


Image: St Mary's Stadium footprint



Getting to St Mary's Stadium

Bus

To reach the stadium, take the **Bluestar 3, 16, or 18**, which stop on Britannia Road, just a short walk away. Alternatively, you can take the **Bluestar 7**, which stops at City College, also a short walk from the stadium.

Getting to St Mary's Stadium

Ocean Village Shuttle Bus

For supporters with seasonal parking in the Ocean Village multi-storey car park, a shuttle bus runs every 20 minutes – on the hour, 20 past, and 20 to the hour – dropping passengers at Britannia Road, near the stadium.

Return buses depart from the same location 30 minutes after the final whistle. To purchase the parking and shuttle bus pass, please call the ticket office on **02381 780 780**.

Getting to St Mary's Stadium

Car

A designated drop-off and pick-up area is located outside the Main Reception, next to the Ted Bates statue. Access is via the south of the stadium along Marine Parade. This area is strictly for set down and pick up purposes.

Please note that due to matchday road closures, this area may be busy, and vehicles left unattended risk being towed.

Please see the location of the drop-off and pick-up area on the map on page 6.

Home Fan Parking

Onsite accessible parking is sold out for all League matches. Parking may be available for Cup matches and can be booked directly through our ticket office by calling **02381 780 780**. The North and South car parks and Britannia Road close 1 hour 30 minutes before kick-off, and are also closed up to 20 minutes after the full-time whistle. In some cases the car park may be closed earlier should a large number of supporters start to arrive earlier and it is deemed a risk for the car park to remain open. Please ensure you arrive in plenty of time to avoid not being given access to the car park on the day.

Away Fan Parking

Away supporters have four allocated accessible spaces per matchday in the South car park at St Mary's Stadium. To book, please contact your club directly for further details.

The parking area is flat and tarmacked, with no ramps or steps to navigate, ensuring easy access for all supporters.

Parking Information

If driving to St Mary's Stadium, you can use a Southampton City Council car park: <https://www.southampton.gov.uk/travel-transport/find-and-plan/find-parking/>

The nearest car parks are:

Bond Street (SO14 5QA) – 2 accessible bays

Northam Road (SO14 0PD) – 2 accessible bays

Crosshouse Road (SO14 5GZ) – 2 accessible bays

Blue badge holders are welcome to park in marked accessible spaces located on Rochester Street. There are 14 spaces available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Important Note

Avoid parking on double yellow lines in the surrounding areas of the stadium due to council restrictions as vehicles parked in these areas may be towed.



Away Supporter Coaches Travelling to St Mary's

All official away coaches should park along Melbourne Street, a short walk from the away stand (see map – Page 16). If organisers contact the club in advance, we will make every effort to accommodate an accessible coach to drop off as close to the stadium as possible. Please email accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk if you have an accessible coach.

Approaches, Ramps, and Steps

The approach to St Mary's is accessible from all directions, with no steps or ramps to navigate from outside the stadium to pitchside.

SFC Supporters Travelling To Away Matches Via Official Coach

If you're a disabled supporter planning to travel to an away game on one of our official coaches, we recommend contacting the Ticket Office in advance. For supporters with limited mobility, we advise booking onto Coach 2, where possible. If the coach needs to park a distance from the turnstiles, we make every effort to ensure Coach 2 is able to drop off and pick up closer to the stadium entrance.

If you're a wheelchair user and unable to transfer to a standard seat on the coach, please contact the Ticket Office as early as possible, by calling **02381 780 780**. This will allow us time to check the availability of a wheelchair-accessible coach with a lift.

Ticket Office

Home Supporters

The home Ticket Office is located next to the stadium shop in the Itchen South/Chapel corner.

Away Supporters

The away Ticket Office and turnstiles are on the south side of the stadium, between the Chapel and Kingsland stands.

Visiting supporters can use turnstile E to access the away stand, with the accessible entrance and Ticket Office located nearby.

Entry and exit for away fans is via Melbourne Street.

Accessibility Features

Both Ticket Offices are step-free with no gradients and have lowered counters and hearing loops. Stewards, Matchday Supporters Liaison Officers and Happy to Help staff are available on matchdays to assist and guide you. If you need help in the queue, they will be happy to help.

Ticket Information

Under the **Equality Act 2010**, a disabled person is defined as someone with a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on their ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities.

