ABOUT THIS MEDIA TOUR MENU

This comprehensive media kit serves as a guide for pre-approved media guests to preview our region's top attractions in greater detail and easily identify those who participate in our **Media Pass Program**. Our Public Relations Department can arrange for Media Passes at most locations and assist with itineraries as needed.

TELL ME WHAT THE TAGS MEAN

Each attraction or experience in this Media Tour Menu is tagged with the following terms:

MEDIA PASS: This tag denotes a location or experience that offers complimentary Media Passes that are coordinated directly through Visit Hershey & Harrisburg. Media Passes and/or Vouchers are redeemed by media guest at these locations by presenting valid ID at the ticket office or will-call windows. If Media Passes are not provided upon check-in at any location you've preselected with this tag, we guarantee to reimburse you for the cost of the tickets you are required to purchase with a copy of your receipt.

HARD TICKETS: This tag denotes a physical ticket or voucher is required. Those will be issued to media guests in advance by the bureau. You typically receive these Hard Tickets upon check-in at your hotel and these tickets cannot be replaced by the bureau if lost or misplaced by the media guest.

MEDIA REFERRAL: This tag denotes businesses that will require direct correspondence with pre-approved media guests to request complimentary passes, discounted rates, or additional arrangements. We will connect you with these locations and provide them with a copy of your Media Visit Pre-Approval Form. Any complimentary provisions or services are then provided at the sole discretion of these businesses based upon independent review and evaluation of your pre-approval form.

ON YOUR OWN: This tag includes dining and experiences that may not require admission or are not coordinated through the visitors bureau. These options require additional planning, reservations, or costs which are the sole responsibility of the media guest. During peak spring & summer seasons it is highly recommended to make all dining reservations well in advance.

SEASONAL: Some experiences listed in this Menu may not be available during the dates of your visit due to seasonality, weather conditions, etc. The media should confirm dates of operation and seasonal times, which may vary, prior to arriving at those locations.

HARRISBURG

Overview: Harrisburg, the Capital of Pennsylvania, was once inhabited by Native Americans as early as 3000 BC. Known as Peixtin, the area was an important trading post for Native American traders, as trails leading from the Delaware to the Ohio Rivers, and from the Potomac to the Upper Susquehanna intersected there. The primary natural feature of the city is the Susquehanna River, 464 miles (747 km) long and is today the longest river on the US East Coast. With its watershed, the river is the 16th-largest river in the United States, and the longest river in the continental United States without commercial boat traffic today. In the Canal Era, navigation improvements were made to enhance the river for barge shipping of bulk goods by water on the Pennsylvania Canal.

As one of the largest museums in the world dedicated solely to the American Civil war, the NCWM is unique in its approach of telling a complete story of this most troubled chapter in American history from the social, political, and personal perspectives of the day.

This nationally recognized museum, one of only eight museums in Pennsylvania currently affiliated with the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C., strives to preserve the history of the American Civil War and inspire lifelong learning.

Since opening in 2001, its mission has been to serve as the destination of choice for students, families and historians who seek to experience and research the culture and history of the American Civil War.

The NCWM attracts over 40,000 visitors annually and has welcomed guests from all 50 states and 27 countries to tour the museum.

This National Historic Landmark is the most recognizable feature of the Harrisburg skyline.

Dedicated in 1906 at the cost of \$13 million the Capitol was designed to be a Palace of Art with 475 rooms, four floors, a mezzanine, and a basement.

The massive bronze doors of the capitol entrance lead visitors into the first-floor main rotunda highlighted with a grand imperial staircase similar to the one in the famous [Palais Garnier](#) (Paris Opera House) in Paris, France.

Free 30-minute guided tours daily reveal the stunning artwork, craftsmanship, and various Renaissance designs capped by a spectacular dome that is a 1/3 scale replica of the one on St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Pay particular attention on the tour to the paintings in the Supreme Court Chamber by [Violet Oakley](#), the first American woman to receive a public mural commission.

MUST SEE: Art beyond the Capitol Complex. Walk among elaborate bronze sculptures, stunning murals and decorative sconces inside the Finance Building. While regarded as one of the finest structures of its time, it is often overshadowed by the neighboring Capitol Complex, designed to be a "Palace of Art."

Take a moment in time with the largest epic Civil War battle scene ever painted on a single canvas from 1870 entitled "Battle of Gettysburg: Pickett's Charge" found in the permanent exhibit "Objects of Valor: Commemorating the Civil War in PA."

