- HOOVER MASON TRESTLE:



FUN FACTS ABOUT LEHIGH VALLEY

- At 81 feet high, the electric Star of Bethlehem sits high atop South Mountain, and has been greeting visitors since the 1930s.
- Established in 1752, the Easton Farmers' Market is the country's oldest continuous open-air market.
- The Lehigh River, which connects Lehigh Valley's three main cities, spans 120 miles and is crossed by 16 bridges.
- Lehigh Valley is home to 10 colleges and universities. More than 45,000 students attend school here.
- The Saylor Cement Company in Coplay is thought to be the first company in the United States to produce Portland cement in 1871.
- On July 8, 1776, Easton's Centre Square was the site of just one of three public readings of the Declaration of Independence.
- With more than 220 acres devoted to grape growing, the Lehigh Valley Wine Trail was designated as an American Viticultural Area in 2008.
