GREATER FORT LAUDERDALE (BROWARD COUNTY) FLORIDA 2018 FACT SHEET

LOCATION & MILES:

Broward County encompasses 1,197 square miles (766,016 acres), with 23 miles of Atlantic Ocean beach, stretching between Palm Beach County on the northern perimeter and Dade County on the southern. It has a resident population of 1.9 million, with more than 168,800 residing in Fort Lauderdale, the largest municipality and the seat of county government. Broward County is bounded on the west by 505,600 acres of Everglades (occupying about 2/3 of the county). With 300+ miles of navigable inland waterways within Broward County, it has earned the nickname "Venice of America."

31 MUNICIPALITIES:

Oceanside: Dania Beach, Deerfield Beach, Fort Lauderdale, Hallandale Beach, Hillsboro Beach, Hollywood, Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, Lighthouse Point, Pompano Beach, Sea Ranch Lakes.

Inland: Coconut Creek, Cooper City, Coral Springs, Davie, Lauderdale Lakes, Lauderhill, Lazy Lake, Margate, Miramar, North Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Parkland, Pembroke Park, Pembroke Pines, Plantation, Southwest Ranches, Sunrise, Tamarac, West Park, Weston and Wilton Manors.

CLIMATE:

Broward's climate is tropical with an average year-round temperature of $76^{\circ}F$ / $25^{\circ}C$ and 3,000 hours of sunshine. Winter temperatures average a mean of 66° F / 19° C; summer, a mean of 84° F / 29° C. January is the coolest month of the year and August is the warmest. The heaviest rainfalls occur during August and September.

SPORTS:

Water Sports: There are more than 23 miles of beaches in Broward County that are perfect for sailing, swimming, kite surfing, windsurfing, water skiing, boating, deep-sea fishing, parasailing, paddleboarding, kayaking, wakeboarding, snorkeling and scuba diving.

Boating: The Atlantic Ocean and Intracoastal Waterway, along with more than 300 miles of canals and waterways throughout the County, are perfect for any kind of boating. There are several sailing schools throughout Broward plus 148 marinas and 35 boat repair yards that provide boat fuel as well as supplies.

Baseball: The Miami Marlins play at Marlins Park.

Fishing: This is one of the few areas in the world where both freshwater and salt water fishing are within 20 minutes of the angler. In addition to more than 200 freshwater species that can be caught in the county's lakes, there are deep water fishing fleets located in each of the seven cities that line the Atlantic coast, plus four municipal piers.

Football: The Miami Dolphins play at Hard Rock Stadium.

Golf: There are more than 56 courses in Broward ranging from the exclusive Grande Oaks Club to a par 3.

Hockey: The BB&T Center, home of the NHL Florida Panthers, located in Sunrise, Florida.

Tennis: There are more than 550 public and private tennis courts throughout Broward County.

Racing: Greyhound racing at Mardi Gras Casino; harness racing at the Isle Casino & Racing at Pompano Park; Jai-Alai at Dania Jai-Alai and thoroughbred racing at Gulfstream Park in Hallandale Beach.

Gaming: Broward hosts three Seminole Indian casinos, including the Hard Rock Casino. Located on tribal grounds in Hollywood and Coconut Creek, the halls are open seven days a week with games including blackjack, slots and poker beginning at noon and jackpots worth more than \$100,000. In addition, three area pari-mutuels (Isle, Mardi Gras and Gulfstream) offer slots and poker as well as racing.

