



Car Week Fact Sheet

CAR WEEK 2017:

- For 2017, the Monterey County Convention and Visitors Bureau (MCCVB) in partnership with community representatives has compiled “Your Guide to Navigating Car Week 2017.” The guide includes the various event locations, road closures, shuttle information and traffic tips to help inform residents as well as visitors and encourage them to plan ahead. The MCCVB has also created an interactive map on the SeeMonterey.com website which has little red cars mapped out displaying locations of Car Week events throughout the Monterey Peninsula. Also, when you click on a car, it displays the information included in the guide. You can navigate the map on a desktop or mobile device.

- The MCCVB worked with several partners to create this comprehensive Guide. Those partners include representatives from Cannery Row Company, Carmel Chamber of Commerce, Carmel-by-the-Sea HID, City of Carmel-by-the-Sea, City of Monterey, City of Seaside, County of Monterey, Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca, Monterey-Salinas Transit, Pacific Grove Chamber of Commerce, Pebble Beach Concours, Pebble Beach Resorts, Quail Lodge & Golf Club and the Transportation Agency for Monterey County.
- The MCCVB kindly requests that the media share this information with the public in advance in an effort to help ease traffic and assist visitors when traveling.

FINDINGS FROM 2014 MCCVB CAR WEEK SURVEY:

- Based on a survey conducted in 2014, Car Week attracts 85,000 visitors to Monterey County that spend \$53.5 million locally. The survey also shows that \$4.8 million in taxes are generated, which is a positive economic benefit to Monterey County.
- 57% of survey respondents attending Car Week events live outside of the Monterey County area. On average, attendees stayed 4.4 nights in the county. More than 36,200 hotel room nights were sold in Monterey County during Car Week.

- Car Week attendees who live outside Monterey County spent an average of \$687.93 per day while in Monterey. The largest share of this spending went to overnight accommodations (\$178.83), followed by restaurants and dining (\$152.34), and entertainment and sightseeing (\$98.87). During Car Week, visitors spent \$13.3 million in lodging and \$11.3 million at local restaurants.

CAR WEEK CHARITY BENEFITS:

- The 2016 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance raised more than \$1.7 million and supported over 80 local charitable organizations through the Pebble Beach Company Foundation. That money came in via enthusiasts from around the world, and the funds were distributed locally in Monterey County. Several charities including Boys & Girls Clubs of Monterey Country, Natividad Medical Foundation, Kinship Center, Animal Friends Rescue Project and Montage Health benefited directly from the Opportunity Drawings.
- Pebble Beach also offered some of the infrastructure that was put up for the events to double as space for charity fundraisers. For example, the tent for Club d'Elegance was used to host the Annual AIM for the Cures Dinner benefitting AIM for Mental Health.
- Some key participants, notably Jay Leno, have auctioned off personal items during the Concours to raise additional funds for local charities. From the show ramp, Jay has auctioned garage tours, raising more than \$500,000 for local charities, most notably the Boys & Girls Clubs of Monterey County.
