She continued to live with caretakers until she was in her 40s, when she moved into her own apartment, and eventually, lived in her own house. She spent her last years in care facilities. For much of her life, she traveled throughout Lethbridge on her own. She knew all the bus routes and the drivers, and they knew her. Unfortunately, the staff at the hospital also got to know her very well, but they always took excellent care of her. There were a multitude of good people who were involved with Brenda throughout her life and enabled her to lead a full life. A huge thanks to all of you.

Brenda loved animals, and volunteered at the Lethbridge Humane Society, the Helen Schuler Nature Centre and music and pet stores. She considered herself an animal advocate. She was an avid bowler, and was well known for her dancing skills. Brenda looked for opportunities to take care of others.
