The team roping competition was just one of many equestrian-related events held at the facility during first quarter. From the **Hearth Performance Horses** held two events during the quarter and **Alta Hills Farm** booked the facility for five days in March. The **USWRCA District 1** held a meeting, as well. New Rates and Monthly Flex Pass Coming in April

The Salt Lake County Council approved new rates at the Equestrian Park that will go into effect April 1st. Added to the mix is a monthly Flex Pass that will save riders the most money if a pass is purchased on an annual, rather than a monthly basis. It is structured on a sliding scale that incrementally lowers the monthly cost based on the number of consecutively-purchased months.

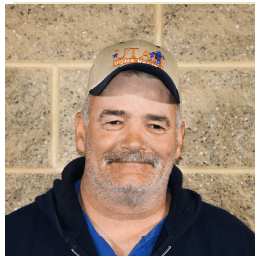

Big Equipment Coming to the Equestrian Park This Year and Next

A Request for Proposals (RFP) has been issued by Salt Lake County to acquire a new forklift for the Equestrian Park. This piece of equipment will be used in a variety of ways, to prep for various events and to assist regular patrons of the Park.

The County is in negotiation with its Fleet Board to acquire a dump truck and water truck out of its pool of “cascade” vehicles for use at the Equestrian Park. The used dump truck is scheduled to arrive in 2019. The availability of the water truck is still being discussed.

All of this equipment will help increase efficiencies at the Park and provide better customer service.

BOND MONEY PROJECTS

STORM DRAIN : All of the maintenance work on the existing storm drains throughout the Park has been completed. Salt Lake County Public Works is scheduled to re-grade the entire property by the end of April. The expanded storm drain installation projects are slated to be completed by the end of this year.

RV PARKING: The storm drain project has to be completed before further design work can move forward for the RV parking area.

PROJECT PENDING: The removal and replacement of metal stalls in the 400 – 600 barns awaits the completion of the gutter and downspout project. Cost of the material has been submitted and the project has been approved. Schedule TBD.

REMODEL/REPLACEMENT OF BARN A—D : Various pricing options for this project are now being developed by the architect. The Park Advisory Board will likely review these in May.



Capital Project Update

The **arena and racetrack footing** project continues with an RFP expected to be issued around the first of May. The successful bidder will amend the soil, making the footing safer for horses and riders.

A request for bids has been generated through the County's Contracts and Procurement for upgrading the livestock panels that are used during events at the facility. With this additional equipment, the Park will have the ability to run several events concurrently.



Park Adds New Front Loader to Its Equipment Inventory

Park staff was excited to take delivery of the new CAT front loader. This piece of heavy equipment will increase efficiencies at the Park, easily moving soil into and out of the Event Center for such events as the Rad Canyon BMX competitions. Outside, it will be used for emptying the manure bins, digging trenches to aid in drainage, landscaping and helping with road maintenance. Staff training took place the first week of January, so several employees will be able to operate the loader.



Park Takes Delivery of New Gators

The John Deere gators that you see spinning around the Park are replaced every year with new models as part of a contractual agreement with a vendor that also holds the maintenance contract. This arrangement is economically beneficial to the Park.

New Rates at Equestrian Park Effective April 1st

The Equestrian Park Advisory Board worked with SMG, community stakeholders, and the Community Services Department to identify rates that will provide greater flexibility and customer service to park users. Rates for youth are modeled on rates used in Parks & Recreation.