Cruise the Susquehanna River on one of the last remaining authentic stern-driven paddle-wheel riverboats in America.

The Pride of the Susquehanna Riverboat was built in 1988 to beautify and enrich the Hershey Harrisburg Region.

Today the Pride offers public scenic tours of the Harrisburg skyline from both the lower and upper deck and is available for private events.

The riverboat also offers themed cruises, including Murder Mystery Dinner Cruises, family-themed Pirates on the Pride adventure rides, live-music Blues Cruises, Jazzin' on the Pride, Moonlight Party Cruises, and River School Education.

City Island Complex (30 min – 1 hr) – ON YOUR OWN

This 63-acre island complex once contained archeological treasures of the Susquehannocks and Iroquois tribes which established seasonal settlements here.

The island also served as a stopping off-point for Union soldiers during the Civil War as they crossed over the Camelback Bridge to defend Harrisburg from the threat of invasion by the Confederate Army.

Today visitors & locals enjoy the island's recreational offerings including FNB Park, home to The Harrisburg Senators Double-A Minor League Baseball affiliate of the Washington Nationals.

The island also houses a minor-league soccer field, riverside mini-golf course, a scaled-down version of a Civil War-era steam train, batting cages, and the boat dock for the Pride of the Susquehanna Riverboat.

[Story](#): Historic Broad Street Market Attracts New Wave of Pop-Culture & Cool to Harrisburg’s Midtown District

Founded in 1860 and used to feed the civil war troops training at nearby Camp Curtain, this market today serves as the hub of Harrisburg’s Midtown District with 40 vendors offering locally grown and organic produce, meats, baked goods, and freshly prepared meals.

The Broad Street Market is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is one of the oldest continuously operated market houses in the country.

Market managers work to preserve the historic legacy and cultural diversity of the market through educational food events and a new local farmer program.

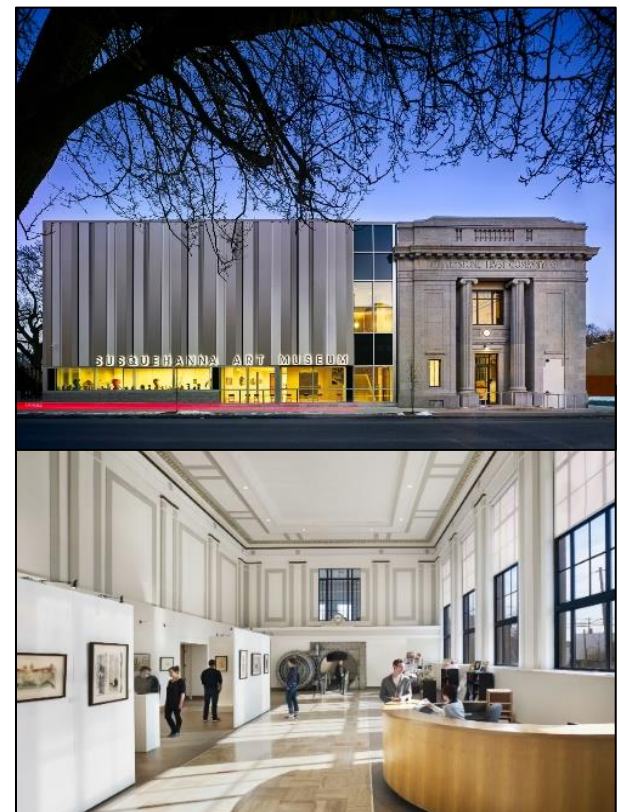

The Susquehanna Art Museum (SAM) relocated in 2015 to the newly refurbished and expanded 20,000 square-foot Keystone Trust Building in the Midtown District featuring a restored 1923 bank vault, 27-foot-high ceilings and marble floors. The galleries feature the artworks of nationally and internationally recognized artists as well as spotlighting the works of regional artists annually.

When the museum’s new \$12 million home re-opened, it marked the first new cultural arts facility to open in Harrisburg since the Whitaker Center in 1999.

SAM: Central PA’s only dedicated art museum. Mounting exhibitions that reflect the diverse cultural heritage of the community as well as a wide range of aesthetic interests.

This unique bookstore is located in a renovated 1920s theater next to Harrisburg's historic Broad Street Market and just a few blocks (1/4 mile) north of the State Capitol.

