
DENTON SQUARE SCAVENCER HUNT


Hint: Start your hunt in the center of the square and progress in a clockwise pattern! You may have to check the view from both the center square and across the street along shop windows!



Name this building:




This building was built in 1882 as a general store and has also been a grocery store, an ice cream shop, and an auto parts store. It even housed a domino parlor upstairs! Restored in 1976 after a fire, it now houses apartments and a law office.





Some people think Miss Maynie Thorton haunts this place - perhaps because her check from 1897 for \$2.70 hangs on the wall - with her name misspelled!

Name this old fashioned store:



Today, this antique shop looks nothing like the Hardware store opened in 1885 by two brothers, Robert and Adolph. It was home to the longest continually operating business on the Denton square until it closed in 2001. You can see boxes that these brothers used at their store in the courthouse museum.



Ice first came to Denton in 1874. This old fashioned store uses ice and a 1937 Emery Thompson machine, along with 14% butterfat cream, to create 91 (and still counting) cool flavors made fresh on site!



Erected in 1918 by the Daughters of the Confederacy, there are two water fountains, one on each side, which no longer work. In a time of national segregation, the two fountains were designated for different ethnicities. There have been unsuccessful attempts to have this memorial removed.

This is the site of the third burial of John Denton in 1901. This pioneer preacher and lawyer never actually lived in Denton. He was killed in a battle with the Keechi Indian tribe in 1841.
