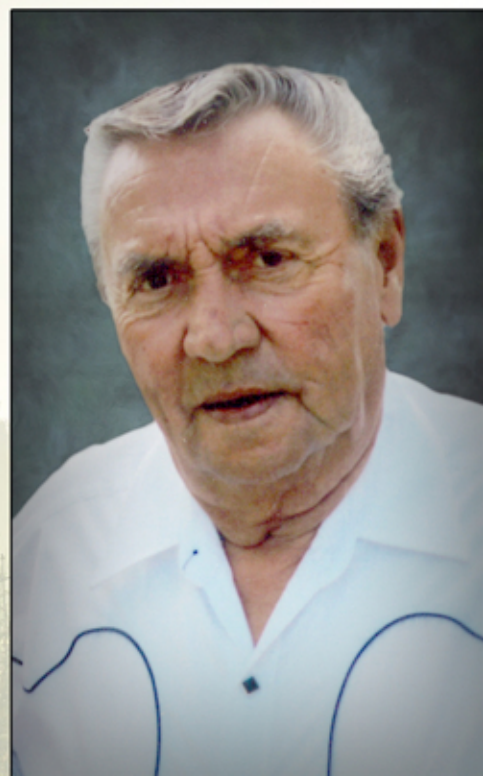


God's Garden
