



Sacramento Community Theater is located in the heart of the Downtown Entertainment District.



The Memorial Auditorium is a crown jewel of Sacramento, and is a registered historic landmark and an award winner of "Protecting America's Treasure."


The Memorial Auditorium was dedicated as a memorial and tribute to our city residents who gave their lives in service to our country.


