She retired in 1985.

Albina was devoted to her family and home. She was a caring and attentive mother, ever ready to help her children. When they took up an activity, she did too, by joining the organization offering it or by trying it herself. She was also a loving daughter and sister who went out of her way and was always ready to share her time and energy with her parents and kin.

Together Albina and Borys enlarged and improved the house they bought when they married and in which they lived for nearly all of their marriage.