To buy a Season or Match Ticket with a Personal Assistant for a Disabled Adult, Over 65, 18-25, or Under 18, you'll need to provide one of the following:

- DLA (Middle/Higher rate care or mobility)
- PIP (Standard/Enhanced rate mobility or daily living)
- Certificate of Visual Impairment (CVI)
- Nimbus Access Card (Showing +1 Symbol)
- Attendance Allowance (AA)
- War Pension

Please submit your documentation to the Ticket Office before purchasing your ticket. Allow three working days for processing (longer during busy periods). You can bring it to the Ticket Office or email a copy to tickets@saintsfc.co.uk.

Ticket Information

Once your personal assistant has been approved, please complete our accessible requirement form [here](#). This provides us with information about how we can best support you on matchday. Please note even if you're not attending with a personal assistant you can also complete this form to request further information about our access facilities.

If you're under the age of 14 and have a disability, you'll not be entitled to a free Personal Assistant. In accordance with our Ground Regulations, fans under the age of 14 are required to attend with a parent or guardian over the age of 18.

In most areas of the stadium, the personal assistant seat is next to the wheelchair user – in some areas, it may be located behind. We have allocated seats set aside for ambulant disabled supporters who may benefit from an aisle ticket seat, a seat with extra leg room, a seat with fewer steps to negotiate and a seat near to an exit.

Hospitality

Our Hospitality Team offers a range of packages for all supporters. If you require easy-access seating, please inform the team at the time of booking so they can allocate the best available seats.

For wheelchair access, spaces are limited but we will do our best to accommodate you. We recommend contacting the Hospitality Team as early as possible to secure a space. Please note, you may need to move to another floor for pitchside wheelchair bays, subject to availability.

If you have any dietary requirements, please let us know at least three working days before the match. All hospitality areas are accessible via lift.

Stadium Store

The Club Shop is located on the south side of the stadium, at the corner of the Chapel and Itchen stands. It is best accessed via the South Car Park, which offers disabled parking bays.

The shop entrance and exit have automatic doors, and the approach is flat for easy access. **A lowered counter** is available at the till nearest the exit. **A hearing loop** is also available at Till 2 – please speak to a member of staff if you require assistance.

Staff are trained to help and will be happy to assist. The shop aisles are wide enough for wheelchair access, and there is a large changing room with grab rails, suitable for those with mobility needs and some wheelchair users.

Quiet Hour

The shop also operates a Quiet Hour scheme for visitors who would benefit from a calmer shopping experience. This takes place from **10am to 11am on non-matchdays**, with lowered lighting and no music. Our retail team also receives awareness training to better support visitors during this time.

Accessibility Stewards

Whilst all our stewards are happy to help all supporters, we also have a team of dedicated Accessibility Stewards who are on hand to assist with any aspect of your matchday experience. They can be identified by their pink high visibility jackets with 'Accessibility Steward' written on the back. They are most often found at the front of each stand.

Catering

All concourse catering units have lowered counters, marked with a wheelchair symbol, and are accessible via flat surfaces with no steps or ramps. Accessibility Stewards are available to assist if you have any specific access requirements.

St Mary's Stadium is cashless – card payments only.

All catering units are fitted with hearing loops. Large print menus are available on request at the kiosks.

We offer gluten-free & vegan options so please speak to a member of the catering team if you have any dietary requirements. Alternatively, if you have a question in advance of a match, please contact accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk.

Fan Zones & Bars

Our **Family Zone**, **Gasworks Bar**, **Northam Fan Zone** and **The Dell** are accessible to all home supporters, opening up to three hours before kick-off.

All areas are accessible via flat surfaces with no steps or ramps and each has an accessible toilet. At the Northam Fan Zone, there is an accessible route marked to the lowered counter, and a hearing loop is available.

General Information

Accessible Entrances

Accessible entrances are located next to every set of turnstiles and are staffed by stewards. These can be used by anyone who may find turnstiles difficult or daunting. Tickets will be scanned using a handheld device. There are no steps or ramps from the stadium exterior to pitchside. If you have a hidden disability which means you could benefit from using the accessible entrance on matchday, please email accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk to discuss any additional requirements.

Signage

Clear signage indicates accessible toilets, pitchside access, lowered counters at kiosks, and First Aid points.

General Information

Accessible Toilets


Accessible toilets are available across all concourses and levels, near raised decks and hospitality areas. They include left-hand and right hand transfer options. Many toilets use Radar Locks – please bring your key, or ask a steward for access. All facilities are step-free, clearly signposted, and have emergency pull cords monitored by stewards. Accessible toilets are fitted with alarms. Please see the location of the accessible toilets inside the stadium concourse on the stadium map on page 36.

