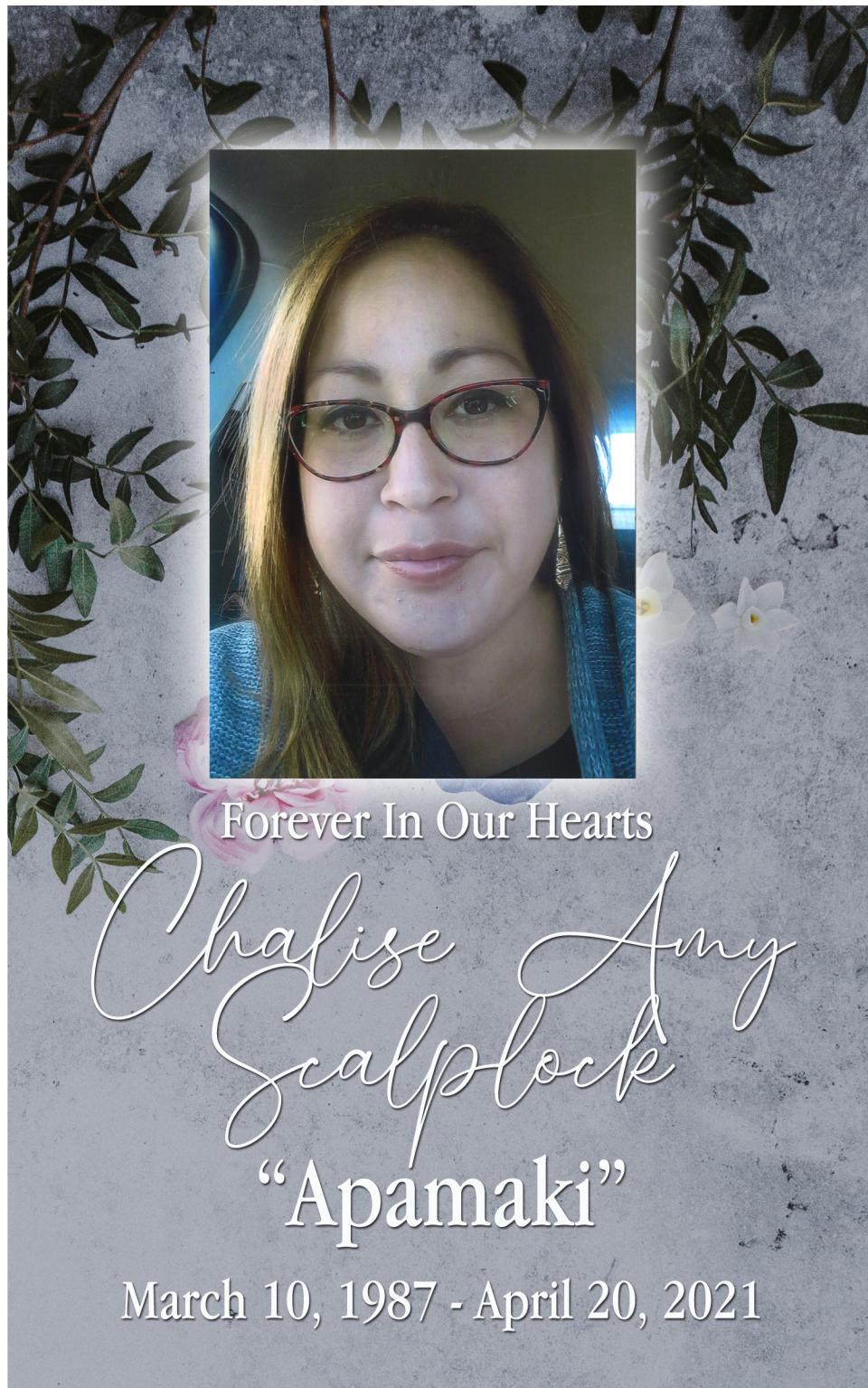


Thank you
