DAY ONE

Uptown Living and Cultural Hot Spots



Downtown Fort Worth is a national model of urban revitalization. As the nation’s premier downtown, the Sundance Square district boasts 35-square-blocks of shopping, dining, nightlife and performing arts venues, including: **Bass Performance Hall**, voted “one of the top 10 opera houses in the world,” by Travel + Leisure magazine; and the **Jubilee Theater**, one of the foremost theaters in the Southwest.

Deeper into downtown, visitors will discover the **Water Gardens** – a refreshing oasis adjacent to the **Fort Worth Convention Center** with three pools of water: aerating, quiet and active. While you’re here, enjoy the local spirits at the Omni’s Whiskey & Rye or sip on the Billionaire Margarita at Reata’s rooftop bar.

Depart for the world-renowned **Cultural District**, where five internationally recognized museums are housed in a beautiful park-like setting: **National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame**, **Amon Carter Museum of American Art**, **Kimbell Art Museum**, **Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth**, and the **Fort Worth Museum of Science and History**. Acclaimed for their architecture, each museum maintains exquisite collections and programs.



DAY TWO

“Where the West Begins”



A visit to Fort Worth is incomplete without a stop in the **Stockyards National Historic District**. Celebrate the Old West by watching the **Fort Worth Herd** in the world’s only twice-daily cattle drive at 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m., followed by shopping for unique western keepsakes at **Stockyards Station**, custom-made boots at **M.L. Leddy’s** and the perfectly steamed cowboy hat at **Fincher’s White Western Front**.



Enjoy a hearty steak at **Hunter Brothers’ H3 Ranch**, famous barbecue at **Risky’s** or quality Tex-Mex at **Joe T. Garcia’s** for dinner. Buy a round at **Billy Bob’s Texas** - the world’s largest honky-tonk or the legendary **White Elephant Saloon**, and then catch the **Stockyards Championship Rodeo** every Friday and Saturday nights at 8 p.m. in the historic Cowtown Coliseum.
