Emergency Department Following your visit to the **Emergency Department**

We hope that you are satisfied with your experience in the Emergency Department, and that you were treated both professionally and courteously. If you have any concerns please do not hesitate to speak to a member of staff.

We now feel it is safe for you to go home and be discharged from the Emergency Department. Please make sure that you have discussed the following information with the Doctors and Nurses:

- 1. Which pain relief to use if you are in pain.
- 2. When it is appropriate for you to return to work. "Sick notes" (Statement of Fitness to Work) are issued by your GP only if you need more than 7 days off work.
- 3. If you need further appointments, either with your GP or at the Hospital, please make sure that these have been arranged or that you know how to arrange them.
- 4. Make sure that the Doctor or Nurse has explained any guestions that you have about the condition or the injury that brought you to the Emergency Department.
- 5. Please ask for an information leaflet about your condition or injury if you would like one.
- 6. Please make sure that you are aware of what symptoms or signs should prompt you to return to the Emergency Department.



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7. If you or your family have any concerns about your discharge from hospital or how you will manage at home please discuss this with a member of staff before you leave.
