


Introduction

- All data was collected by the David McCune Gallery staff during the event.
- The David McCune Gallery management estimated 3,000 attendees prior to the event.
- There were 473 completed surveys.
- Using the 3,000 attendees, the Confidence Interval for this presentation with a 473 Sample Size is +/- 4.14%. Because of the size of the sample the Confidence Interval surpassed the "best practice" of +/- 5%.

Overview

- Only 2 of the 473 completed surveys provided an invalid zip code.
- 447 were from North Carolina and 30 were from more than 100 miles from Fayetteville.
- 4 identified themselves as being here specifically for the event and overnighting in a hotel.



On January 9th at 7 pm, Rosenthal Gallery at Fayetteville State University opens The Body as a Photographic Narrative: Works by Gray Lyons. The artist is a contemporary photographer that uses 19th century monochrome photographic process called cyanotype. As the name suggests, the process creates cyan-blue images. www.FSUArts.com

On February 3, Reflections: African-American Life from the Myrna Collet-Lee collection opens at the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County. Reflections is a celebration of African-American identity through paintings, collages, photographs, textile pieces and works on paper. The exhibit includes noted artists such as Elizabeth Catlett, Romare Bearden, Gwen Knight and James Van Der Zee. On February 9, the David McCune International Art Gallery opens "Impressions to Modernism: Masterworks of Early Photography." The collection chronicles the progression of photography from the painterly Impressionistic work to the modernist aesthetic that calls for photographs to represent the real world. The 46-piece exhibition is organized around Alfred Stieglitz, famed American photographer and husband of Georgia O'Keefe. The exhibition closes April 8.

FAYETTEVILLE'S FINE ARTS SCENE

January 3, 2017

The greater Fayetteville area boasts several unique art venues that bring regional, national, and even international exhibits to our front door. Visitors might stumble across a temporary installation on a downtown street, find regional artwork on display in a studio or bookstore, or take in a renowned exhibit at a university gallery. Two such galleries are located at Fayetteville State University (FSU) and Methodist University (MU). As 2017 dawns, we are already anticipating many art exhibits on our calendar, but we are especially excited about the two photography exhibits coming to FSU and MU over the next month.



On January 9, Fayetteville State University will be unveiling *The Body as a Photographic Narrative* at the Rosenthal Gallery, located in the Rosenthal Building on FSU's campus. One of the more exciting exhibits to be hosted in this space over the past year was *Black Panther: The Revolutionary Art of Emory Douglas*, featuring graphic art created by Douglas during his time serving as Minister of Culture for the Black Panther Party.

Now, Rosenthal's upcoming exhibit is bringing to the university works by contemporary photographer Gray Lyons. The artist's technique is that of cyanotope—a 19th century monochrome photographic printing process. Using the female body as subject matter, Lyons has created "narrative-based self-portraits, focusing on issues of identity." This exhibit will remain on display to the public through February 11, 2017.

Housed in the William F. Bethune Center for Visual Arts on MU's campus, the David McCune International Art Gallery has the reputation of consistently bringing renowned fine art exhibits to Fayetteville. Last year was no exception with the celebrated exhibit Rodin: Portraits of a Lifetime. On February 9, McCune's intimate space will be transformed by Impressionism to Modernism: Masterworks of Early Photography.

As artists were struggling to establish photography as "fine art" at the turn of the 20th century, Alfred Stieglitz became the leader of this artistic movement. The photographs featured in this exhibit show off the archetypal works created by the Pictorialist photographers that Stieglitz brought recognition to, but also the works that transitioned this art form from Pictorialism to Modernism. A reception will be held on opening night, and the exhibit will then remain on display to the public through April 8, 2017.

Bottom Line

- All Tourism Development Authority (TDA) requirements were met.
- The sample size was **excellent** and **exceeded** the "best practices" for sample versus participants.
- Of those participants staying at a hotel, the overall average length of stay was 1 night.
- **0.84%** of participants (**4**) were overnighters and came specifically for the event extrapolated out to 3,000 participants this means potentially **24** people X **1** nights = **24 room nights** (+/- 4.14%)
- 2 participants were referred by hotels.
- 81.40% were from Cumberland County, including Fort Bragg.
- 9.51% were day-trippers.
- Participants heard of the event mainly by Word of Mouth (30%) and Invitation (29%).
- 19 attendees signed up for the FACVB's E-Promotion Program and provided a valid E-mail address.
- Those that came for the event and stayed at a hotel listed the following hotels; Fairfield Inn.
- Official Hotel Pick Up: 0 Pickup reported.
