## • Leisa Greathouse, Museum of the Cape Fear

- o **Rise of the Funeral Parlor** Sunday, August 28<sup>th</sup> at 2:00pm. In conjunction with the museum's current special exhibit, Parlor to Parlor: Funeral Traditions of the Cape Fear, 1850-1950, David Hall will give a presentation about how funerals went from taking place in the parlors of homes to the rise of the funeral parlor as a business.
- Festival of Yesteryear Saturday, September 10<sup>th</sup> from 10:00am to 5:00pm.
   Focusing on the Colonial and Revolutionary War periods, this program features re-enactors demonstrating various aspects of daily life including colonial medicine, crime and punishment, music, toys and games, and militia drills.
   Highlighting this year's event is the return of Lafayette, portrayed by Mark Schneider.

# • Meg Suraci, Cape Fear Botanical Garden

- o 13<sup>th</sup> Heritage Festival Sunday, September 18<sup>th</sup> from 11:00am to 5:00pm: A fun filled day of history in the Heritage Garden Complex made up of a Farm House, General Store, Tobacco Barn, and Corn Crib. There will also be children's activities including pony rides and pumpkin painting. Refreshments will be available for purchase.
- O Halloween at the Boo-tanical Garden Friday, October 28<sup>th</sup> to Sunday, October 30<sup>th</sup>. Trails will be decorated with jack-o-lanterns and food and beverages will be available for purchase.
- o **Nature Connects: LEGO Exhibit** Begins Friday, September 30<sup>th</sup> and runs through Sunday, January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017. Exhibit will feature LEGO sculptures inspired by nature and include educational activities, as well as hands-on LEGO brick building.
- Holiday Lights in the Garden Begins Friday, December 9<sup>th</sup> and runs through Friday, December 30<sup>th</sup>. Attractions and festivities include a synchronized show of lights and music, a mile long stroll featuring thousands of lights aglow, photos with Santa on select evenings, S'mores roasting over the fire pit, and free crafts for children.

○ Updated the group on April event – Blast from the Past. It was a successful event with over 1,000 people in attendance and has decided to turn into an annual event, but moving the date to October. Also, reminded everyone of the park receiving the NC Connect Bond grant. The park is very excited and planning will begin in 2017. Also stated that the park has participated in 116 Interpretation and Education programs and the park has received 46,892 visitors since January 2016.
