James (Jim) Hajime Oka passed away at St. Michael's Care Centre on August 23, 2020, at the age of 88 years.



After high school, Jim attended the Provincial Institute of Technology and Art (now known as SAIT) in Calgary taking Industrial Electricity and became a journeyman electrician working in Medicine Hat, Red Deer, Edmonton, Grande Prairie, Saskatoon, Winnipeg, Thunder Bay, and North Dakota. The last job he worked on was the Caroline Gas plant west of Bowden.

Jim was a faithful member of the Anglican Church of the Ascension in Coaldale. The church not only provided him spiritual comfort, but also the congregation became part of his family. He always enjoyed the coffee, snacks and hugs after the service.

Jim was always devising efficient ways to do everything. When computers came out, Jim was one of the first people to own a Tandy personal computer bought from Radio Shack and the rest is history; he became a lifelong learner. He was an active member of the Chinook Computer Club until his passing. The members of the computer club became his friends and with the help of Leslee, Jim was able to join his last meeting from his hospital bed.

Jim had an affinity and talent for numbers and meticulously tracked the stock market. At the age of 75 he discovered the world of travelling and enjoyed many cruises all over the world with his family. Jim enjoyed being with everyone, taking in all of the sites and was fascinated by the mechanics of the cruise ship. Jim was also an avid sports fan and especially liked to follow baseball and hockey.
