Most Fort Wayne attractions are handicap accessible. However, there are a few destinations that are not handicap accessible or have limited handicap accessibility.

Sites with limited accessibility include:

- The Old Fort's Blacksmith Shop is accessible, but other buildings have a 6-8" front porch with no ramps. Second floors are not accessible.
- The African/African-American Historical Museum is handicap accessible to the first floor only.
- The Cathedral Museum is accessible, but you will need to alert the clerk a the front desk, who will guide you to the elevator
- Karpeles Manuscript Museum is unfortunately not handicap accessible due to it being an older building with more than twenty steps to the entrance doors.
