Every weekend, April-September, ride behind a steam locomotive on the museum's Sacramento Southern Railroad that parallels the Sacramento River.



Crocker Art Museum

In 1869, Judge Edwin B. and Margaret Crocker assembled a collection of more than 700 paintings and 1,300 master drawings during their family's 1869-71 trip to Europe. Following this sojourn, the Crockers acquired numerous paintings by contemporary Californian artists, forming the core of a California collection that has evolved until the present day and is now considered one of the finest in the United States.



Sutter's Fort

In the heart of Midtown Sacramento, Sutter's Fort State Historic Park captures the pioneer spirit of families arriving in wagon trains at the dawn of the California Gold Rush. John Sutter built the fort and his agricultural empire, and he was critical in the rescue of the tragic Donner Party and served as a diplomat with the Mexican government until it all came crashing down in 1848.

Leland Stanford Mansion

Originally built in 1856 by Gold Rush merchant Sheldon Fogus, the Mansion was later purchased and remodeled (twice!) by Leland and Jane Stanford. Leland Stanford served as Governor of California from 1862-1863. The Mansion served as the office of three governors during the turbulent 1860's - Leland Stanford, Fredrick Low and Henry Haight.
