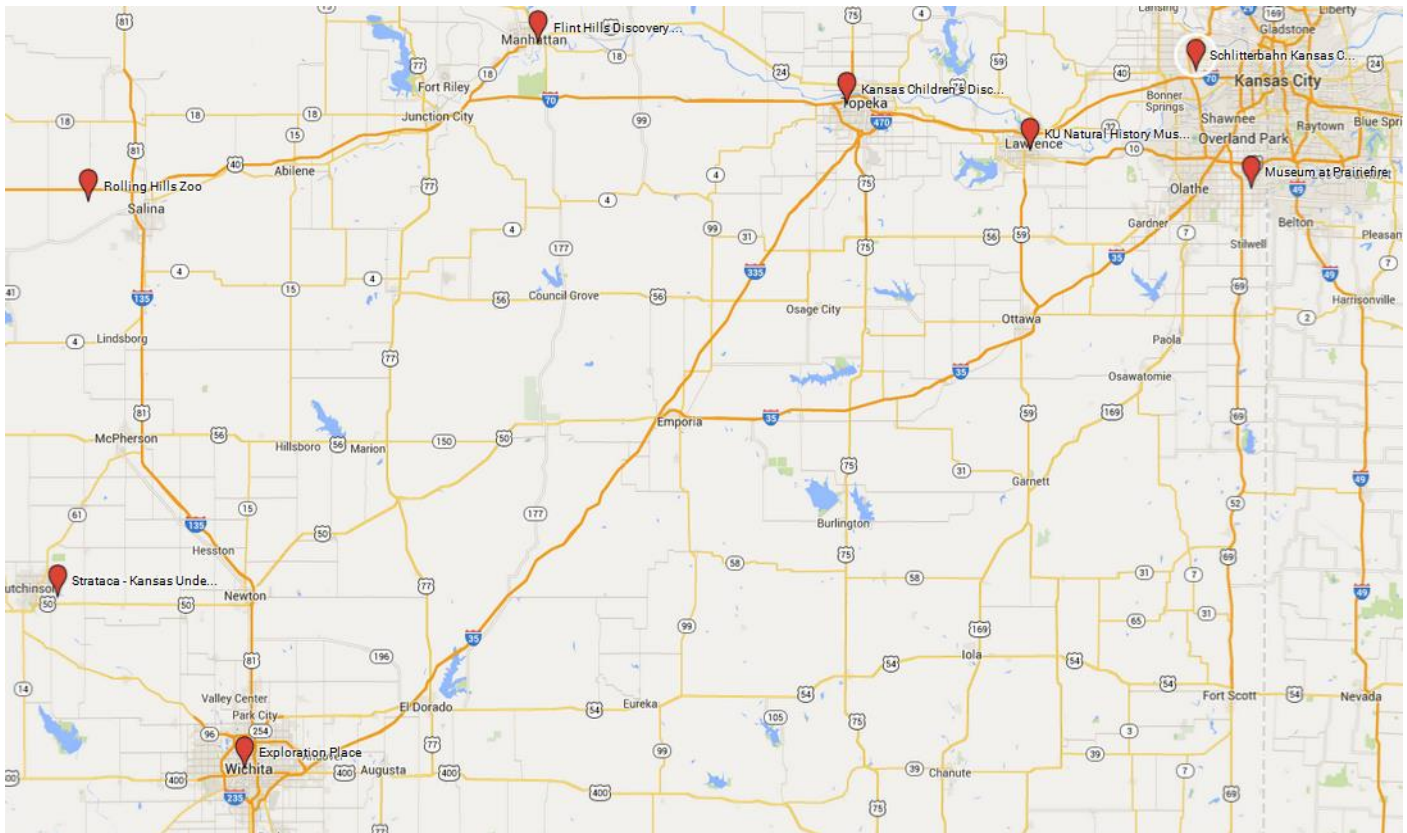




Family Fun Yellow Brick Road Trip
