

SACRAMENTO CONVENTION PACKAGE

CONVENIENCE

What attendees appreciate most about Sacramento is convenience. The Sacramento Convention Center is situated in the vibrant downtown and Midtown districts, where restaurants, live music, theater, nightclubs, pubs, museums and galleries abound.

HOTELS

Two major convention hotels, the Sheraton Grand and the Hyatt Regency with a combined 1,008 rooms are steps away from the center, while another 1,000 downtown rooms are within walking distance. Of the region's 16,000 total hotel rooms, some 4,000 are within a three-mile radius of the convention center.

CONVENTION CENTER COMPLEX


The Sacramento Convention Center Complex is composed of three facilities: The convention center, Memorial Auditorium and the Sacramento Community Theater. The convention center is by far the largest, with 384,000 square feet of event space encompassing 137,500 square feet of dedicated exhibit space, 31 meeting rooms and a 24,000 square-foot ballroom.

MEMORIAL AUDITORIUM

Just across the street, Memorial Auditorium is a 3,849-seat, architecturally distinguished venue dating to 1927 and featuring elaborate detailing and lighting. A favorite space for banquets, conferences, graduation ceremonies, lectures and musical performances, it also features a hydraulic floor and 272-seat "little theater" for intimate gatherings.

RECREATION




