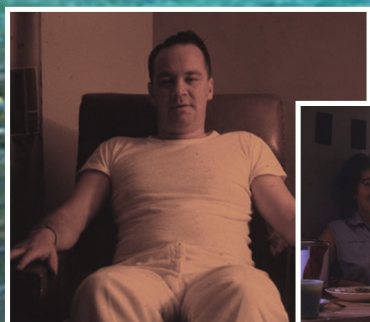


Our lives go on without you

Dad was born April 7, 1929, in Revelstoke, BC. He was the second of 3 sons born to Edie Dafoe. Dad lived in Field as a boy and eventually Vernon. Dad loved BC. He called it "God's Country."

Dad sailed for Korea as part of the PPCLI, 2nd Battalion in 1950 & returned home in 1952. Dad met Mom when she was working for AGT as a telephone operator in Vermillion, AB and they were married in Edmonton on December 21, 1957.

Dad and Mom bowled and curled; Dad swam & Mom skated. They were kept busier in 1965 & 1966, after the stork delivered the two kids. The years filled up with school and work, summer vacations, kids moving away, kids moving back; we had a full family life.

Dad & Mom loved playing cards: Bridge, Canasta and cribbage. For as long as most of us will remember, they played best of 3 games of crib every morning, 25 cents for the win.

After Dad officially retired, Mom had the conviction to teach an old dog new tricks and thus, emptying the dishwasher in the morning became Dad's regular job. Dad and Mom were able to travel well into their 70s. They took a couple of cruises, but the highlight of their traveling days was a trip to Scotland and England in 1998, shared with close friends from Lethbridge.

Dad was steadfast, always straight forward and had an amazing sense of humor that shone through a twinkle in his beautiful blue eyes. He will be deeply missed by his children, Rhonda and Wayne and his darling wife, Ivy.

Dad was predeceased by his mother and brothers, David and Lorne. Dad will be fondly remembered by his extended family: nieces, nephews, cousins, special in-laws and old friends.
