## Bentonville Battlefield

As a National Historic Landmark, Bentonville Battlefield was the site of the largest Civil War Battlefield in the state, fought on March 19-21, 1865. Tour the Harper House (c.1850's) which functioned as a Union Field Hospital during the battle. Motorcoach buses may drive throughout the rural area and stop at several Civil War Trail driving pull-offs, and walk the confederate cemetery and union earthworks trails. The museum and visitor center offers displays and interprets many artifacts from the three-day battle. Gift shop on site featuring various items. Admission: free.
