It is with profound sadness that the family of **Jeffrey Olson** announce his passing on Friday, May 24, 2019 at the age of 57, after a courageous battle with cancer.

Jeff was born January 23, 1962 in Calgary. He spent most of his early years growing up in Lethbridge, graduating from CCH in 1980. After high school, he went on to pursue a career as a journeyman electrician, which led him to oilfield construction and finally a career in the oil patch, specializing in electrical submersible pumps. He loved to make people laugh and rarely met a dog that didn't like him instantly. He loved history, astronomy, science fiction, good beer and the mountains. He loved his family and friends deeply.

He is survived by and will be forever missed by his wife and best friend, Deb Olson and their son, Wyatt; his parents, Don & Rosemarie Olson and his sister Lori Olson (Trever Miller), all of Lethbridge. He also leaves to cherish his memory, Deb's mom, Joan Friedman of Phoenix, AZ; his sister-in-law, Carol Getz (Glenn Getz) and their children Kyle, Megan and Tanisha and his great niece, Bria, all of Medicine Hat.
