Park Adds New Front Loader to Its Equipment Inventory

Park staff was excited to take delivery recently of the new CAT front loader. This piece of heavy equipment will increase efficiencies at the Park, easily moving soil into and out of the Event Center for such events as the Rad Canyon BMX competitions. Outside, it will be used for emptying the manure bins, digging trenches to aid in drainage, landscaping and helping with road maintenance. Staff training took place the first week of January, so several employees will be able to operate the loader.



Storm Drain Project Receives Bond Money

Park personnel have started to

areas, and the removal of debris,
will allow for water run-off to pass
through the system and drain
without interruption. There is

Capital Projects Update




The **asphalt facelift** for the parking lot in front of the Events Center was completed this fall. The project also included paving the access road to the outdoor arenas.

Other Capital Improvement and Bond-Financed Projects

- •Remodel/Replacement of Barns A D —This project is still being discussed by the Park Advisory Board. A sub-committee has presented suggestions, but no final decision has been made.
- •Trailer Parking The scope of this project is being assessed and it may be integrated into the RV Parking Project.
- Arena Footing This project continues to move forward. Facility staff is working with Salt Lake County project managers in drafting an RFP. Footing samples have been sent out for analysis.
