patio or stop by for a pint after a run on the nearby D&L Trail. **The Mint Gastropub** in West Bethlehem is another favorite, with a rotating menu of inspired cooking and a beverage menu that'll please any palate.

WINTER

Family fun is the name of the game at **PEEPSFEST®**, the annual two-day New Year's Eve festival at the iconic Steel-Stacks™ in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania on December 30 and 31. Each year, fans arrive from all over the country to enjoy family-friendly activities and dropping of the 4.9-foot-tall, 400-pound lit PEEPS® Chick in the early evening on Dec. 31 to commemorate the beginning of an exciting new year.

Mill about the Goundie House on Main Street in Bethlehem on December evenings leading up till Christmas – and you'll catch a local merchant popping out to share treats from the only known "Live Advent Calendar," one of the exciting events and activities held in **Christmas City**. People throughout the country send their holiday cards here to receive the "Christmas City" cancellation. And save some of the holiday shopping for **Christkindlmarkt**, rated one of the top holiday markets in the world by *USA Today 10 Best* and *Travel + Leisure*. The market's heated tents full of old-world charm are lined with vendors selling glass ornaments, wooden toys, and holiday home décor; and **Christmas City Village**, an outdoor market in historic downtown Bethlehem with wooden huts filled with craft, retail, holiday, and food vendors. Ride the free Christmas trolley between the markets on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays throughout the holiday season.

If you've done the driving to get to Christmas City, let someone else take the wheel while you grab a window seat for the **Bethlehem by Night Bus Tour**. A guide in period dress will shed light on local holiday traditions through the years, take you to historic sites throughout north and south Bethlehem, aglow in dazzling Christmas lights, and visit the famous Bethlehem star atop South Mountain, a symbol of the city's industrious Moravian founders and Bethlehem Steel, the industrial behemoth that forged the metal that frames the star.

SUMMER

It's music to the fans' ears when the bands play for free, and the majority of the acts at **Musikfest**, August 3-12, 2018, come with no price tag, making it the largest free, non-gated music festival in the country. Last year saw nearly 420 performers and 550 performances on 16 stages, including headliners Santana, Chicago, and Toby Keith, and extras like buskers, vendors, an inflatable art sculpture, and earfuls of Aw Shucks sweet roasted corn.

There's fruit-filled fun to be had at the 32nd annual **Blueberry Festival** July 20-21 hosted at Burnside Plantation by Historic Bethlehem Museums & Sites. The sweet event is chockful of baby blues – you'll find them in the pie, ice cream, coffee cake, strudel, beer, wine, mead, vodka – even the pierogies.

FALL

The shepherd's pie, Irish stew, and corned beef and cabbage are a given at Bethlehem's **Celtic Classic**, the largest free Celtic festival in North America. The popular event is also home of the official U.S. National Highland Games Championship, and the setting for fiddle (and Haggis) competitions, and the "Showing of the Tartan" Parade.

American soldiers from the Revolutionary War are said to still linger in a Moravian College classroom, originally built to house the Single Brothers. You'll hear about these and other paranormal tales on **The Moravian Book Shop's Ghost ToursSM—Historic Haunts of Downtown Bethlehem.** ■

in Easton

PLAY

Engage in a conversation about flooding and other important environmental issues at Easton's **Nature Nurture Center**, home to the Science on a Sphere program, one of 100 in the world. Entice the kids with the promise of a six-foot suspended globe that displays high-res videos about planetary science.

Easton is redefining the term "art trail." Where most art trails are merely organized maps of neighboring studios you can visit, the **Karl Stirner Arts Trail (KSAT)** is actually a 1.75-mile paved art walk which follows the bucolic Bushkill Creek in downtown Easton. The KSAT showcases outdoor installations such as Willie Cole's Grace Gate; Paul Deery's Waterway, artwork you can actually walk through; local poet Beth Seetch's wall poem Funeral at the trail's mid-point tunnel; The Tree of 40 Fruit, a living piece of art by Sam Van Aken; and the Young Masters Wall, where school kids and adults alike have the opportunity to share their talents. The KSAT is also home to a dog park and hosts movie nights and other events.

