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Shreveport-Bossier MARDI GRAS HISTORY

Shreveport-Bossier throws the best family-friendly Mardi Gras in the world! Mardi Gras came to northwest Louisiana in 1989 when the Krewe of Gemini was founded. The Krewe of Centaur soon followed in


1991. Today, Shreveport-Bossier is home to 15 krewes, each with its own personality. Mardi Gras float-riders toss more than eight million beads each year to seas of people waving their arms and shouting, "Throw me something, mister!" The parades attract as many as 400,000 visitors a year. From grand bals to Cajun food and dazzling parades, there's a way for everyone to celebrate Mardi Gras in Shreveport-Bossier!

KREWE OF CENTAUR & KREWE OF GEMINI PARADES

- Clyde Fant Parkway between East Preston Avenue and Milam Street closes to traffic at 7 p.m. on evenings prior to parades and reopens at 7 a.m. on parade day.
- Premium parade-watching spots will fill up quickly. Plan ahead and arrive early for the best spot on the parade route.
- See the parade route map in the back of this guide for great parade-watching spots.
- Alcoholic beverages are allowed at the Krewe of Centaur and Krewe of Gemini parades, but no glass containers are allowed. Alcohol is not allowed in the family-friendly zone on Clyde Fant Parkway.
- Port-a-potties will be available for public use along the parade route.
- On parade days, all roads on the parade route close at 3:30 p.m.
- Parking is free in downtown Shreveport after 5 p.m. on Fridays and all day on weekends.

ALL MARDI GRAS PARADES



- Dress appropriately, as temperatures can change quickly during parade season.
- Bring lawn chairs and/or blankets to sit on while waiting for the parade.
- Bring empty sacks for beads and throws.
- Bring hand wipes and sanitizer.
- Bring snacks and drinks to enjoy throughout the day.
- Bring cash if you want to purchase toys and souvenirs from the push carts that go up and down the parade routes.



Local Bakeries Go KING CAKE

Remember when the most unusual thing you'd expect to find inside of a king cake was a tiny, plastic baby? These days, bakeries in Shreveport-Bossier are filling king cakes with everything from boudin sausage and cane syrup to peaches and cream.

Sopan Tike, co-owner and baker at Lilah's Bakery, has decided to double down on unusual king cakes. In addition to their regular flavors, Lilah's Bakery will produce a limited edition "flavor of the week" cake each week during Mardi Gras season. Planned flavors include red velvet, bananas Foster and piña colada.

"My wife thought that we should do something different this year," Tike said. "She likes to make something different, all of the time." The Tike's six-year-old

son even got in on the action, helping to concoct the lemon berry and cream flavor.

The flavors of king cake are also being worked into non-cake creations. There are king cake scones at Rhino Coffee Downtown, king cake cupcakes at Buttercups Cupcakes, king cake martinis at 2Johns Steak and Seafood, and more. There's even a "king cake" made out of two dozen tacos at El Bazar Mexicano #2, a popular local taqueria.

"I'd seen a heart made out of tacos for Valentine's Day on Facebook, so I figured, 'let's do a Mardi Gras taco king cake,'" says Kathy Rico, co-owner of El Bazar Mexicano #2.

Whatever kind of king cake you're craving, chances are good that you can find it in Shreveport-Bossier's bakeries, restaurants, bars and coffee shops.
