

Airport Increased Number of Passengers by 8.4% in 2014

The Shreveport Regional Airport (SHV) reported an increased number of passengers traveling to and from Shreveport-Bossier with more than 600,000 people coming through SHV in 2014. These were the highest numbers Shreveport Regional Airport has seen growth for of passengers since several years well above most airports across the 2006 and an increase nation. of 8.4 percent over



The number of passengers flying in and out of SHV totaled 636,914 in 2014, an increase of 49,683 passengers compared to 2013 totals. In July, Delta Air Lines launched first class

service with the Boeing 717 aircraft between Shreveport and Atlanta. In August, American Airlines also launched first class service between Shreveport and Dallas on their Bombardier CRJ700 aircraft. Both first class options are currently scheduled

to remain in the market in 2015. In addition, United Airlines' non-stop Denver service has continued to increase passenger volume since the daily flight began in August 2012.

"We are continuing to work diligently with our airline partners for additional flights, larger aircraft and new routes but we need the community's continued support to keep this momentum moving forward," said Bill Cooksey, interim director of airports.
