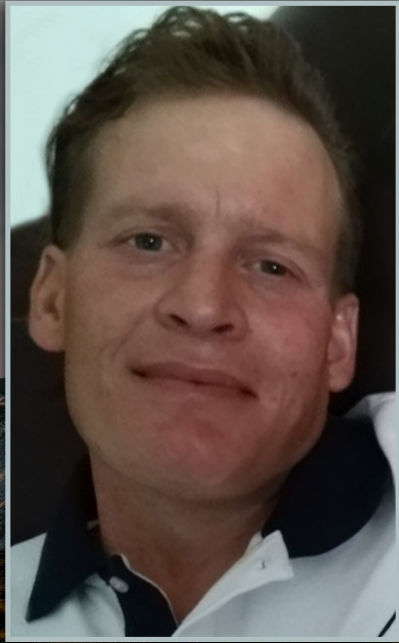


BROTHER
