## Wheeze Discharge management plan





### **DANGER**

Your child's condition is getting worse if:

- Your blue inhaler is not helping
- Your breathing is hard and fast
- You can't talk or walk properly
- You are getting tired



You need urgent help please phone 999 or go straight to the nearest Accident and Emergency Depart.



If your child is using more of their blue reliever inhaler than stated in the discharge management plan and you are concerned



You need to see your G.P. today



Your child is using the management plan but you have concerns, they may be having some time off school or be unable to take part in normal levels of activity



You need to see a doctor today. Please ring your G.P. surgery/Health Visitor or community Nurse or attend the walk in centre

#### What to do in an emergency

- 1. Take 2 puffs of your reliever inhaler (usually blue)
- 2. Sit up and loosen tight clothing
- 3. If no improvement ,continue to take one puff/dose of reliever inhaler every minute for five minutes or until symptoms improve
- 4. If your symptoms do not improve in five minutes or if you are in doubt call 999 or go to the nearest A & E department
- 5. Continue to take one puff of your reliever inhaler every minute until help arrives

After an emergency you should call your G.P. surgery and ask for an urgent appointment (even if you feel better)

<u>Do not ignore worsening condition - Get medical help immediately. Day or Night</u>

### **GIVING YOUR INHALER**

Steps 1-3 needs to be followed for <u>each puff</u> e.g. if asked to give 2 puffs; repeat the whole process twice.

You may be given different coloured inhalers or chambers. The process is the same for all colours.

Below are some examples of different coloured inhalers and chambers.

Place your child in an up-right and comfortable position.
Place the mask securely over their mouth and nose. Press inhaler once to give one puff and count to ten.
