

Once a reformatory, the Workhouse Arts Center is now home to more than 90 of the region's finest professional and emerging artists. Set on 55 acres of land, the DC Workhouse and Reformatory's story began over 100 years ago, when President Theodore Roosevelt sought ways to train prisoners and make them more self-sufficient following their release. In 1917, 72 members of the National Women's Party were incarcerated at the Workhouse for advocating for women's right to vote. Today, this one-of-a-kind arts center offers essential visual and performing arts, studios and exhibition spaces, and engaging art education programs for people of all ages and artistic abilities. The Workhouse Arts Center's artists make it easy to come home with the perfect memento of your trip.
