
Mom

Their kids still continued to visit them there for their summer vacations and brought the grandkids as well. Still having the travel bug, they ventured to Arizona for three months every winter to socialize and for Maye to share and learn new crafts including computing.

Time marches on and Maye and Juicy settled down in a senior's complex, content to let someone else do the cooking and they could enjoy the company of family and friends (and chocolate making of course) year-round. She was a beautiful, happy, loving, caring fighter to the end and will leave a large void.