ANNE KOLB NATURE CENTER -- a 1,430-acre wetland and habitat for native wildlife **B-CYCLE --** bike sharing program

BEACH PLACE -- a 100,000 square foot entertainment, retail and dining complex on A1A

BILLIE SWAMP SAFARI -- lets you experience a Seminole Indian reservation in the Everglades via swamp buggy and airboat

BASS PRO SHOPS OUTDOOR WORLD -- mega sporting goods store **BUTTERFLY WORLD at TRADEWINDS PARK** -- a three-acre park with a screened habitat to showcase live butterflies and hummingbirds from five different continents

EVERGLADES HOLIDAY PARK -- gateway to 750,000 acres of unspoiled Everglades; airboat rides, tours and fishing

FESTIVAL FLEA MARKET MALL -- over 800 shops plus Market Street **FLAMINGO GARDENS** -- offers free flight aviary museums, tram tours of orange groves, nature walks and gift shops

FORT LAUDERDALE ANTIQUE CAR MUSEUM -- permanent displays of pre-war Packard Motorcars and memorabilia

FUNDERDOME -- indoor, activity-based, family fun center

GOODYEAR BLIMP BASE -- one of only four bases in the world

HOLLYWOOD OCEANFRONT BROADWALK -- 2.2-mile oceanfront pedestrian promenade which parallels the beach

INTERNATIONAL GAME FISH ASSOCATION (IGFA) FISHING HALL OF FAME &

MUSEUM -- features galleries, marina and conservation center

LAS OLAS BOULEVARD -- bustles with energy day and night and is home to chic boutiques, galleries and eateries, also known as Greater Fort Lauderdale's 'Style Mile'

LAS OLAS RIVERFRONT -- an entertainment and retail complex on the New River

MAI-KAI POLYNESIAN RESTAURANT AND REVUE -- features Polynesian cuisine and exciting dinner show in authentically recreated village

RIVERWALK ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT -- a 22-block district along the New River in the heart of downtown Fort Lauderdale which runs from chic Las Olas Boulevard west to the Broward Center for the Performing Arts

SAWGRASS MILLS -- world's largest discount, outlet mall featuring more than 350 specialty stores and the Colonnade Outlets, an outdoor, high-end shopping district

SAWGRASS RECREATION PARK -- offers airboat rides, Indian village, live alligator, reptile and birds of prey exhibit plus camping, boating and fishing **SEA EXPERIENCE GLASS BOTTOM BOAT** -- offers scuba diving, snorkeling **SWAP SHOP** -- largest indoor/outdoor flea market in the South

XTREME ACTION PARK – the largest indoor entertainment venue in Florida, featuring go kart racing, escape rooms, bowling lanes, indoor ropes course

SIGHTSEEING TOURS:

CARRIE B SIGHTSEEING CRUISES -- offers seasonal sightseeing cruises **BALEARIA BAHAMAS EXPRESS** -- sails to Grand Bahama Island from Port Everglades

FORT LAUDERDALE TROLLEY TOUR -- 2-hour narrated, open-air tour **GONDOLA WEST** -- cruise through the heart of the "Venice of America" **JUNGLE QUEEN RIVERBOAT** -- offers old-time sightseeing cruise along the canals with dinner and entertainment

RIVERFRONT CRUISES -- offers sightseeing cruises aboard a 55-foot catamaran **SEGWAY FORT LAUDERDALE** – segway tours and jet ski rentals **TROPICAL SAILING** -- 2-hour ocean sightseeing and snorkeling cruises

WATER TAXI -- the perfect way to tour the Intracoastal or take a "Historic Cruise" of the New River

NATURAL ATTRACTIONS:

In addition to Blue Wave beaches and waterways, Broward County has 288 parks, 69 miles of live coral reef in a three-tier natural reef system, and the Everglades. Its 100+ artificial reefs and 18 major shipwrecks provide divers with a unique mix of tropical underwater experiences.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES:

Museums and Historic Sites

AFRICAN AMERICAN RESEARCH LIBRARY/CULTURAL CENTER -- the third of its kind in the nation to house extensive collections related to African, African-American and Caribbean heritage

AH-TAH-THI-KI MUSEUM -- Seminole heritage attraction

ART & CULTURAL CENTER OF HOLLYWOOD – offers contemporary gallery exhibitions, live stage performances and high-quality education programs for adults and children

BILLIE SWAMP SAFARI -- Everglades experience with airboat rides

BONNET HOUSE -- one of the few remaining ocean-front estates and historic estate with tropical gardens and an art museum

