It's no mystery why Fort Worth is known as the "Cultural Capital of the Southwest." In this District, you can walk to five internationally-recognized museums in a beautiful, park-like setting that are all acclaimed for their architecture, the quality of their collections and the programs they offer.

Amon Carter Museum of American Art

View a stunning survey of American art, from the first landscape painters of the 1830s to modern artists of the 20th century. The museum also houses Amon G. Carter's collection of works by Frederic Remington and Charles M. Russell.

Fort Worth Museum of Science and History

The Fort Worth Museum of Science and History houses a variety of science and history exhibitions. The Museum's permanent exhibitions include: DinoLabs & DinoDig, Energy Blast, Fort Worth Children's Museum and the Cattle Raisers Museum, a "museum within a museum." The Museum is also home to

the first Omni Theater, an IMAX Dome in the Southwest which features a 120-foot screen and the Noble Planetarium, which allows you to see more than 7,000 stars.

Fort Worth Zoo

Texas Wild! is a hands-on exhibit that teaches about the state's various regions. The Great Barrier Reef takes visitors to the mysterious waters of the Coral Sea. And, the zoo is home to the country's premier herpetarium, the Museum of Living Art (MOLA).
