# Here are the top ways to truly experience Myrtle Beach's craft brew scene

## **Piggly Wiggly at The Market Common**

Simply put, this is the best beer selection along the Grand Strand. There's a six-tap growler station and over <u>600 different</u> <u>craft beers</u> are available year-round.

## **New South Brewery**

Myrtle Beach's own microbrewery began in 1998, brewing fresh ales and lagers for local restaurants. Today, they can their beer to sell in regional grocery stores. Schedule a free tour and tasting to learn more about these local brews.

## **Bumsteads Pub**

A neighborhood bar with the look and feel of a traditional Irish pub, this local favorite has more than 150 imported and domestic beers available. Finish them all in the span of a <u>year</u>, and get your name on their wall.

## **Gordon Biersch Brewery and Restaurant**

A wonderful menu is complimented by the beers brewed in-house. Their hefeweizen and sommer brau are very popular.

## The Crafty Rooster

Worth the drive to the heart of downtown Conway. They have 14 taps of <u>craft beer</u> in this Coastal Carolina-themed sports bar. A new craft keg is tapped every Tuesday.

#### **Fire and Smoke Gastropub**

Those looking for something beyond the traditional bar have a new place to visit in the Myrtle Beach area. The <u>Fire and Smoke Gastropub</u> offers high-end beers, bourbons and cocktails to patrons. Plus, the chefs smoke cheeses, proteins and can even smoke your beverages!

## The Homebrewer's Pantry

Want to give beer-making at home the ol' college try? This new <u>store</u> in Conway offers homebrew ingredients and equipment for making beer, wine, mead, cider and soda. Classes will also be starting soon.

## La Belle Amie Vineyard

Whether you prefer a bottle of red, or a bottle of white, you're sure to enjoy many great samples at the Myrtle Beach Wine Fest, held each October at The Market Common. The event, which is returning for its sixth year in 2015, also features "A Taste of The Market Common."

## **Brew At The Zoo**

Brookgreen Gardens' annual fall craft beer tasting returns every September. It features more than 30 regional and national selections, as well as offering participants the rare opportunity to see many of the exhibits at Brookgreen's Lowcountry Zoo at night.
