Living room space. throughout this scene Audrey is not seen nor heard and the screen is black. I have put her response lines in to help with tone and delivery.

SPEAKER ON THE PHONE There's also plenty of online meetings you could find at AA - London.com

AUDREY

Okay thanks its just, I live in Birmingham so...

SPEAKER ON THE PHONE
Not a problem, there will be dozens
of venues around your area, you can
find plenty of meetings online. I
can find one for you if...

AUDREY

No, no this is for a friend you see.

SPEAKER ON THE PHONE O. Well thats nice you are able to help your friend.

AUDREY

But purely out of interest, would there be any around B21 postcode. Of course I can find this all out for myself but while i'm talking to you...

SPEAKER ON THE PHONE
Of course, umm. I have an address
for Oaklands Community centre, 1
Oakland road Hands...Yes, In
Handsworth. thats perfect. Thanks.
No, no, no, thank you.

END OF SCENE ONE.

SCENE TWO ONLINE AA MEETING.

A few months later appear on screen then slowly disappear. On a laptop screen we see over 20 people online most with their videos off. Audrey has her video off. There's one or two people reacting quietly to whats being said.

SCREEN 2

Thats what I don't understand.

SCREEN 27

Yeah I agree, I heard their's been An average of 124 daily deaths from the new variant. So how can that signify the end of it.

SCREEN 2

Exactly, its wise not to believe in everything they force down our throats. Especially since half of them were partying all the way through lockdown.

Slight pause.

SCREEN 27

Anyway at least the jabs helped big time. If it wasn't for the NHS I know at least 6 people including my uncle that wouldn't be alive today and thats just in my circles.

SCREEN 2

well personally speaking its not like anyone's left in my life now, everyones deserted and that had nothing to do with covid.

Screen two uncomfortably laughs. Slight pause. Emotional.

I tried putting step 4 into
practise but with all the hurt I
caused it was too late.

Pause. Screen 2 mutes their mic.

SCREEN 27

Wasn't your fault, stop blaming yourself. Your here aren't you?

CHAIRPERSON

What do you mean by that.

SCREEN 27

People are always quick to judge, instead of trying to help. They come out with, and this often includes your own family members, well in my case it did. your to weak, your to sensitive, your too....drunk.

CHAIRPERSON

You are correct, some people are quick to judge. I would like to take this opportunity to open this up to anyone else who would like to share, I would also like to say how I appreciate everyones openness. could be a situation you'd be willing to share or may have found yourself in, or indeed if you have found one of the twelve steps challenging...

A familiar voice is heard, our very own Audrey. She is screen 17.

SCREEN 17

They're all bloody challenging, god why i'm I here.

Long Pause.

O shit, I didn't mute my bloody....

CHAIRPERSON

No, no thats quite alright, it's good to hear your voice and i quite agree with your statement on how it's not easy.

SCREEN 17

I bet your going to say the hardest part is coming to a meeting right and now I've managed to do that I'm closer to achieving my goal.

CHAIRPERSON

Not quite, but i also agree with parts of that statement too.

Slight pause.

SCREEN 17

So before coming i made that list of the people i harmed and that was....extraordinary

CHAIRPERSON Extraordinary, as in painful?

SCREEN 17 Thats the obvious part.

Slight pause. Audrey takes a breathe.

I went over and over the things that have happened in my life. I was desperate...I was desperate to change what happened. You know, why i became the person your hearing today. my choices, especially when i was younger. The person I lost... So I bargained with...I Know this might sound stupid but I bargained with the universe, god, my self anything to try and find a solution. In the hope that things could have turned out...

Chairperson nods.

They couldn't take my statement, this happened on a night out. After seeing a friend being punched in the face, just because she refused to go back with some guy. Similar thing happened when i was....

Long pause.

CHAIRPERSON

You don't have to say anything if you don't feel comfortable.

SCREEN 17

Hey, its just like mum says, you need to be tough as old boots to survive.

SCREEN 27 Yeah I hear that.