There are a total of nine accessible toilets available across the hospitality levels of the stadium:

First Floor: Three accessible toilets (including the changing places toilet) serve the raised decks in Blocks 4 and 7, as well as the Saints Bar Hospitality Suite.

Second Floor: Two accessible toilets serve the Markus Liebherr and Staplewood Lounges.

Third Floor: Four accessible toilets serve the Executive Boxes, Halo and Knightwood Lounges, the 1885 Suite, and the Sensory Room.

Changing Places

Changing Places toilets offer additional space and specialist equipment to support visitors with complex accessibility needs. This facility is located on the first floor of the stadium, close to the raised deck seating. The facility is available to all supporters who may require it. After purchasing your ticket, please contact our Inclusion and Disability Access Officer on **02380 711 980** or accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk to discuss any additional needs and ensure a safe, comfortable experience.

Home Areas


Wheelchair spaces are available at the front of each stand and on raised decks in various stands. Personal Assistant seats are located next to the wheelchair user where possible. On raised decks, some personal assistant seats may be positioned directly behind due to space. For advice on availability and the best location, please contact our ticket office at tickets@saintsfc.co.uk.

Lifts are available for access to hospitality areas and raised decks. Raised decks are located halfway up the stands and provide spaces for wheelchair users and their personal assistants. Lift locations are shown on the stadium map on page 36.


If you're located within our raised decks in Block 4 or Block 44, you'll need to enter through a restricted area. We ask supporters to arrive at our Executive Entrance, which is located on the corner of the Itchen North / Northam Stands, 45 minutes prior to kick off, where you will be greeted by a member of our stewarding team.

Supporters who are sat on the raised deck in Block 7 can enter through our Guest Entrance. This is located to the right-hand side of the main reception (as you face the stadium) and is just behind where the away coach parks on matchday.

Supporters seated on the raised decks in Blocks 4, 7, and 44 will not have access to the concourse food and drink kiosks. However, our Happy to Help team will ensure refreshments are available to order on the day. Please note, alcohol is not permitted on the raised decks.

Seating

Away Areas

We offer a selection of ambulant disabled seats which can be located at the front of the stands, as well as at the end of aisles and near to exits. For further information on their exact locations, please speak to your club.

There are 16 wheelchair spaces available at the front of the stands, all pitchside at ground level. A small number of personal assistant seats are positioned directly next to the wheelchair user, with the majority located just behind.

Stadium Access and Facilities

We offer SFC Access Wristbands for supporters with hidden disabilities.

Available free of charge, wearing an SFC Access Wristband on a matchday will allow staff to recognise that you may require additional assistance, without you having to share your specific disabilities, or needs, in an open space.

The SFC Access Wristband enables you:

Access to accessible toilets

To leave the stadium for a short period of time, should you need access to a 'safe space'

To lift access if you are within Hospitality areas

To further assistance should you wish to purchase refreshments

Access through our accessible entrance points at the turnstiles

The ability to bring a larger bag if you need to carry medication or equipment



Assitance Dogs

We welcome assistance dogs and have assessed suitable seating areas with safety officers and organisations such as **Guide Dogs** and **Canine Partners**.

We can accommodate both home and away supporters with assistance dogs, with away fans seated among their own supporters. Water bowls are available on request, though there are no dedicated relieving areas.

Audio Description Service

We provide an Audio Description Service to all home and away supporters who are visually impaired. To make use of this service, please contact our Inclusion and Disability Liaison Officer no later than 2 working days before the match, on **02380 711 980** or accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk with your seat details. We advise supporters to bring their own headphones which require the old style 3.5mm plug in jack.

Medication and Equipment

Please contact our Inclusion and Disability Access Officer in advance to inform us of any medication or equipment you will be bringing to the stadium, and to discuss any support you may require. You can reach us on **02380 711 980** or accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk.

Powered Wheelchairs and Scooters

Powered wheelchairs and mobility scooters are welcome in all wheelchair-accessible spaces. Please inform the Ticket Office when booking, so we can allocate an appropriate space.

We recommend contacting accessibility@saintsfc.co.uk or **02380 711980** in advance to check the sizes we can accommodate. We also kindly ask that you remain in your powered wheelchair or scooter throughout your visit, as storage facilities are not available.

Please ensure your device is fully charged for your journey and time at St Mary's.

Ear Defenders

The club has some Ear Defenders available for use across the stadium. They can be collected when you arrive at the stadium and returned after the match.

Membership is free and open to all. Supporters under 16 can join but will not have voting rights until they turn 16.
