The 4-H, along with open class participants, provided a great display of chickens, rabbits, pigeons and other small animals in the Event Center. Outside, there was plenty of action with Joe Diffie's concert, the monster truck show, barrel racing, horse pulling competitions, carnival and midway. There was entertainment throughout the Park, as well as lots of food options.

The Fair received local media coverage, including a spot on Channel 2's morning show featuring the "Best of Show" hog.

Park Bond Dollars Will Bring Major Improvements to Park

Five million dollars has been earmarked for improving buildings, grounds and infrastructure at the Equestrian Park. Here is a list of

projects under consideration:

Storm Drain Additional Phase/Repair— This project has been discussed with Salt Lake County project managers and facility staff. The County is in the process of assessing the facility infrastructure and will make suggestions based upon their findings.

Remodel/Replacement of Barns A – **D** – This project is in the discussion phase with the Advisory Board. A sub-committee has presented suggestions, but no final decisions have been made.

Panels in Five Arenas/Panel Upgrades – Information continues to be gathered to determine the exact needs at the Park. Facility staff is working with Salt Lake County project managers in drafting a Request for Proposals (RFP) for this project.

Trailer Parking – The scope of this project is being assessed and it may be integrated into the RV Parking project.

Restroom/Shower Facilities – This project is being assessed.

Arena Footing – This project is moving forward with the gathering of information pertaining to facility needs. Facility staff are working with Salt Lake County project managers in drafting an RFP.

This ancient sport includes acrobatic displays performed on cantoring horses. Third quarter bookings also featured many local club nights, including 4-H, Barrel Buddies (x4), Silver Spurs Riding Club, Utah Mounted Thunder, 7-11 Riding Club (x2) and Utah Barrel Racing Association (x4).

The Utah Paint Horse Club hosted an event over Labor Day Weekend, booking 236 stall nights. Other events included the Utah All Breeds Horse Association (x2), Utah Arabian Horse Club, Wasatch Horse Show Association, Los Reyes Del Carill Match Racing, Utah Heavy Athletics Club (x2) 4-H Horse Show and Linda Parelli Master Class. Meetings included: Salt Lake County Fair Livestock, USWRCA District 1 and the Utah Pheasant Society.

The Park hosted 12 **Match Races**, with horses from multiple states, on Saturday, September 23, on the Laurel Brown Racetrack. The weather was crisp and clear with the grandstands full of eager spectators. Jockeys were flown in to pilot these magnificent animals. The pole position was modified depending upon the nature of the race. The track was slightly muddy in the morning, but became faster as the day progressed.