It was named "13 Independent Bookstores Every Booklover Should Visit in the U.S." by *Travel + Leisure Magazine* in 2017 and "America's Great Independent Bookstores" and voted "Simply the Best" Independent Bookstore in the region for 9 years running.

Their internet warehouses stock over one million academic and general-interest books, while the retail bookstore-cafe has more than 100,000 used, rare, and sale-priced books on six floors in two connected buildings.

Thanks to special arrangements with several University presses, the shop also features tens of thousands of discounted NONFICTION scholarly titles, including many not available for purchase anywhere online.

Their FICTION wing and expanded Children's and YA sections opened in June 2012 and "Robinson's Rare Books and Art Prints" opened on September 9, 2012.

MUST SEE: Rare Reads & Fine Prints. *Discard the Dewey Decimal System and dive the many depths of the Midtown Scholar Bookstore to discover Robinson's Rare Books & Fine Art Prints tucked away in one of the historic building's comfy book nooks.*

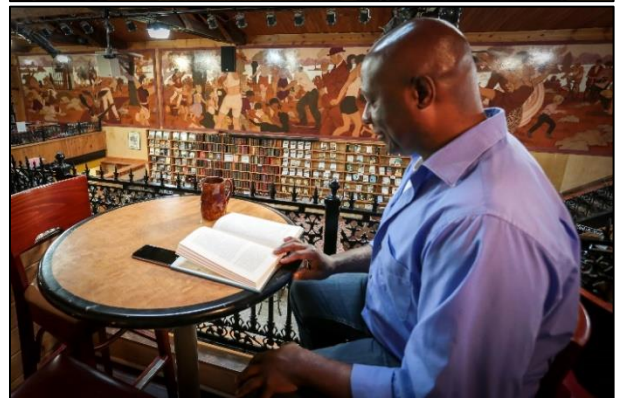

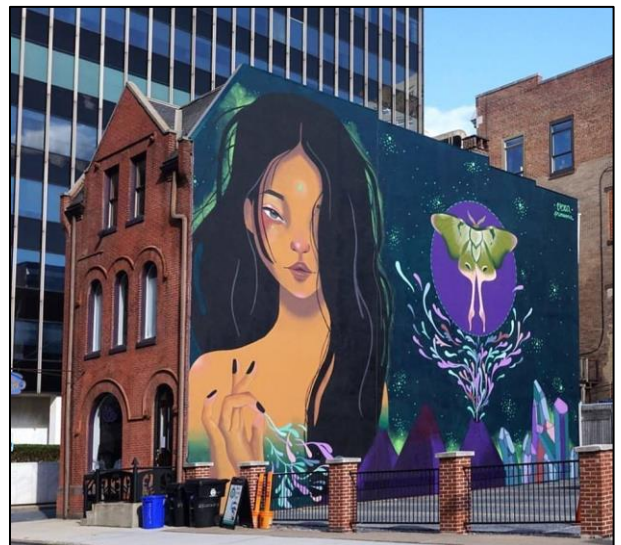

The Millworks earned the recognition of “New Tourism Business of the Year 2015” from Visit Hershey & Harrisburg with its combination of restaurant, biergarten, and artist studios.

The unique 24,000-square-foot mixed-use venue opened in March 2015 in the former Stokes Millworks, located in the heart of the Midtown District.

The 160-seat restaurant began by focusing on authentic and sustainable food sourced from local growers and producers, many located next door in the Broad Street Market.

The restaurant offers a full-service bar featuring draft and bottled microbrews, craft beers, and nano-brews from local breweries, plus a full menu of spirits and artisan cocktails.

Thirty-five (35) [regional artists](#) have studios located inside the building, allowing customers the opportunity to watch sculptors, painters, and others from the restaurant and biergarten.

Open houses on weekends allow customers to walk through the studios, engaging with the artists and seeing their craft performed in person. With a full stage and sound system, the Millworks also hosts [events](#) including live music by local & touring bands and singer songwriters.

In Fall 2016 developer Joshua Kesler expanded to include an in-house [brewery](#) and completed the 165-seat rooftop biergarten, the largest in the city, with aerial view of Harrisburg’s Midtown neighborhood.

The facility will be named as a National Park Service Registry of Historic Places and the architecture & design includes repurposed lumber for furnishings & interior construction, lighting from the Broad Street Market from 1920’s, a portion of a Pennsylvania railroad car on display in the dining area, and the wood-fired oven constructed of bricks from an 1830’s farmhouse in nearby Perry County.

