HELEN HAZUDA, the beloved wife of the late George Hazuda, passed away peacefully in her sleep on Tuesday, August 30, 2022, at the age of 87 years.

She accomplished much in her life, including raising four children. She was a nursing assistant for more than 32 years (Family Medical Centre & Haig Clinic) and was also employed at the former St. Michael's Hospital as a switchboard operator.

Helen was a beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and friend. Her doll collection also adorns her work and she could make an ordinary doll into a princess. She was also talented with cakes and during the 1970s and early 80s she made many wedding cakes.
