During his time in Lethbridge, Larry was very available and volunteered with many groups, including Cubs & Scouts in Calgary (before moving to Lethbridge), Sik-Ooh-Kotoki Friendship Society, Metis Nation - Alberta Association, Knights of Columbus - Lethbridge Council 1490 and Royal Canadian Legion - General Stewart Branch.