Zeroday Brewing Co. opened in April 2015 as a 7-barrel craft brewery and 60-seat tasting room located in the Midtown District of Harrisburg right next to the Midtown Cinema.

Theo and Brandalynn Armstrong are the heart & soul of this microbrewery they started using a crowd funding campaign.

Now they specialize in clean, balanced ales and lagers and love to showcase their amazing brews alongside PA wine and cider, local artwork, and local live music.

Zeroday is not a full restaurant, but it offers a fun snack menu with items like the Large Ass Pretzel (seriously bigger than your face) or you can bring your own grub.

So, what's with the name? *Zero Day is a term used by those hiking the Appalachian Trail for the days you take a break and do nothing. You log zero miles that day. It's typically reserved for a worthwhile city or town. The couple wanted their spot to be worthy of a Zeroday.*

The National Fire Museum, located in an 1899 Victorian Fire House, features displays from the Hand and Horse-drawn era to motorized apparatus from 1911 through 1947. Learn the interesting facts about this service and how things we take for granted today like fire alarms and hydrants evolved over the years. The museum includes fire safety education for children and an operational Gamewell Alarm Room that dates to the 1800's.

Brother-in-laws Dan Healy and Brian Myers opened this new attraction in January 2016, claiming the distinction of being the first distillery in Harrisburg since Prohibition. Midstate produces small batches of *Shaky Jake's Rum*, a super smooth with a hint of vanilla and a sweet finish, and *Pennsylvucky Moonshine* among other unique spirits. Visitors can stop in for cocktails, take a tour, shop in the retail store and purchase bottles to take home.

Growing Spirits: *Midstate joins a growing list of distilleries now operating in this region of Pennsylvania including The Tattered Flag Brewery & Still Works in Middletown, Thistle Finch Distillery in Lancaster, Old Republic Distillery in York County, and Hidden Still Spirits in Lebanon.*

The Strite family has been farming in the Harrisburg area since 1843 and the first fruit trees and vegetables were planted by Joseph C. Strite in 1914.

His son Earl would eventually join him in the business and over time expand the farm to over 250 acres. Earl sold his produce at markets in the city of Harrisburg and door to door in nearby Hummelstown.

In 1950 the original market was opened on the farm. Earl's sons Joe and Tom joined their father on the farm and expanded vegetable plantings and added greenhouse operations.

All three received the honor of being named Master Farmers over the course of their careers.

In 1994 a new farm market and bakery were built, and the farm was expanded to 300 acres.

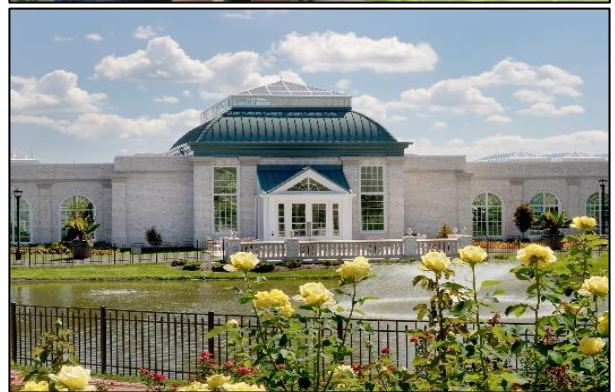
This botanical oasis is filled with 11 magnificent themed gardens, colorful seasonal displays, a children's garden with chocolate-scented, named & colored flora.

2016: The “wood-aging dream space” dubbed The Splinter Cellar opened in July with three 20-foot-tall “foeders” (Dutch for large oak tank) handcrafted by the 200-year-old Italian barrel manufacturer Giobatta & Piero Garbellotto using dozens of staves of Italian, Hungarian & French oak air-dried for three years to mellow any harsh flavors. This space became a sanctuary for strong ageable ales, a home for wild yeast & bacteria, and a wide-open canvas for creative cellaring, where a new series of PA wild ales would be brewed with fruit & microflora from their own backyard.