BROWARD ART GUILD – largest non-profit organization of working artists and supporters offering art classes and workshops

BUEHLER PLANETARIUM AND OBSERVATORY – 40-foot dome that allows visitors to view stars at night

CORAL SPRINGS MUSEUM OF ART -- focuses on highlighting present day, nationally recognized and Florida artists who create traditional, modern, postmodern and digital art

FLAMINGO GARDENS -- 60-acre wildlife sanctuary

FATVILLAGE -- located in the heart of downtown Fort Lauderdale, FATVillage (Flagler, Arts and Technology Village) acts as the hub for local creative businesses and artists and host a monthly ArtWalk event

FORT LAUDERDALE HISTORICAL SOCIETY -- preserves the history of Greater Fort Lauderdale through education, research and historical exhibits **HILLSBORO INLET LIGHT STATION** -- historic light marks the northern limit of the Florida Reef

INTERNATIONAL SWIMMING HALL OF FAME -- promotes the importance of swimming as a key to fitness, good health, quality of life, and the water safety of children through exhibits dedicated to the history, memory, and recognition of the famous swimmers, divers, water polo players, synchronized swimmers, open water swimmers and persons involved in life saving activities and education, throughout the world.

NSU MUSEUM OF ART FORT LAUDERDALE -- the 83,000 square-foot building contains 25,000 square feet of exhibition space, a 256-seat auditorium, Museum Store and Cafe. Its acclaimed 11,000 square-foot studio school, the AutoNation Academy of Art + Design, offers art instruction for children, teens and adults year-round

MUSEUM OF DISCOVERY AND SCIENCE/3D IMAX -- features guided tours, exhibits, IMAX movies and hosted family-friendly activities and camps for children

MY JEWISH DISCOVERY PLACE CHILDREN'S MUSEUM -- provides high quality cultural, educational, recreational, and social programs for children, adults, and seniors

OLD DILLARD MUSEUM -- the museum not only serves the African-American community in which it resides, but provides a valuable resource to historians and other visitors interested in Black history

STRANAHAN HOUSE -- Broward's oldest existing structure, now a historic house museum listed on the National Register of Historic Places
THIRD AVENUE ART DISTRICT -- a live/work environment of art and technology encompassing several studios for working artists
YOUNG AT ART MUSEUM -- hands-on children's museum

Libraries -- There are 28 libraries in Broward County including an eight-story, 260,000-square-foot main research and resource center in downtown Fort Lauderdale. It has earned architectural recognition for its unique design and was voted the #1 library in the United States in 1996. A \$14 million, 60,000 square foot *African America Research Library and Cultural Center* opened October 2002.

PERFORMING ARTS:

Theater --

ASHANTI CULTURAL ARTS -- this historic theater (renovated circa-1932 building) has housed great artists including Duke Ellington and Billie Holiday

BAILEY HALL -- features concerts and ballets **BB&T CENTER** -- features top named stars

BROWARD CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS -- state-of-the-art complex featuring two theatres

CORAL SPRINGS CENTER FOR THE ARTS -- features music, dance and concerts CINEMA PARADISO -- home to the Fort Lauderdale International Film Festival FORT LAUDERDALE CHILDREN'S THEATRE -- features classes and

performances for youth and adults

FORT LAUDERDALE IMPROV – features big names in comedy year-round as well as monthly contests and classes

HARD ROCK LIVE -- the 5,500-seat indoor arena regularly hosts top musical guests and major sporting events

HOLLYWOOD BEACH THEATER -- Hollywood's beachside theater hosts free performances

HOLLYWOOD CENTRAL PERFORMING ARTS CENTER -- this venue hosts family-friendly performances

MIRAMAR CULTURAL CENTER -- hosts community dance, music, and cultural arts performances

PARKER PLAYHOUSE -- pre-and post-Broadway productions

POMPANO BEACH AMPHITHEATER -- hosts a variety of cultural performances from free movie nights to symphonies

