PRESS STATEMENT 27 November 2015 Launch of the Royal College of Emergency Medicine's Winter Flow Project

We are today launching our Winter Flow Project, which looks at system wide pressures impacting on the emergency care system over the winter of 2015/16.

Our first report, looking at the data collected since the beginning of October 2015, can be found <u>here</u>.

Commenting on the project, Dr Cliff Mann, President of the Royal College of Emergency Medicine, said:

"Our work is looking at hospitals' performance against the four hour standard, and how this performance should not be seen in isolation, but alongside other important metrics such as: how many acute beds are available in the hospital; how many elective operations had to be cancelled; and how many delayed discharges are there at any given time.

We're looking at each of these metrics until March 2016, through the coming winter. We are determined to ensure we are able to continue to speak authoritatively about issues facing UK emergency departments.

Our data published today show that performance against the four hour standard has declined over the five weeks from the middle of October to the middle of November.

Our data show that 76% of hospitals are increasing their acute bed capacity. It appears as though hospitals are doing this in preparation for increased demand during the winter period. Regrettably elective care has sometimes had to be cancelled to cope with the recent increased numbers of acute admissions."