An eclectic group of shows will entice audiences to Easton's **State Theatre**, which includes the Bach Choir of Bethlehem, celebrating its 120th birthday. The 2018 lineup also includes "A Chorus Line," "Cabaret," "Dirty Dancing Live," the "Red Hot Chilli Pipers," a bagpiping group with attitude; "Dancing with the Lehigh Valley Stars," pitting regional celebrities against each other; and in May, the 16th Annual **FREDDY® Awards**, recognizing the accomplishments of local high schools in musical theater production and performance.

At the confluence of the Delaware and Lehigh Rivers, visitors come to the charming riverside town to take in the vibrant greens of heirloom veggies at Easton Farmers' Market, root for the Lafayette College maroon and white, and debate the age-old controversy about the Easton flag: did its 13 white eight-pointed stars and red and white stripes predate the one made by Betsy Ross?

nation's longest-running, continuously operating outdoor farmers' market.

There's some cultural coolness making noise every fourth Friday at **Easton Out Loud**, a once-a-month way for the city to showcase its food, music, art, retail, with special events like a pop-up beer garden, lip sync contest, or yappy hour for the pups.

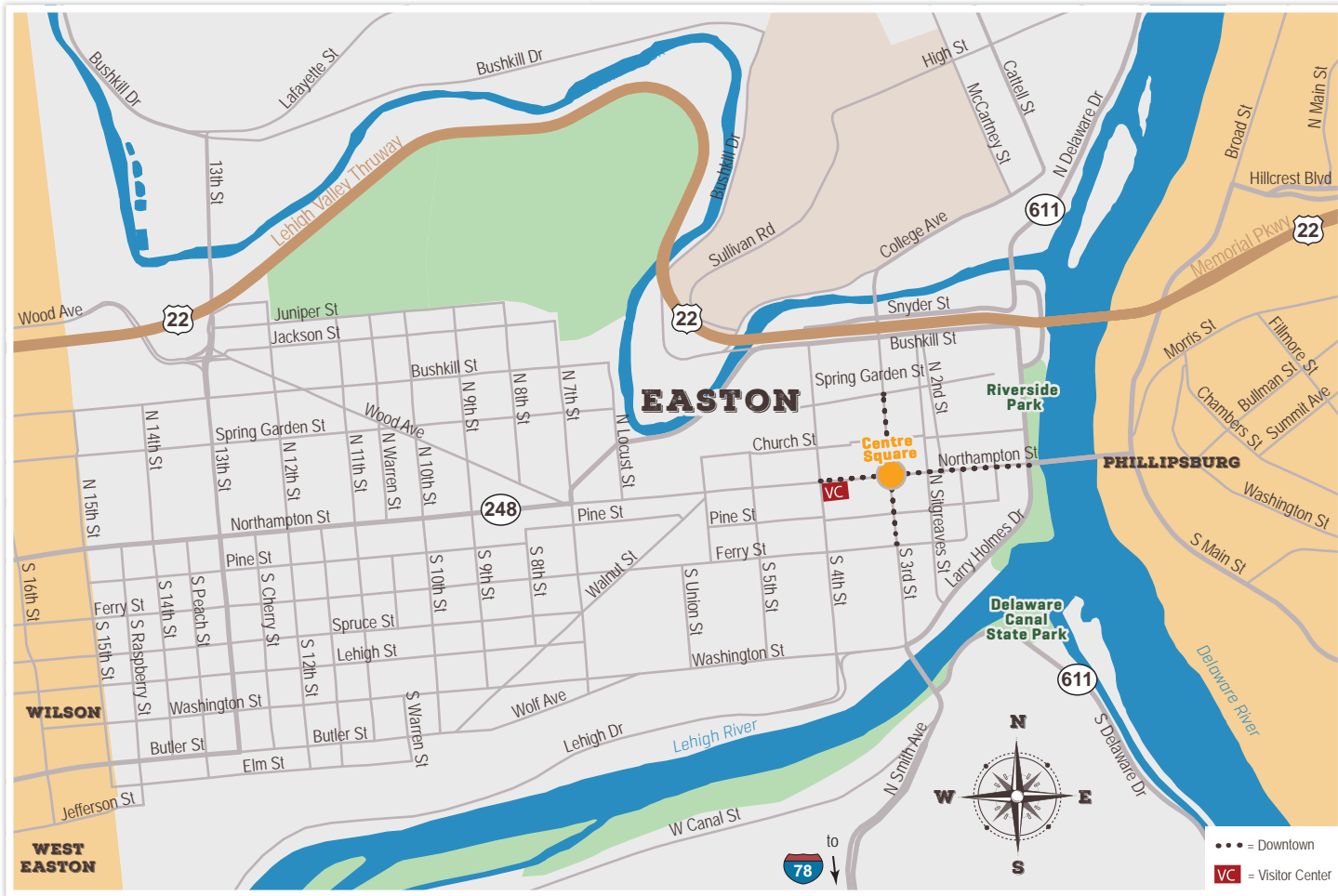
EAT

The butcher, the baker, the wine, and cheese maker all got together and formed the **Easton Public Market**, a fun and vibrant metropolitan food hall with a fresh, local food market and artisanal grocery. From date nights to family outings, the market offers everything from Belgian chocolates and cappuccino to craft beer, wood-fired pizza, ramen, crepes, BBQ, and more. There are even kids cooking classes for the littlest foodie in training!

Straightforward American seafood is on the menu at **3rd & Ferry Fish Market**. Try the ceviche flight and pan-seared scallops with bacon onion marmalade. Save room for dessert: the pieshake is half a slice of pie with ice cream and to garnish it off, the other half slice of pie!

