8 Old Town Eureka

Little changed from early days, Old Town contains many Victorian-era buildings in a lively neighborhood of shops, dining and events. **Clarke Memorial Museum** is famous for Native American basketry.

9 Fort Humboldt

Military post established in 1853 (Ulysses S. Grant was stationed here.), includes museum, buildings and outdoor exhibits of logging equipment. "Steam-Ups" of vintage engines in summer.

10 Victorian Ferndale

12 Avenue of the Giants

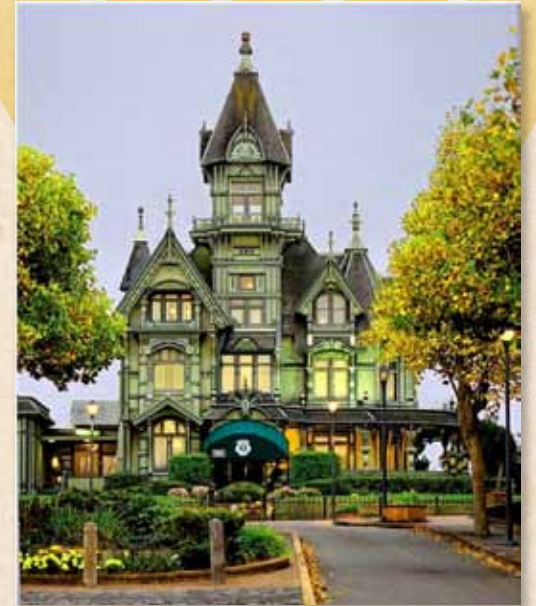

4 Arcata Plaza

Historic town square, where pack trains to the goldfields assembled. **Jacoby's Storehouse** is an original fortified structure now full of shops and dining; President McKinley's statue presides over all.

5 Samoa Cookhouse