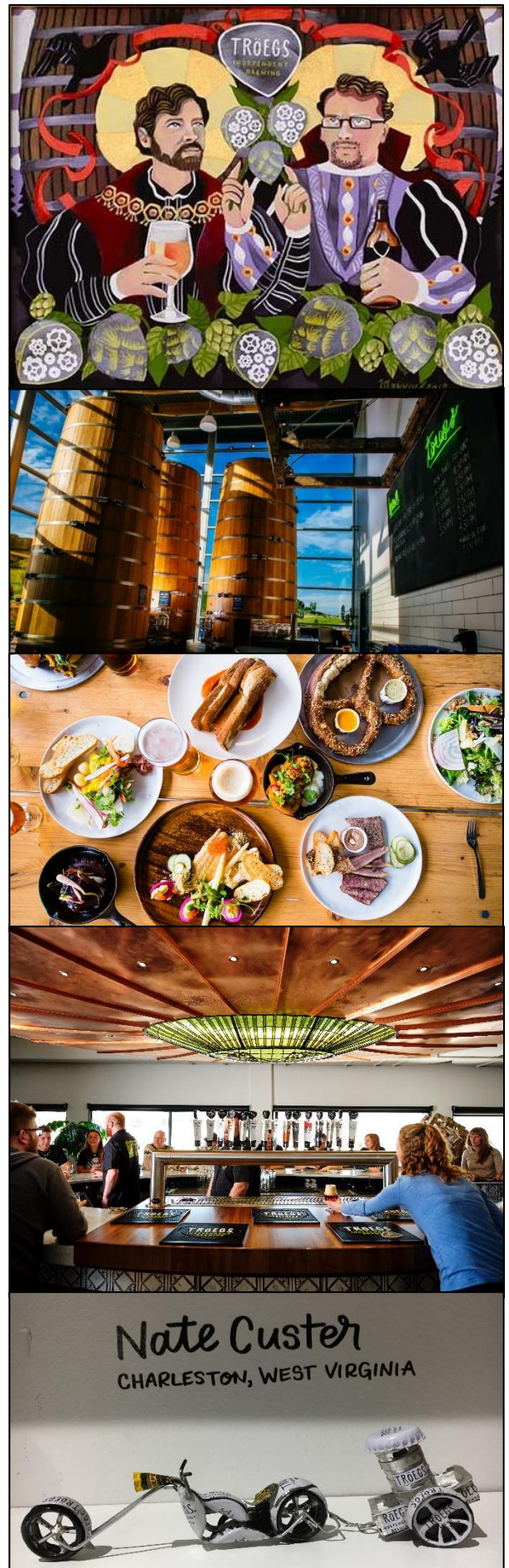
Snack Bar + Tasting Loft

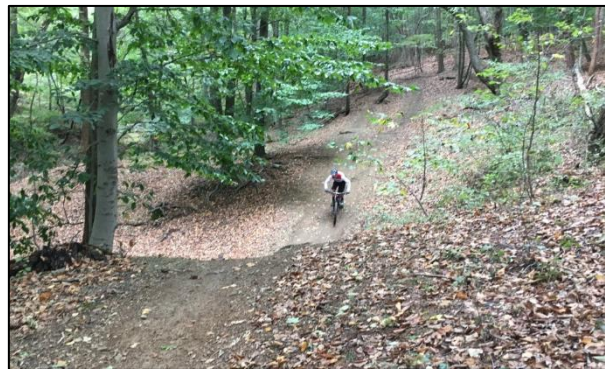

SAMBA partnered with Penn State University at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center Campus to develop 10 miles of new trails with options for users of all skill levels. Trails can be accessed traffic-free from the surrounding communities using the Eshenour Memorial bike path. The trail system is divided into two distinct areas, the East side and the West side. The unique terrain is generally rocky and rugged and while the East side offers more open, flowing trails, the West side is more technical and challenging.

Go deep into coal country – literally; on a guided tour of a real anthracite coal mine that closed in 1931. Open coal cars carry guests 1,800 feet deep into Mahanoy Mountain where they learn from experienced guides who were at one-time miners themselves. Bring a jacket or sweater for the 35-minute tour as the temperature underground is a constant 52 degrees. Above ground guests can experience a scenic train ride on an old-fashioned narrow-gauge stream locomotive named the Henry Clay. This is a steam saddle tank engine once used to haul coal cars and is referred to as a “lokie” or small locomotive even though it weighs 30 tons.

Northwest of Harrisburg

Box Huckleberry Site – One of the Oldest Living Organisms in the World – ON YOUR OWN

(25 miles northwest of Harrisburg) // Activity Time: 1 hr

Located within 10-acre Tuscarora State Forest in Perry County, the Box Huckleberry site is one of the few localities where the unusual box huckleberry plant is found. Box huckleberry is one of the oldest living organisms in the world. This particular colony of box huckleberry is over 1,000 years old according to the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The site includes 27 interpretive stations along a trail in addition to the low growth of the box huckleberry. This site could connect nicely for stories including hiking, biking, and wineries in the area. It's recognized by the National Park Service which could be another hook with the 100th Anniversary on August 25, 2016.