CHAIRPERSON

I really appreciate everyones contribution to this evenings meeting.

(MORE)

CHAIRPERSON (CONT'D)

If anyone else would like to speak please feel free too, Believe me when I say that I found....

As the chairperson continues, His/Her voice fades. Audrey looks up from the screen towards the bottle of vodka. She mutes her mic and gets up from the sofa. She picks up the bottle of vodka opens it and starts to pour the vodka in a bin. She starts crying and stops pouring. Theres about a quarter left in the bottle. She picks up a glass and pours the rest in the glass she sits down with it and unmutes the laptop, the session appears to have ended. She is sat holding a glass of vodka. She starts to cry. She puts the glass close to her lips. Chairperson starts clearing their throat.

I'm so sorry, I didn't get round to ending the session on my laptop and heard you in distress. I am more than happy to talk or listen. Whatever you want really.

Audrey considers closing her laptop. She is embarrassed. Pause. She puts the glass down on the table. Takes a paper handkerchief and wipes her tears. She looks at the laptop and sees the Chairperson still waiting.

SCREEN 17

How long were you listening for.... So you genuinely give a shit?

CHAIRPERSON

Umm, it appears so. Yes.

SCREEN 17

What if told you that i'm currently looking at a glass of vodka which i was about to drink.

CHAIRPERSON

Before I rudely interrupted you?

Audrey laughs she puts her hair up stroking her face. So where is it?

SCREEN 17

It's on the coffee table looking more and more attractive the more i'm looking at it.

CHAIRPERSON

Your too kind but i've never been referred to as an it before?

SCREEN 17
Quite the joker aren't you.

CHAIRPERSON Hum.

SCREEN 17 Whats the hum?

CHAIRPERSON

The hum stands for many things, I am a recovering alcoholic being one of them.

SCREEN 17
How the fuck did you quit it?

CHAIRPERSON

I haven't quit it, i'm managing my addiction. I've come to realise that it'll always be a temptation. It'll always be a part of my identity so to speak, but what i also know is that it's a disorder. It's my fight and that makes me determined to defeat it. Even though it's ever-where. On the TV, in supermarkets, when walking past pubs on the high-street most people seem happy to be in. every achievement usually comes with an I'll drink to that statement.

SCREEN 17 Hum

CHAIRPERSON

I remember the hurt and pain I put my family through and my partner at the time, had a full time job just looking after me.

Audrey puts on her video. Audrey signs.

SCREEN 17

Thanks for telling me your story, it kinda helps.

CHAIRPERSON

Thats what i'm here for....you Were going to say something earlier. You mentioned about your statement not being taken seriously or valid when your friend was punched.

(MORE)

CHAIRPERSON (CONT'D)

Then you said that a similar thing happened when you was....and Then you stopped.

Slight pause.

I'm Sorry, you don't have to go there if you don't want to.

Pause.

SCREEN 17

My name is Audrey and i'm an alcoholic...

CHAIRPERSON

Only if you are ready to say that...

SCREEN 17

I was also rapped and had a couple of abortions.

Chairperson nods.

All happened when I was younger but you'd have thought that alone would have been enough to stop me from going out and partying. No, I carried on and kept what happened to me from everyone I loved.

Chairperson nods.

I just kept putting myself in dodgy situations perpetually being drunk as a skunk. My sister would have gone completely bonkers if she knew all this.

Slight pause. Audrey imagining what her sister would say chuckles. Chairperson smiles.

CHAIRPERSON

Thank you for sharing your situation, that couldn't have been easy.

Sincerely.

But what happened to you was not your fault...

Slight pause.

SCREEN 17

The thing is, she always looked after me, my sister.

Suddenly Audrey sees Mikes car lights as he parks up.
I'm sorry i've gotta go, my
husbands home early and....

CHAIRPERSON

No, no thats perfectly fine. speak soon I hope and take care.

Audrey puts the laptop lid down as the laptop closes the credits come up on black screen.
