ALABAMA CONSTITUTION VILLAGE • A living village commemorating Alabama's entry into the Union at the 1819 Constitutional Convention, 109 Gates Ave SW. 256-564-8100 or 800-678-1819.

BURRITT ON THE MOUNTAIN • Former home of physician Dr. William Burritt. Historic structures include log cabins, blacksmith shop, church and barnvard. Nature trails. Panoramic views, 3101 Burritt Drive, 256-536-2882.

CAMPUS NO. 805 • Retail, dining & entertainment venue featuring two craft breweries and green space. 2620 Clinton Avenue, 256-652-8055.

HARMONY PARK SAFARI • A federally-licensed nature preserve of free-ranging exotic and endangered animals. Remain in your car on a route to see antelope, buffalo, camel, ostriches, crocodiles, 431 Clouds Cove, 256-723-3880.

HARRISON BROTHERS HARDWARE • Established in 1879, Alabama's oldest operating hardware store is operated by the Historic Huntsville Foundation. Nostalgic items displayed and sold. 124 South Side Square. 256-536-3631.

HISTORIC DISTRICTS • Twickenham district south and east of the Courthouse Square boasts the state's largest concentration of antebellum homes, dating from 1814. Old Town District features Federal and Victorian homes. Five Points contains many bungalows. The railroad runs through Historic Downtown Madison.

HISTORIC HUNTSVILLE DEPOT • Limited guided tours of the restored 1860 passenger depot. Civil War exhibits as well as period locomotives and other vehicles are featured. 320 Church Street, 256-564-8100 or 1-800-678-1819.

HUNTSVILLE BOTANICAL GARDEN • The 120-acre garden features gardens of roses, herbs, ferns, daylilies and aquatic plants. Nature trails. The Butterfly House is open seasonally. 4747 Bob Wallace Avenue, 256-830-4447.

HUNTSVILLE MUSEUM OF ART • The museum in Big Spring Park has a growing collection of prints, paintings and sculptures. Galleries feature touring exhibits and the museum's permanent collection. 300 Church Street. 256-535-4350.

LOWRY HOUSE • An 1850s fully restored home on the National Register of Historic Homes. 1205 Kildare Street. 256-489-9200.

LOWE MILL ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT • America's largest privately-owned arts center, home to 200+ artists and makers in 131 working studios and several North Alabama premiere events. Wednesday-Saturday, 2211 Seminole Drive, 256-533-0399.

A.M. BOOTH'S LUMBERYARD KITCHEN • Kitchen houses restaurant, The Kiln Bar, veranda, patio & courtyard with games & twinkling lights. 108 Cleveland Street. 256-715-7130.

MAPLE HILL CEMETERY • The citv's historic cemetery dates from 1822 and contains the graves of five governors, Civil War soldiers and many civic leaders. East of California Street.

MERRIMACK HALL PERFORMING ARTS CENTER •

Includes a 300-seat performance hall, a 3,000 sq. ft. dance studio and rehearsal space, 3320 Triana Boulevard, 256-534-6455.

NORTH ALABAMA RAILROAD MUSEUM • Includes a restored depot and walk-through passenger train. Ride the Mercury & Chase Railroad. 694 Chase Road. 256-851-6276.

STATE BLACK ARCHIVES/MUSEUM • Chronicles African American achievements, the famed Buffalo Soldiers and St. Bartlev Church. the state's oldest black church. Alabama A&M campus. 256-372-5846.

U.S. SPACE & ROCKET CENTER • America's largest rocket collection plus Apollo spacecraft. Space Shuttle replica, flight simulators and Space Camp. IMAX® theater. I-565 exit 15. One Tranquility Base, 256-837-3400 or 800-637-7223.

U.S. VETERANS MEMORIAL MUSEUM • Displays more than 30 historical military vehicles from World War I to the present. as well as tableaus, artifacts and other memorabilia dating back to the Revolutionary War. 2060-A Airport Road. 256-883-3737.

VON BRAUN CENTER • Multi-purpose entertainment. convention and sports complex. Center contains an 10,000seat arena, concert hall, playhouse, banquet hall and 170,000 square feet of exhibit space. 700 Monroe Street. 256-533-1953.

WEEDEN HOUSE MUSEUM • Located in the Twickenham Historic District, the 1819 Federal house was the birthplace of 19th century artist and poet Maria Howard Weeden. 300 Gates Avenue, 256-536-7718.

PARKS & RECREATION

BIG SPRING INTERNATIONAL PARK • Located in the heart of Huntsville. Big Spring is the site where pioneer John Hunt built a cabin in 1805. The park contains gifts donated by foreign countries. Panoply Arts Festival is held here.

BRAHAN SPRING PARK • City park containing volleyball courts, baseball fields, frisbee golf course, horseshoe pitching pits, playgrounds, picnic areas and lagoons for fishing. Indoor Olympic-size pool. Drake Avenue west of Memorial Parkway.

CROSS COUNTRY RUNNING PARK • This well-marked cross country course follows a grassy path for a two-mile or three-mile loop between the old airport runway and golf course. John Hunt Park on Airport Road off U.S. 231 S.

DITTO LANDING MARINA • Situated along the Tennessee River with full boating facilities, storage, docks, picnic tables & pavilions, campsites, lighted tennis courts, softball diamond and playground. From South Memorial Parkway, turn east on Hobbs Island Road and right on Ditto Landing Road. 256-882-1057.

DUBLIN PARK RECREATION CENTER • Located in Madison. the 60-acre park includes swimming pools, gymnasium with walking track, outdoor walking trail, soccer fields, playground and tennis courts, 8324 Old Madison Pike, Madison, 256-772-9300.

MADISON COUNTY LAKE • A state-owned public lake on 105 acres. Boat rentals, fishing licenses and permits are available. Located on County Lake Road near Gurley, 256-776-4905.

MONTE SANO STATE PARK • The 2,000-acre park, offers 14 rustic rental cabins, hiking/walking trails, picnic and playground facilities, RV hook-ups, primitive camping sites, electricity and water, 5105 Nolen Avenue, 256-534-3757.

NATURE TRAIL • Located on Green Mountain 12 miles from downtown Huntsville. The 72-acre Nature Trail has wooded paths, a 16-acre lake, picnic pavilion and picnic area, chapel, a covered bridge, wildlife sanctuary, 2 miles of trail and a Braille Trail. South Shawdee Road, 256-883-9501.