The Appalachian Trail Museum & Pine Grove General Store – The museum opened in June 2010 in a historic building that served as a grist mill over two hundred year ago. Across the road is the Pine Grove general store, a famed spot for those hiking the Appalachian Trail. This is the place for hikers to celebrate reaching the midpoint of the 2,200-mile trail that stretches from Maine to Georgia by attempting to eat a ½ gallon of ice cream in one sitting.

Hawk Rock Scenic Overlook - There are 28-miles of this National Scenic Trail that cross through the Hershey & Harrisburg Region. One of the best ways to experience a section of this famous trail completed in 1937 is to embark on a 30-minute hike to Hawk Rock Overlook in the town of Duncannon.

Duncannon, PA – this is an official Appalachian Trail Community that loves being a part of this National Treasure. Every June the town celebrates their place on the historic trail with the "Appalachian Trail Festival."

Appalachian Trail Festival – this small family-friendly festival in Duncannon, PA provides novice hikers with a unique opportunity to learn about one of PA's greatest assets that often goes under-appreciated. This festival is a wonderful way to learn about the Appalachian Trail and other outdoor opportunities in Central PA. Includes free admission, organized hikes, outdoor activities, live music, special exhibits, free presentations, and vendors.

The Doyle Hotel is the no-frills hostel in the center of the tiny town of Duncannon that has become a highly anticipated oasis for the long-haul hikers who post photos and letters on the walls from their time on the trail.

This is the premier facility for historical research on U.S. Army history dedicated to "Telling the Army story...one Soldier at a time." The expansive campus includes the Visitor & Education Center, the U.S. Army War College Library, U.S. Army Military History Institute, and Army Heritage Trail. The Center includes interpretive and interactive exhibits and the research library & archive. The Visitor & Education Center is dedicated to educating visitors about the culture and experiences of American soldiers featuring special exhibits, an interpretive gallery, museum store, cafe, and multipurpose rooms for events, lectures and workshops. The main gallery features the exhibit, "The Soldier Experience," highlighting the history of the U.S. Army from the Spanish-American War to current missions as well as a changing gallery. The Army Heritage Trail is a mile-long walking path connecting military history through interactive and full-scale military exhibits including a Cobra helicopter, Civil War encampment cabins, WWI trench system and more. The trail is open dawn to dusk every day; exhibits on the trail are open during normal business hours, weather permitting.

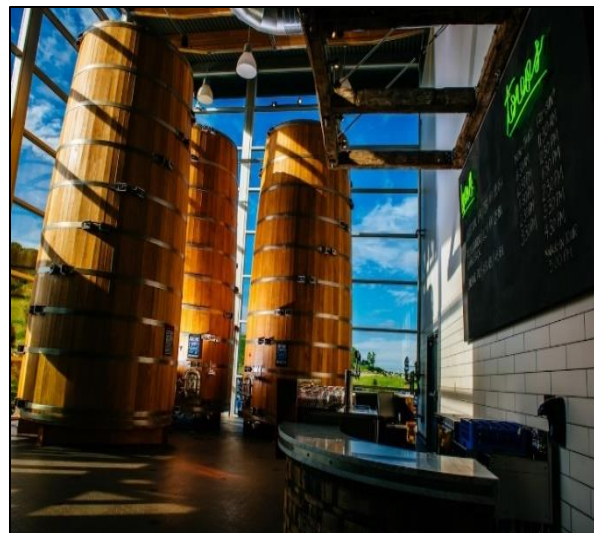

Back in 2010, brothers Chris & John Troegner were sketching a vision for their new brewery on the back of a napkin. In 2011, that vision became the 90,000 sq-ft Tröegs Brewery in Hershey with a 5,000 sq-ft Tasting Room, open brewhouse, and General Store. The brothers' napkin also included an important yet unrealized vision - a space dedicated to wood-aging, a sanctuary for strong ageable ales, a home for wild yeast & bacteria, and a wide-open canvas for creative cellaring, where a new series of PA wild ales would be brewed with fruit & microflora from their own backyard. In July 2016, their "wood-aging dream space" dubbed The Splinter Cellar opened with three 20-foot-tall "foeders" (Dutch for large oak tank) handcrafted by the 200-year-old Italian barrel manufacturer Giobatta & Piero Garbellotto using dozens of staves of Italian, Hungarian & French oak air-dried for three years to mellow any harsh flavors.