Make yourself at home at the mahogany bar at **Porters' Pub & Restaurant**, where patrons who've drank all 60 worldly beers on the menu earn one of the more than 5,000 mugs hanging on the ceiling.





Any modern Mexican restaurant that serves not one but four different kinds of guacamole, is perfect for the tortilla chip-eating foodie who wants a twist on the standards: try **Mesa's** roasted pork quesadilla with fig and chili jam, or a roasted chicken roulade with chorizo, goat cheese, raisins, and roasted peppers.

You'll learn the whole process – from giant tanks holding barrels of beer to bottling, labeling, and distribution on a tour of **Weyerbacher**. The Easton brewery has tapped into the market for high-gravity beers like the flagship Belgian-style Merry Monks ale, or the Blithering Idiot, a deep copper ale with hints of date and fig.

Søle Artisan Ales, the nomadic brewery of “juicy, hazy IPAs” settled down last year to open two locations. Bar+Bottle in downtown Easton pairs its popular selections like Buice Jox and Pineapple

Smooch with one-off collabs with other brewers. The “beer playground” and brewing facility, Søle World HQ, in a former silk mill, produces heavy-handed IPAs and Lambic-style wild ales.

Eat your way through Easton on a Taste of the West Ward, a Roaring 20s Trolley Tour (you'll “speakeasy” along the journey) or Future Foodies tour catering to kids with the **Taste of Easton Tour Company**, sampling the area's signature dishes.

STAY

Steps from Centre Square, the hotel-turned condominium-turned-**Grand Eastonian Hotel & Suites** boasts spacious suites with stunning wood floors, a rare find today, but a nice balance between its historic and modern amenities.

Once owned by prominent land owners and then a college frat house, the **Lafayette Inn**, has been in the loving care of Paul and Laura Di Liello since 2005.

Eighteen guest rooms and suites – including Room #1 with its red toile curtains, walk-in shower and heated bathroom floor – offers something for everyone.

