

What A Day That Will Be

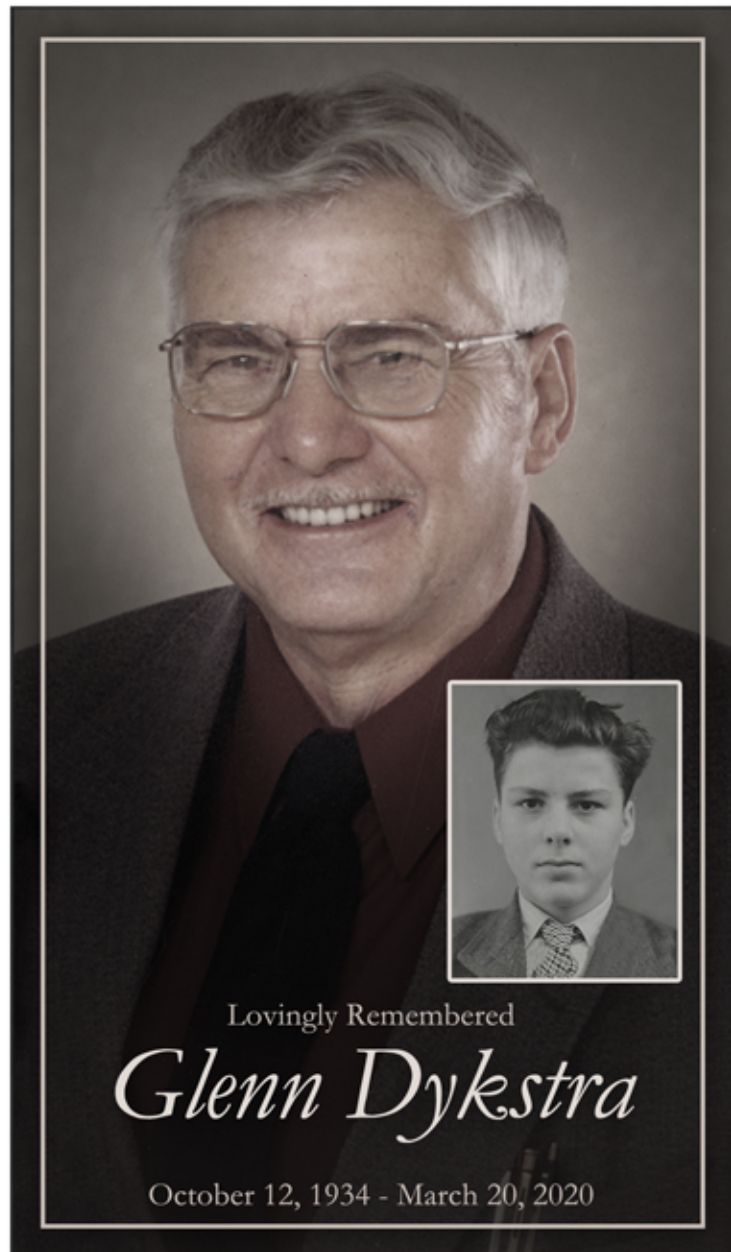
There is coming a day when no heartaches shall come