STAGE DOOR THEATRE -- the longest running non-profit theatre in South Florida

THEATRE UNDER THE STARS -- open-air bandshell in Hollywood; additionally, there are a number of neighborhood theaters located in Fort Lauderdale and Pompano Beach

SHOPPING:

Sawgrass Mills, the world's largest discount mall, features the high-end Colonnade Outlets. Other shopping destinations include Seminole Paradise, Festival Flea Market Mall and Fort Lauderdale Swap Shop, the largest indoor/outdoor flea market in the South. The Galleria at Fort Lauderdale, an upscale shopping mall with stores such as Neiman-Marcus, Michael Kors and Cole Haan, is complemented by traditional Florida shopping avenues such as Las Olas Boulevard, Dania Beach Antique Row and beach boutiques.

DINING AND ENTERTAINMENT:

More than 4,000 wining and dining establishments and 132 nightclubs are located in Broward County.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Broward offers more than 560 lodging establishments, with more than 34,000 hotel rooms, ranging from luxurious high-rises to smaller motels (many included in the **SUPERIOR SMALL LODGING** program, which sets standards of quality for properties of less than 50 rooms). The diverse mix of Greater Fort Lauderdale accommodations encompasses oceanfront and inland properties, specialized spa resorts, business, meeting, and convention facilities.

CONVENTION

The 600,000-square-foot **LEED Gold Certified BROWARD COUNTY CONVENTION CENTER**, at Port Everglades, is the centerpiece of a mixed-use retail complex spanning 33 acres.

ACCESSIBILITY:

International Airport: Broward County is served by the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport. The airport is just three miles from hotels, attractions, the beaches, and the Broward County Convention Center. Airlines include: Air Canada, Air Jamaica, Air Sunshine, Air Transat, AirTran, Allegiant Airlines, American Airlines, Avianca, Azul, Bahamasair, British Airways, CanJet, Caribbean Airlines, Condor, Continental, Continental Connection, Copa Airlines, Delta Airlines, Florida Coastal Airlines, Frontier, Gulfstream International, IBC Airways, JetBlue, LAN, Norwegian Air Shuttle, Silver Airways, SkyBahamas, Southwest, Spirit, Sun Air International, Sunwing, TAME, US Airways, Virgin America, Vision Airlines, Volaris and WestJet.

Executive Airports: Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport at the northwest corner of the city, and North Perry Airport, six miles west of Hollywood, and Pompano Beach Airpark, serve private and executive planes.

Cruise Ships: Port Everglades is the busiest cruise port in the world serving more five-star cruise ships than any other port in the nation. Nearly 50 cruise ships including the new genesis size ship *Oasis of the Seas* and *Allure of the Seas* depart from twelve ultra-modern terminals, including: Carnival, Celebrity Cruises' X, Cunard, Holland America Line, MSC Italian Cruises, P&O Cruises, Princess Cruises, Regent Seven Seas Cruises, Royal Caribbean International, Seabourn and Silversea.

BALEARIA BAHAMAS EXPRESS: offers day cruises to the Bahamas.

Train: Amtrak **Bus:** Greyhound

Rental Cars: Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport's Rental Car Centre has brought most of the major rental car companies under one roof. At more than 4 million square feet, the nine-level structure is the largest consolidated rental car facility in the United States and one of the largest parking garages in Florida. Levels 1 through 4 are the new home of Advantage Rent A Car, Alamo, Avis, Budget, Dollar, Enterprise, E-Z Rent A Car, Hertz, National, Payless, Royal and Thrifty. Levels 5 through 9 are public parking.

Local Transportation -- The Broward County Mass Transit bus system connects all municipalities and interconnects with Palm Beach and Dade Counties. Discounted weekly visitor passes for unlimited transportation are available. Taxis and limousine companies operate throughout the county; the Water Taxi system provides transportation to shops, attractions and restaurants. Brightline is a high-speed train service connecting downtown Fort Lauderdale to downtown Miami and downtown Palm Beach.
