Lord Fairfax is currently a senior executive with Russian shipowning company SCF Group; a director of the North of England marine insurance company; a consultant to Burford Capital, the world leading litigation funding and corporate intelligence firm; and a co-founder of Hawki Worldwide Ltd, a private security firm.

Having been a member of the House of Lords from 1977 – 1999, he was then elected back into that body as one of 48 elected Hereditary Conservative Peers in November 2015. His interests there include the United Kingdom Leaving the European Union, maritime affairs and the social and economic effects of artificial intelligence.

Lord Fairfax has travelled extensively in Russia and the states of the former Soviet Union. In 2005 he organized and led the "White Night's Ride," a charity motorbike trip of 7,500 miles across Russia and Siberia, raising about USD 1 million for charitable causes.
