HISTORIC HILLSBOROUGH TOUR

Experience America's history through the unique perspective of one of NC's oldest and historically significant small towns, with a guided walking tour of downtown Hillsborough. Established in 1754 as the seat of government for Orange County, Hillsborough's colonial legacy and signs of its importance in NC and American history can be seen everywhere. The tour begins at a late eighteenth century Quaker farmhouse known as the "Alexander Dickson House", which once served as the headquarters of Confederate General Joseph E. Johnston in the closing days of the Civil War. The house now serves as Hillsborough's Visitors Center and the offices of the Alliance for Historic Hillsborough. Only marked graves are decorated. Local scouts assist. It takes about 30 minutes to decorate all 500+ graves. At 8am the VFW holds a Memorial Day cemetery service. The origins of the holiday are shared and locally interred veterans are honored. Taps signals the end of the service and honors the dead. The service is open to the public.