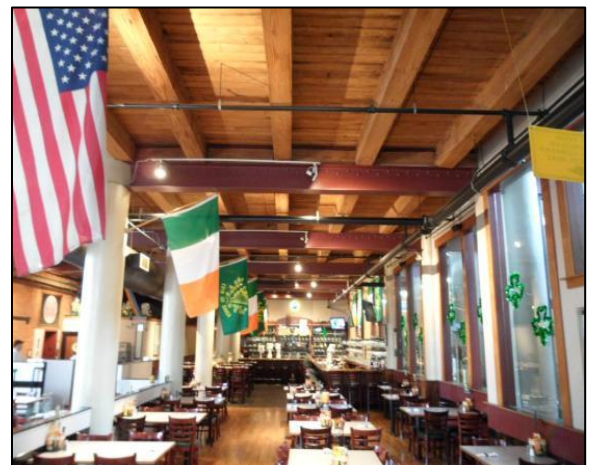

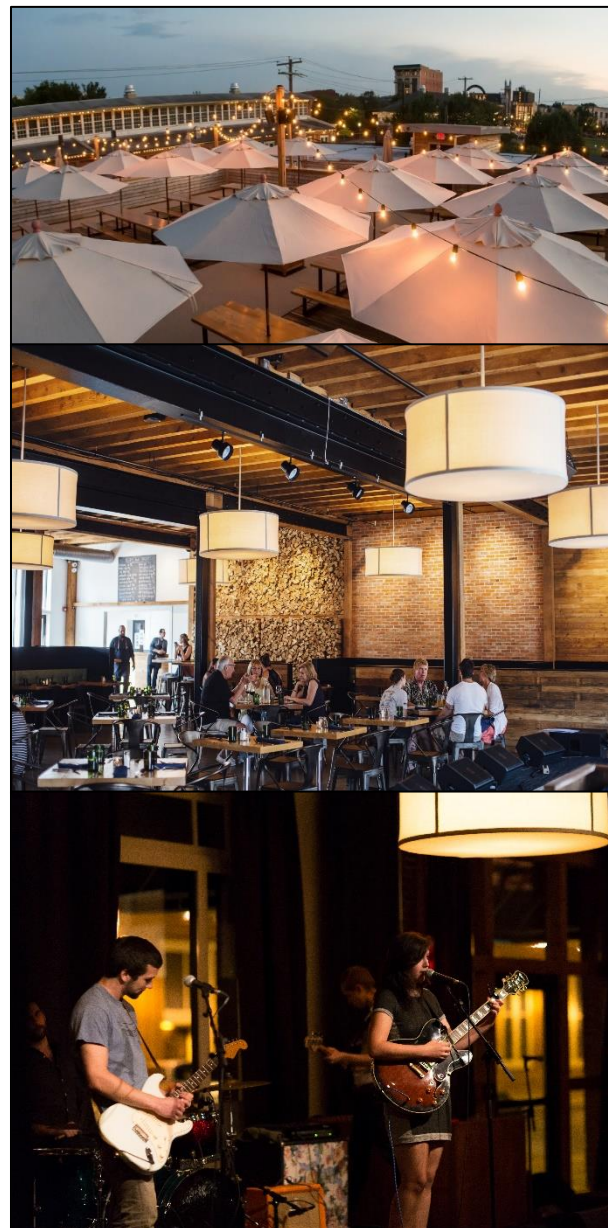
The unique 24,000-square-foot mixed-use venue opened in March 2015 and quickly earned the recognition of “New Tourism Business of the Year 2015” from the Hershey Harrisburg Regional Visitors Bureau with its combination of restaurant, biergarten, and artist studios.

The 160-seat restaurant began by focusing on authentic and sustainable food sourced from local growers and producers, many located next door in the Broad Street Market. The restaurant offers a full-service bar featuring draft and bottled microbrews, craft beers, and nano-brews from local breweries, plus a full menu of spirits and artisan cocktails. Thirty-five (35) [regional artists](#) have studios located inside the Millworks' building, allowing customers the opportunity to watch sculptors, painters, and others from the restaurant and biergarten.