Nazareth

Discover Lehigh Valley's rich Moravian heritage by visiting the **Moravian Historical Society**, housed in Nazareth's 1740/1743 Whitefield House and the 1740 Gray Cottage, the oldest Moravian buildings in North America. Explore American Indian and Colonial American history through walking tours, exhibitions, festivals, workshops, and more.

Face the music at **Martin on Main** on August 4, 2018, for the 11th annual celebration of the legacy of C.F. Martin Guitar. Enjoy food, crafts, beer, wine, mead, crafts, and, of course, guitars.

Year Round in EASTON

Easton is a city defined by its food. On Saturday mornings, locals start with breakfast at **Easton Farmers' Market** – a flaky pastry at the **Flour Shop Bakery** stand, a hot cup of coffee from **Fieldstone Coffee Roasters**, or sit down for a fresh meal at **Quadrant Book Mart & Coffee House**. Locals and tourists flock to the Farmers' Market for the freshest in local, organic produce, pasture-raised meats, artisan cheeses and breads – and peruse the wares at nearby **Just Around the Corner Gallery** and its Artists in the Alley series. For lunch there's any number of options at **Easton Public Market** – fresh crepes from **Full of Crepe**, Ramen noodle bowls from **Mister Lee's**, barbecue from **More Than Q**, or Egyptian rice bowls from **The Taza Stop**. Foodies linger at the market, stopping at the on-site fish monger, butcher, specialty cheese and olive oils shop, farm stand and winery – and leaving room for a decadent truffle or macaron at **Chocodiem**.

Street festivals like **Garlic Fest**, **Bacon Fest**, **Clam Jam**, and **Lebanese Heritage Days** serve up mouthwatering favorites year after year. Beer lovers find new sips at **Weyerbacher Brewing** and **Søle Artisan Ales**. Sweet tooth cravings are satisfied with Peanut Butter Meltaways and popcorn from the **Carmelcorn Shop**, donuts and coffee rolls from **Easton Baking**, or a decadent cupcake from **Sweet Girlz Bakery**. Even our bike rides with **Genesis Bicycles** end with a homemade scoop of ice cream at **Bank Street Creamery**.

WINTER

You can't hold a candle to Easton's Holiday Open House and **Peace Candle Lighting**, but you can come out to the Soldiers and Sailors monument in Downtown Easton for live music, carriage rides, street performers, ice carvers, holiday shopping, and the Peace Candle Lighting Ceremony, the official start to the city's holiday festivities. For more than 60 years, the 106-foot-tall structure has been lit up as a symbol of harmony and peace.

There's a new trio in town – at least every second Friday of the month from May to September when the Easton Main Street Initiative presents **Live at the Falls** in Scott Park – a pairing of beer, food, and music.

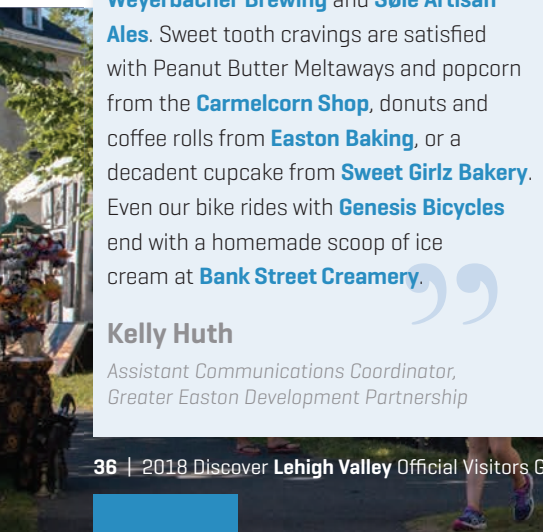
FALL

Join Easton on July 8 for puppet shows, parade, music, tours, arts, and crafts.

Pig out on cured strips of fat at **PA Bacon Fest**, a sizzling celebration that grew out of the Easton Farmers' Market. A Bacon & Brew tasting event, Racin' Bacon 5K, pig roast, mechanical pig ride, pig moon bounce, and hog-calling contest provide plenty of heart-stopping entertainment at this swine and dine event. ■
