Wildwood Conservation Area has approximately 30 km of trails, including a 24-km loop route around Wildwood Resevoir. The loop is mostly single track trails with some double track on the north side of the lake trail. If you're riding with younger kids, explore the Green and Red trails located close to the trailhead. If you're an experienced rider and looking for more of a challenge, ride the entire Lake Trail loop and take both of the Black Diamond trail offshoots, Lake Trail is a directional loop meaning that on even-days it rides clockwise and on odd-days, counter-clockwise.

Trails: 6 kid-friendly trails as well as Easy to Advanced trails.

Parking: Parking available at the conservation area. Cyclists must enter via the trailhead located at the gatehouse.

Hours of Operation: Dawn to dusk, year round (including winter fat biking).

Fees: \$6 adult trail pass required per day. Season passes available.

Onsite conveniences: Washrooms, drinking water, bike wash station, bike maintenance and repair station, BBQ stations, volleyball courts, geocaching and beach access and camping.