Open houses on weekends allow customers to walk through the studios, engaging with the artists and seeing their craft performed in person. With a full stage and sound system, the Millworks also hosts [events](#) including live music by local & touring bands and singer songwriters.

In Fall 2016 developer Joshua Kesler expanded to include an in-house [brewery](#) and completed the 165-seat rooftop biergarten, the largest in the city, with aerial view of Harrisburg's Midtown neighborhood.

The facility will be named as a National Park Service Registry of Historic Places and the architecture & design includes repurposed lumber for furnishings & interior construction, lighting from the Broad Street Market from 1920's, a portion of a Pennsylvania railroad car on display in the dining area, and the wood-fired oven constructed of bricks from an 1830's farmhouse in nearby Perry County.

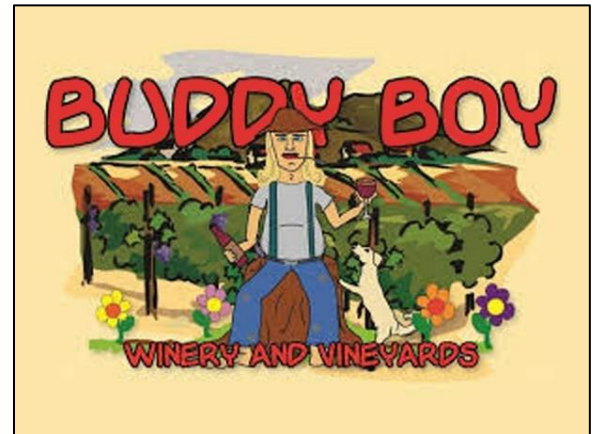

This French Creperie Au Bon Lieu meaning “to the good place” is unique; it just serves crepes. But the more than 50 varieties of crepes are labors of love, so take time to enjoy these individually made succulently stuffed packets. A small amount of batter is poured on to the heated surface of an electric crepe maker. Excess batter is quickly scrapped away using a special rake-like tool. The end result is a pancake so thin it's crispy and golden brown, not doughy. The piece de resistance is a coconut and dark chocolate filled crepe. Fine European chocolate is grated over the crepe and moist threads of sugary coconut are sprinkled over the top. Additional chocolate shavings and piped rosettes of whipped cream top off the crepe before it's ready to eat. Crepes are as thin as Parisian scarves and as tender as thinly sliced jambon. 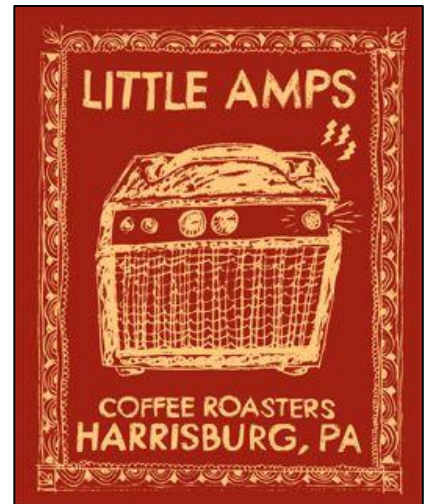

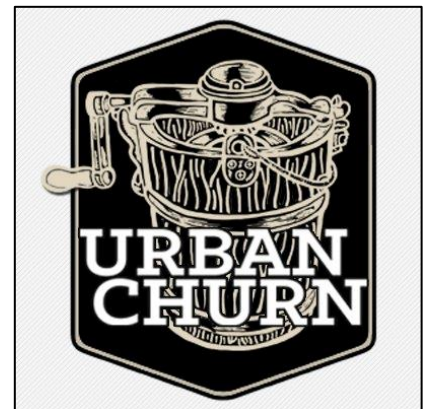

This French Creperie Au Bon Lieu meaning "to the good place" is unique; it just serves crepes. But the more than 50 varieties of crepes are labors of love, so take time to enjoy these individually made succulently stuffed packets. A small amount of batter is poured on to the heated surface of an electric crepe maker. Excess batter is quickly scrapped away using a special rake-like tool. The end result is a pancake so thin it's crispy and golden brown, not doughy. The piece de resistance is a coconut and dark chocolate filled crepe. Fine European chocolate is grated over the crepe and moist threads of sugary coconut are sprinkled over the top. Additional chocolate shavings and piped rosettes of whipped cream top off the crepe before it's ready to eat. Crepes are as thin as Parisian scarves and as tender as thinly sliced jambon.
